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# Re-registration of SIM Cards

## Another Big Brother Initiative?

The regulation issued under the purview of the Information and Communication Technologies Act, and coming into effect on 31st October 2023, requires all mobile operators in Mauritius to obtain, register and store not only new requests for SIM cards but also all existing SIM card holders. Details to be furnished by the existing cardholder and that have to be verified, registered and stored by the operator, include cardholder's proof of address, National Identity Card (NIC) or copy of passport info and a colour photo/selfie which would be compared with the photo on the NIC/passport. The exercise has to be completed by 30th April 2024 failing which the card would be deactivated.

This is causing quite some stir in many circles despite the official justification of the Information and Communication Technologies Authority (ICTA) that this regulation stems from one of the 450 recommendations of the 2018 Lam Shang Leen Report on Drug Trafficking. The authorities have been somewhat vague on which recommendations of the five-year old Report have not been or will not be implemented (estimates provided of those implemented have varied from 60% to 80%) which makes it rather difficult to judge the merit or the sudden urgency of the proposed regulation.

Nobody would query a genuine though belated initiative to fight drug traffickers who may be using SIM cards of dead persons, departed tourists or other means to communicate with their suppliers or accomplices, yet several voices, legal and IT professionals have raised concerns that have yet to be satisfactorily answered by the ICTA. Two legists and opponents of the MSM regime, Me Rama Valayden and Ivor Tan Yan, have last week challenged the constitutionality of those regulations by taking the issue to the Supreme Court. We therefore do not expect the ICTA to answers other than in front of our highest Court, while senior Labour Party MP Arvin Boolell has asked the ICTA to shelve proceedings until the serious matters raised have been properly thrashed out in Court.

The fact that the ICTA with its Board of poli-

tical appointees, has since several years, been under clouds of suspicion for unavowed motivations in what looks like Big Brother initiatives or proposals, does not help confidence build-up in the general public or in the Opposition that this regulation (rather than a legal imposition debated in Parliament) stems from a genuine desire to partake in government's oft-repeated gambit to break the backs of drug barons.

Back in November 2020, the authorities had to backtrack from plans to merge the Information and Communication Technologies Authority (ICTA) and the Independent Broadcasting Authority (IBA), while the IBA itself came under criticism for going after private radio stations which were deemed critical of the government. Then in 2021, came the rather outlandish proposal to set up a proxy server to intercept all social media traffic and a National Digital Ethics Committee of political hacks that would have the power to take down and censor social media posts. Again, government backtracked after intense national and international denunciations of the ludicrous proposal.

We need not go further into why this new ICTA regulation suffers from an acute trust deficit, all the more so as an issue affecting at best some 1000 suspicious SIM card users, does not call for a blanket hammering of the civil liberties and the inherent right to privacy of all Mauritians. No guarantees have been provided either on the use of selfies or colour pics demanded by the ICTA from mobile phone operators, their storage on databases (against which the Supreme Court has already ruled) or even usage by third parties, despite any verbal assurances provided by the current CEO of Mauritius Telecom.

In an upcoming electoral year, it has even been rumoured that some MPs, PPSes and even Ministers also privately worry that CCTV facial recognition features may be used to interconnect with mobile IDs and track their movements around the island. Let us hope the ICTA, on behalf of government, will better reassure the Supreme Court of their intents and clarify the many unanswered questions before applying this regulation.

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

# A Year of ChatGPT

*More than four billion people will be asked to vote in various elections next year. What happens in such elections when we combine the reach of social media with the power and persuasion of AI-generated fake content?*

OpenAI's artificial intelligence (AI) chatbot ChatGPT was unleashed onto an unsuspecting public exactly one year ago.

It quickly became the fastest-growing app ever, in the hands of 100 million users by the end of the second month. Today, it's available to more than a billion people via Microsoft's Bing search, Skype and Snapchat – and OpenAI is predicted to collect more than US\$1 billion in annual revenue.

We've never seen a technology roll out so quickly before. It took about a decade or so before most people started using the web. But this time the plumbing was already in place.

As a result, ChatGPT's impact has gone way beyond writing poems about Carol's retirement in the style of Shakespeare. It has given many people a taste of our AI-powered future. Here are five ways this technology has changed the world.

### 1. AI safety

ChatGPT forced governments around the world to wise up to the idea that AI poses significant challenges – not just economic challenges, but also societal and existential challenges.

United States President Joe Biden catapulted the US to the forefront of AI regulations with a presidential executive order that establishes new standards for AI safety and security. It looks to improve equity and civil rights, while also promoting innovation and competition, and American leadership in AI.

