The JTC recommend the equal sharing based on sugar produced of the overall MID petroleum levy contribution amongst planters.

 (ii) A minimal contribution of Rs 0.10/kwh on fossil fuel energy invoiced by CEB to consumers.

According to Statistics Mauritius, from the Energy and Water Statistics 2016 published in June 2017, a total of 2,558GWh has been invoiced by CEB to consumers and by extrapolation, when extracting renewable energy produced, a balance of 1,894GWh has been invoiced produced from fossil fuel.

The JTC recommends a minimal contribution of 10cts/kwh on fossil energy invoiced to generate an additional income of Rs200M to be directed towards bagasse remuneration. The JTC recommends a positive sharing differential to small planters representing 16% of the share of sugar produced:

- a. Small: 16% increase on equal divide of sum for planters
- b. Others planters: balance left over equally shared