Soon after, the United Kingdom held the first ever inter-governmental AI Safety Summit in Bletchley Park – the place where the computer was born in World War II to crack the German Enigma code.

And more recently, the European Union has appeared to be sacrificing its early lead in regulating AI, as it struggled to adapt its AI Act with potential threats posed by frontier models such as ChatGPT.

Nations around the world are increasingly directing their money, time, and attention towards addressing this issue which, five years ago, didn't cross most people's minds.

### 2. Job security

Before ChatGPT, it was perhaps car workers and other blue-collar workers who most feared the arrival of robots. ChatGPT and other generative AI tools have changed this conversation.

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# Doing Politics In Mauritius

*We should lay a more solid foundation for our political and economic decisions than through the divisiveness we've travelled during the past 55 years*

**I**t is not only in Mauritius. It's a phenomenon that is hitting even the socially best performing countries of the world, notably even the very well governed Scandinavian countries. About half the population in very many countries are unhappy with the way politics is being done. This phenomenon is affecting nearly all countries, rich and poor.

This is what explains why more than 40% of Mauritian voters haven't made up their minds on the relevance of the political class. I won't be surprised if such numbers increased over time, given the prevailing parlous state of politics on both sides.

It's the reason why many Europeans are up in arms against their governments. It is also the reason why so many sub-Saharan refugees are taking the risk to cross the Mediterranean in life-threatening overcrowded frail crafts, presumably sailing away to safety from domestic dictators/predators or distressful economic conditions, or both at the same time.

The unhappiness springs, in some of the cases, with the emergence of challenging day-to-day adjustment issues touching upon job security, inability to meet basic bills pertaining to rent, water, electricity or the servicing of debts incurred. In other cases, there's growing mistrust in the ability of the state to balance the social equation, given that the elite goes on squeezing living standards out of those lower down by all (market) means available.

The fundamental question being asked on all sides is whether orderliness will emerge out of the growing widespread dis-order. And, if so, by which means? Or, will the disequilibrium stretch on to breaking point, with incongruous leaders emerging, unable to find a satisfactory answer to the problems which have cropped up all round?

## How the dysfunction came about in Mauritius

Politics is about earnest decision-making. Good decisions improve the orientation of society and the economy. Bad politics keeps tinkering at the edges to a point of no return in the social and economic fabric. Consider the impact of the way of doing politics in Mauritius.

monious framework to take advantage of a unified structure. However, right in the beginning, a model of communal confrontation was adopted as the way forward for local politics. Strident appeals to separateness of cultural identities was brought forth as the foremost factor on which the campaign for independence was fought way back in 1967.

Fifty-five years later, it may have become dormant but it appears ready to pounce, only waiting to be awakened. The principal vehicle through which it is being carried forward is through politics. It may have helped politicians to get people to rally around them over decades. The communal segmentation which was centred on opposing minority versus majority communities at the time of independence “progressed” to other perverse forms since then. Election after election thereafter, sub-groups from within the population became the focus of the power game, resulting in sub-sub-divisions.

Given this, the focus of politics was no longer on getting the best outcomes for the country. What mattered more was drawing the “correct” representation from this sub-divided pool, with power of selection of candidates concentrated on

party leaders.

Identity politics took centre stage. Other national issues, such as strengthening public institutions and increasing our economic scope were also looked into but as subsidiary concerns. Meritocracy was quite often baffled in the name of identity politics. It became primordial to meet the demands of distinct lobbies which wanted to grab key positions. The country lost.

The sociology of this situation may be interesting, but I would focus on the serious impairment it has caused to the decision-making process in the country. The pursuit of identity politics in Mauritius, focussing on distinct communities, castes and related affiliations, made the country weaker than necessary. Not only the best candidates to elections were not picked up according to their sharper embrace of public and international issues.

The power and influence of all manner of lobbies and incompetents on politics ended up affecting the delivery of certain public institutions, forcing politicians to increase the space of non-meritocracy. The DWC is no more; the CWA did not consolidate; casinos accumulated losses; police leaned increasingly on ‘provisional charges’ to even get highly

respected citizens behind bars, only to be spurned by the courts.

It goes to our credit that, despite this dysfunctional divisive model, our successive governments did not fail us totally. Pressured by an educated citizenship, successive governments were led into taking some initiatives from time to time for the good of the country as a whole. Mauritius did not therefore sink the way certain other countries did into abject dictatorships, swayed by ethnic lobbies. Our institutional structure was able at one time to withstand unwarranted political interferences.

After bankrupting the goodwill they had earned in the previous election, however, our governments were forced to concoct diverse coalitions to stick to power. This diluted whatever force of conviction the original politicians had in a personal sense of values or standing up for a sense of values for the country as a whole. A widespread culture of perpetual defection undermined whatever little ideological grounding or true statesmanship remained.

## Breaking away from a model to nowhere

It is obvious that Mauritius will not make much headway if this system of divisive decision-making continued, pitting one set of people against the other or putting private interests “first”. Problems will not be solved at the root. New governments will keep overturning “bad” decisions taken by their predecessors. We might make some progress, but it won’t be the lasting solution or direction for the country.

We are seeing the world over how divisiveness is threatening the established world order, without necessarily offering a viable alternative. Chaos appears to be springing up in many places. This is because problems have been allowed to amplify unchecked to an uncontrollable point. It is the reason we should lay a more solid foundation for our political and economic decisions than through the divisiveness we've travelled during the past 55 years.

Citizens in their majority have shown that they will endorse rational decisions taken for the good of all. This will happen the more the better we reconstitute statesmanship on a wider sociological base which makes sense of how people live and will be governed, how they earn their living, what are the prospects in the making for them and how the fruits of progress will be shared among all, indiscriminately.

That will cause politicians to shift from the classic divisive model to a larger role in keeping with the changing world: one in which they will adopt performing policies to the benefit of all, and be day-to-day accountable for their actions to the people at large.

# Un anarcho-capitaliste élu à la tête de l'Argentine, des violences raciales en France et l'extrême droite au pouvoir aux Pays-Bas

**C**es dernières semaines ont été marquées par des basculements politiques vers l'extrême-droite en Argentine en Amérique latine, et en Europe – en France et aux Pays-Bas pour être plus précis.

Commençons par l'Argentine. Après des décennies des mouvements de gauche inspirés du péronisme, le pays vient d'élire un économiste anarcho-capitaliste à la tête du pays. En effet, l'élection de Javier Milei s'est inscrite dans un rejet massif des politiques économiques et monétaires qui ont mis l'économie du pays à genoux depuis plus de 30 ans.

Milei, un économiste qui se décrit lui-même comme un anarchiste et un capitaliste, a été élu sur des promesses de rupture économique qui ont séduit la majorité des Argentins. Parmi ses propositions, il y a

- la politique radicale d'abandonner le Peso argentin en faveur du Dollar américain,
- une réduction drastique de l'intervention de l'Etat dans les affaires économiques, et
- une réforme visant à revoir l'application politique des valeurs égalitaires qui structurent la société argentine depuis plus d'un siècle.

Milei propose en réalité un "reboot" (redémarrage) de l'économie argentine par les principes directeurs des théories économiques de l'ultralibéralisme. Ces derniers ont, selon l'idéologie (par exemple, de l'école de Chicago), la capacité à restructurer les principes fondateurs de l'organisation sociale et politique d'une société donnée dominée par le libre jeu et le non-interventionnisme. En d'autres termes, c'est aux principes du jeu de l'économie de dicter les décisions politiques et non aux politiques de dicter à l'économie, et c'est au libre jeu de l'économie de dicter les formes institutionnelles que doit adopter l'Etat.

Il s'agit là d'une rupture radicale avec l'histoire même des mouvements politiques en Amérique latine, à une exception près : le Chili.

En effet, le 11 septembre 1973, une junte - dirigée

par le général Augusto Pinochet avec l'appui des États-Unis - déposa le président socialiste élu Salvador Allende, qui préféra se suicider au Palais de la Moneda plutôt que de se laisser prendre.

Le gouvernement de Pinochet entama alors un vaste projet de réformes économiques fondé dans les principes articulés par l'économiste autrichien néolibéral Friedrich Hayek qui enseignait alors à l'Université de Chicago. Ces réformes prévoient la destruction de l'État social et son remplacement par un État qui opère selon les principes du marché libre, acceptant par exemple que l'exclusion et l'insécurité soient des éléments internes à toute société et que ce n'était pas le rôle de l'État de combler les inégalités sociales et économiques.

L'expérience chilienne servit alors de laboratoire aux politiques que Ronald Reagan et Margaret Thatcher allaient appliquer aux États-Unis et au Royaume-Uni respectivement. *The rest, as they say, is history. (Le reste, comme on dit, appartient à l'Histoire.)*

L'Argentine s'apprête ainsi à basculer dans un bouleversement profond si

Milei réussit à appliquer son programme. Nous devinons que les troubles sociaux risquent de se multiplier et que Milei devra sans doute souvent avoir recours aux forces de l'ordre et à une application dure et rigide des principes de sécurité.

## La montée des extrémismes en France et aux Pays-Bas

**D**e l'autre côté de l'Atlantique, en Europe, la France et les Pays-Bas ont également été secoué par des événements faisant la part belle à la montée des extrémismes.

En France tout d'abord, où la petite commune de Crépol a été secouée par le drame de la mort d'un jeune adolescent nommé Thomas. Ce dernier assistait à une fête de la commune qui a été interrompu par des délinquants venus des quartiers et des cités des villes voisines. Une bagarre s'ensuivit lors de laquelle Thomas fut poignardé.

Les réactions furent immédiates avec une levée de bouclier des mouvements d'extrême-droite qui ont riposté en attaquant des centres sociaux et des commerces appartenant à des Français issus de l'immigration. En fait, nous avons vu la symétrie directe de l'affaire Nahel qui avait provoqué d'importantes émeutes en juin de cette année.

Certains observateurs parlent d'un climat social qui ne cesse de se dégrader et qui glisse lentement vers une guerre raciale en France, une opposition banlieues/France profonde qui traduit elle-même une opposition Blancs/Arabes. Et il est clair que la gestion calamiteuse des émeutes de juin par le président Emmanuel Macron n'a pas aidé à calmer les choses.

C'est en tout cas l'extrême droite française qui en profite, et Marine Le Pen pourrait bien encore plus

consolider sa base en vue des prochaines élections présidentielles.

En parlant de profiter du climat délétère, c'est Geert Wilders (un ami de Marine Le Pen) qui a réalisé un coup d'éclat en obtenant la majorité aux élections qui se sont tenues aux Pays-Bas. En effet, le PVV Freedom Party, le Parti pour la liberté (PVV) l'équivalent du Front National aux Pays-Bas, a réalisé un coup politique énorme cette semaine en remportant 37 des 150 sièges au parlement hollandais. Cela peut ne pas sembler énorme puisque ne constituant pas la majorité, mais ces 37 sièges placent le PVV en tête devant toutes les autres coalitions, lui permettant de former un gouvernement si d'autres partis acceptent de se joindre à eux.



Mais le coup de départ est loin d'être donné, ce qui explique que tous les partis aiguissent actuellement leurs armes, occupent le terrain et commencent les tractations qui leur permettront d'aligner leurs candidats dès que le feu vert sera donné.

Ce travail de préparation est extrêmement important et requiert plusieurs mois d'occupation du terrain et la multiplication des rencontres et des réunions. D'ailleurs tous les partis politiques traditionnels sont actuellement affairés à cela. Le MSM multiplie depuis quelques temps les réunions dans les circonscriptions alors que l'alliance PTr-MMM-PMSD continue, elle, sa tournée en organisant des congrès qui se termineront le 3 décembre prochain.

Ces partis ont également commencé à déployer leurs candidats potentiels dans les circonscriptions, notamment les nouveaux candidats qui n'ont pas encore d'expérience électorale. Commencer à occuper le terrain est ainsi essentiel pour les différents partis, et notamment pour les nouveaux partis qui n'ont pas de base électorale solide, comme pour LPM.

Mais occuper le terrain et entrer officiellement en campagne électorale, ce sont deux choses différentes. Dans le premier cas, c'est un exercice de prise de température qui permet des ajustements et des repositionnements critiques, alors que dans le deuxième cas, c'est une affirmation claire et précise sur les intentions et la stratégie d'un parti politique.

Est-ce que les membres de Linion Moris ont effectué ce travail de terrain leur permettant d'être absolument clairs dans leurs stratégies? Sans doute oui, avec les moyens dont le parti dispose. Mais peut-être aussi qu'il y a du sens à se déclarer bien avant les échanges lorsque vous vous battez contre les grosses locomotives.

Pour l'instant, Linion Moris ne semble pas avoir les capacités d'aligner 60 candidats. Mais si le parti déclare déjà ses candidats à l'avance, cela permettra à ces derniers d'abattre un travail que les grands partis, eux, peuvent compléter rapidement par le simple fait de l'existence de leur organisation territoriale et structurelle.

Ainsi, cette entrée en campagne de Linion Moris ressemble bien plus à un exercice de structuration du parti qu'à une actuelle entrée en campagne. Et ce n'est pas une stratégie tout à fait inutile car c'est maintenant qu'un tel parti dispose de l'espace nécessaire pour manœuvrer. Nous le savons tous: plus on approchera des échéances, plus les Mauriciens mettront les petits partis et leurs alliances de côté dans leurs considérations politiques.

Nous voyons d'ailleurs cela à chaque élection. Les nouveaux partis attirent un certain intérêt au début d'une campagne électorale. Ils font un peu de bruit, surtout si leurs propositions sont en rupture avec les partis traditionnels. Mais cet intérêt ne dure jamais bien longtemps, et l'immense majorité de l'électorat se tourne très rapidement vers les partis traditionnels - ce qui fait que les nouveaux sont vite relayés en arrière-plan lors d'une campagne électorale.

Ainsi, Linion Moris semble avoir pris une initiative louable en annonçant dès maintenant son entrée en campagne électorale. Ses membres pourront aller sur les plateaux de radio en annonçant et en énumérant leurs propositions comme s'ils étaient en campagne, en faisant

un peu le buzz et en forçant même les partis traditionnels à entrer dans leur jeu. Cette prise d'initiative ressemble ainsi également à une volonté de dicter le rythme politique.

D'ailleurs, l'annonce des deux PM et du partage à l'israélienne s'inscrit dans cette volonté d'ouvrir les débats en vue des prochaines élections.

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## L'Arabie saoudite accueillera l'Exposition universelle en 2030

**L**a nouvelle est tombée dans la nuit de mardi, l'Arabie saoudite accueillera l'Exposition universelle en 2030, devançant ainsi la Corée du Sud et l'Italie.

Il s'agit bien évidemment d'un événement de prestige, mais ce prestige démontre certaines choses. Cela fait des années que le royaume saoudien fait des efforts importants pour changer la perception du monde quant à son rôle dans le monde et durant ce siècle.

L'arrivée du prince héritier d'Arabie saoudite Mohammed Ben Salmane (MBS) aux affaires a encore plus accéléré et renforcé cette volonté. En effet, ce dernier s'est démarqué dès le départ de ses prédécesseurs - tous les fils d'Abdelaziz ben Abderrahmane Al Saoud, le fondateur du royaume d'Arabie saoudite - de par sa jeunesse et de par le fait qu'il représente une nouvelle génération de Saoudiens dont les aspirations sont différentes de leurs aînés.

Ainsi, dès sa nomination comme prince héritier en 2017, MBS a tenu à se démarquer de ses aînés. Son ascension au poste de Premier ministre en 2022 lui a

donné les outils et les moyens de mieux asseoir cette image de la transformation du royaume saoudien à travers différentes réformes. Par exemple, par des politiques hautement symboliques déjà, comme le droit de conduire et de voyager sans autorisation d'un gardien accordé aux femmes ou encore le refus de financer le wahabbisme à travers le monde. Mais, il s'inscrit aussi de manière bien plus profonde dans le paysage politique en réalité, avec un plan de transformation de l'économie saoudienne en anticipation du déclin du pétrole d'ici 2050.

Ce plan de transformation prévoit le développement des secteurs économiques puissants en Arabie saoudite, mais également un élargissement des intérêts géopolitiques et culturels du royaume. Ainsi, MBS n'a pas eu de mal à détourner le regard de l'allié historique américain en faveur des puissances émergentes comme la Chine et l'Inde.

Parallèlement, MBS n'a pas hésité à se lancer dans des conflits parfois ouverts contre le Qatar et l'Iran, qu'il considère comme des obstacles à la volonté hégémonique du royaume saoudien sur la région et sur l'Islam car c'est aussi cela qui est en jeu.

Malgré son modernisme, MBS reste un traditionaliste et se rend entièrement compte que la première force de l'Arabie saoudite, par-delà le pétrole, reste le fait que l'immense majorité du monde musulman regarde vers la Mecque, ce qui fait du royaume saoudien la voix du monde musulman.

MBS a parfaitement bien compris cela, d'où sa volonté de développement d'un autre modèle économique qui permettra au royaume d'être une puissance économique et technologique, tout en restant une puissance spirituelle pour une grande partie de l'humanité.

Ce rôle a d'ailleurs été parfaitement observé depuis le début de la guerre de Gaza. Les Saoudiens ont réussi le pari d'arriver à une trêve entre le Hamas et Tsahal sans pour autant antagoniser le monde musulman et maintenir sa politique visant à entretenir des relations autrement avec Israël.

Benjamin Nétanyahou avait déclaré qu'Israël se trouvait au milieu d'un processus de transformation du Moyen-Orient. Ce qu'il n'a pas précisé, c'est que cette transformation se faisait main dans la main avec MBS et le royaume saoudien.

Ainsi, MBS se positionne comme l'architecte et le bâtisseur de l'Arabie saoudite du 21eme siècle. Contrairement aux autres leaders mondiaux, il n'a que 38 ans et régnera sur son royaume jusqu'à sa mort. Il a ainsi le potentiel de devenir l'acteur majeur de la région pendant la majorité de ce siècle, et il a clairement décidé de le devenir.

L'attribution de l'Exposition universelle à l'Arabie saoudite représente une grande victoire symbolique pour ses ambitions, tout comme pourrait l'être également l'attribution de la Coupe du monde de football bientôt.

# Rajasthan and the Rajput Jewels

From New Delhi, the trip to the land of the proud and feisty Rajput kingdoms, a semi-arid territory of mountainous terrain and the famous Thar desert of moving sand dunes of some 200,000 sq.km constituting a natural frontier with Pakistan, was not to be missed as Rajasthan is indeed, India's most visited tourist destination.


I had decided to vacate the unmisable universal tribute to love, the Taj mausoleum and Agra forts in Uttar Pradesh on my first full-day sightseeing from New Delhi. Distraught at the death of his beloved wife who bore him 14 children and accompanied him on his military expeditions, Shah Jahan had this architectural marvel of white marble, surrounded by acres of gardens, built as an enduring tribute to his lifelong love and where both would ultimately be laid to rest.

With tourist tickets at INR 1200, I was relieved that my OCI card allowed me entry at Indian visitor prices of some INR 200, a reminder that was to be useful throughout my museum, palace, royal gardens, and other visits elsewhere. I also learned to be wary of coach tours, which dragged us on an unplanned extension to Mathura and Vrindavan late afternoon. It should have been a total immersion in temples, ashrams, cultural heritage, and profound spirituality, but after the full day of trekking, it was an extended evening annoyance that, with due respect to their faith and beliefs, only devout lovers of Lord Krishna, from various parts of India enjoyed, despite being pressed for donations in that particular temple doing brisk Godly business.

Despite or maybe because of my upbringing, I could not reconcile the hard-sell techniques, or the millions raked in annually with the shabby surrounds of that particular temple complex, its unlit potholed streets, its lack of decent amenities and the hundreds of monkeys, particularly fond of eyeglasses and mobiles, waiting to pounce on unwary visitors! This was an unholy hold-up as there are hundreds of other brightly lit, well maintained Krishna temples, ashrams, guesthouses, and spiritual centers in Vrindavan (or Mathura) which deserve a full two-day stay by religious or spiritually minded visitors. Returning by the coach at near midnight in New Delhi, I was too exhausted and annoyed to bear testimony to the spiritual dimensions of that trip extension to Lord Krishna's alleged birthplace (Mathura) and playground (Vrindavan).

Back the next day for the a/c comfort of India's rail network for the discovery of what I knew was a land of continuous bat-



ties between separate and non-unified Rajputana fiefdoms against marauding invaders first from Arabs, who had been decisively halted at Sindh, and departed, leaving the centuries long invasion/conversion attempts to their Turk, Afghan or later, Moghol fiercer horsemen and cavalries. The whole area was also a present-day remnant, at least in part, of the much older Indus Valley civilisation, starting 6-8000 BCE, that spanned the whole twin river valley (Indus and Saraswati) mentioned in the Vedas and its extension into more uphill lands, ports and trading outposts of that vast empire, fabled amongst other things, for its agricultural output, including prized livestock of elephants, camels and horses, handicraft and jewellery, attracting caravans of traders from as far away as Oman, the Arabian peninsula, Iran, Afghanistan, Turkey and Greece.

This was quintessentially a wealthy and wide-ranging trading empire with considerable mathematical and astronomical knowledge, high city development skills, based on an entirely autonomous inge-



nuity, as confirmed by a vast array of scientific evidence including population genetics, (apart from a growing academic literature, interested readers can consult the special issue of Sciences et Avenir, no 163, 2010) with a sophisticated language developed for spiritual delvings, Vedic Sanskrit, source of many Indo-European languages, and a profoundly monist core of beliefs with one Supreme Lord manifesting itself in various ways over the material, visible and non-visible spiritual world.

That civilisation and its inhabitants, constantly ruffled by annual floods of fertile silt from monsoon or Himalayan glaciers, fearful of the «kali yug» predicted by its own theologians (around 3100 BCE), migrated to higher shores with shreds of their beliefs and practices and found a terminal decline, according to geological evidence and satellite imagery, when they fled, around 1900 BCE a vast tectonic movement that engulfed its thriving ports, its orderly cities and dried up the Saraswati.

It was with all this background that I eagerly awaited to plunge into the main cities of Rajasthan and get, at best, a whiff of its most notable three gems Jaipur, Jodhpur and Udaipur, in far too brief a first discovery trip full of magnificent scenery, including its lakes and rivers, its desertic Thar proximity, the majestic forts and palaces whose restored remains have given rise to many sumptuous accommodation experiences for the wealthy travellers. Most of this one can find by perusing any travel site, publication, travel tour guides on that state and my personal experience was far more mundane and limited.

Jaipur, the state’s bustling capital of 4m, aka the Pink City, has a multitude of temples, including one of the several Birla temples in India, a delightful mandir in white marble, dedicated to Narayan and

Lakshmi Devi, the architectural oddity of the Hawa Mahal (palace of winds) and the extraordinary 18th century concrete observatory (Jantar Mahal) one of several built by the learned Maharaja Jai Singh (from which the name Jaipur) and visited by European and other astronomers of the times for the most precise stellar and planetary measurements and observations.

Then there is Amer, in the mountainous outskirts of Jaipur, where the splendid Amer fort, with its multiple courtyards and elephant rides, its elegant hall of intricate mirrors, its multiple levels to house the Royal family and concubines and where their army could display any conquered bounty to the local Rajasthani. Looming over it is another fortress, Jaigarh Fort, connected to a ridge of defensive wall stretching for miles atop the mountainous crests constituting a formidable engineering feat. Within Jaipur itself, Jai Singh had built the landmark sprawling City Palace, with a high entrance fee that would seduce mostly those interested in stories of Rajahs, their lavish lifestyles, and their pastimes.

Jaisalmer at the edge of the Thar desert, which I skipped, has reportedly a fascinating fortress with golden walls, and a colourful mix of turbaned cameliers, musicians, craftsmen and soldiers whereas Jodhpur, similarly gateway to the desert, is known as the “blue city” because most of the houses in its old town are painted this colour, while it boasts probably the most formidable fortress overlooking the region. When tired of all the bustle of the forts and palaces, Udaipur, almost 400 kms south of Jaipur, is a gorgeous city of majestic mountains, picturesque lakes, incredible monuments, and breathtaking gardens. Locals proudly regard it as one of the most romantic cities in the world, dubbed the ‘Venice of the East.’

For those into some shopping, Rajasthan is renowned for beautiful block-print textile materials and dress elements, carpets, handicrafts and is famous for its precious and semi-precious jewellery, although travellers, as in any tourist spot, should be careful of being ripped off. The food is as usual good, if you can stand more thalis and spicy things from breakfast (most annoyingly!) through lunch or dinner. No respite for more sensitive taste buds but Jaipur was one place where I found a clean restaurant for a cool beer and some European snacks.

For travel and discovery, history, people and culture buffs or spiritual questers or simply India lovers, Rajasthan is a must destination in the sub-continent's awesome and immensely rich multi-cultural fabric.

# Guerre de Gaza : les négociations s'accélèrent en vue d'une trêve étendue

**A**lors qu'un cessez-le-feu temporaire a pu être conclu entre Israël et le Hamas, en contrepartie d'un échange d'otages et de prisonniers, il semblerait que tout soit fait pour que ce cessez-le-feu continue encore quelque temps.

En effet, il devait durer quatre jours au départ et il est sur le point d'expirer à l'heure où nous écrivons. Mais les tractations avancent rapidement entre Israël, le Hamas, le Qatar et l'Arabie saoudite afin d'étendre la trêve et afin que plus d'otages et de prisonniers soient libérés.

Il se pourrait ainsi que la stratégie diplomatique que certains pays ont privilégié porte ses fruits, même si une trêve ne signifie pas une solution à long terme.

Il est intéressant de décortiquer les attitudes des deux côtés avec un Hamas qui déclare avoir réussi à faire plier Israël, alors que les dirigeants israéliens, eux, considèrent que les lourdes frappes sur Gaza ont forcé le Hamas à entrer dans une posture de négociation.

En réalité, les deux ont plus ou moins raison. Pour comprendre toute stratégie militaire, il faut regarder par-delà les enjeux humanitaires et éthiques et se concentrer sur les rapports de force dans ce qu'ils ont de plus crus et de plus de passionnés. C'est ainsi qu'un général et grand théoricien de la guerre s'est approprié la fameuse leçon de Clausewitz en commentant la situation actuelle à Gaza: cette guerre est la continuation de la politique mais par d'autres moyens. Et, ajoutons ceci, par des moyens extrêmement brutaux, voire excessifs.

D'ailleurs, nous le suggérions nous-mêmes dans un précédent billet sur une éventuelle réponse israélienne : il était clair que Tsahal ne penserait pas y aller par le dos de la cuillère. En d'autres termes, il se pouvait bien que la stratégie de l'armée israélienne ne fut jamais celle d'une occupation de Gaza, comme Benjamin Nétanyahou a pu le déclarer, mais une attaque tellement violente et meurtrière au point de forcer le Hamas à la table des négociations une fois qu'une certaine ligne rouge a été passée.

Cette ligne rouge : 14 000 morts du côté des Palestiniens. Soit près de 10 fois le nombre des

victimes israéliennes. C'est le "prix" qu'a accepté de payer le Hamas avant de considérer une trêve et d'échanger des otages contre des prisonniers.

Est-ce que cela signifie que les frappes israéliennes ne reprendront pas? Pas forcément, mais le moment d'accalmie actuelle est très certainement une opportunité que les acteurs du Moyen-Orient ne voudront pas laisser passer, notamment l'Arabie saoudite.

Ce pays s'est montré très prudent depuis le

début de la guerre, dénonçant les frappes israéliennes mais sans forcément adopter une posture de non-retour vers les Israéliens. Les enjeux actuels pour l'Arabie saoudite font qu'Israël pourrait devenir un partenaire clé dans le cadre de la modernisation mis en place par Mohammed Ben Salmane. D'ailleurs, les deux pays étaient sur le point de conclure un accord pour la normalisation de leurs relations diplomatiques, économiques et sécuritaires...

Cet accord, Israël en a également besoin puisque l'Arabie saoudite pourrait être l'acteur clé pour sa sécurité, et notamment pour contenir l'ennemi iranien.

Ainsi, il était farfelu de penser que Tsahal s'était lancé dans une opération militaire motivée uniquement par la vengeance. L'objectif était multiple dès le départ : produire une démonstration de force qui forcerait le Hamas à la table des négociations pour la libération des otages sans pousser la relation avec l'Arabie saoudite vers le point de non-retour.

Assistons-nous au début d'une autre phase du conflit ? Difficile de le dire pour l'instant, mais une chose est absolument sûre et certaine: Israël et le Hamas ont utilisé les Palestiniens de Gaza comme d'une matière d'échange afin d'arriver à un point de neutralité permettant à une négociation de commencer, et ni l'Arabie saoudite ni l'Iran n'y ont vu le moindre souci.

Malheureusement, nous assistons là à la triste histoire des Palestiniens, toujours utilisés par les pays voisins pour faire avancer leurs propres intérêts géopolitiques et souverains.

## Leaders pay tribute to Henry Kissinger while social media dubs late US secretary 'war criminal'

Global leaders paid tribute to former U.S. Secretary of State Henry Kissinger on Thursday, but there was also sharp criticism of the man who remained an influential figure decades after his official service as one of the most powerful diplomats in American history.

Kissinger, who died Wednesday at 100, drew praise as a skilled defender of U.S. interests. "America has lost one of the most dependable and distinctive voices" on foreign affairs, said former President George W. Bush, striking a tone shared by many high-level officials past and present, reports AP.

Kissinger served two presidents, Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford, and dominated foreign policy as the United States withdrew from Vietnam and established ties with China.

In China, Foreign Ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin called Kissinger an "old friend and good friend of the Chinese people, and a pioneer and builder of China-U.S. relations."

Many on social media in China mourned his passing.

State broadcaster CCTV shared on social media an old segment showing Kissinger's first secret visit to China in 1971, when he broached the possibility of establishing U.S.-China relations and met then-Premier Zhou Enlai.

Kissinger exerted uncommon influence on global affairs long after he left office. In July, for instance, he met Chinese leader Xi Jinping in Beijing while U.S.-Chinese relations were at a low point.

Criticism of Kissinger, who was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for his role in negotiating a cease-fire in

Vietnam in 1973, was especially strong on social media, where many posted celebratory videos in reaction to his death.

A Rolling Stone magazine headline said, "Henry Kissinger, war criminal beloved by America's ruling class, finally dies."

The head of the independent Documentation Center of Cambodia, Youk Chhang, described Kissinger's legacy as "controversial." Well over half of the population was born after the Khmer Rouge were ousted in 1979 and Kissinger left government, so there is not much awareness among Cambodians about his record, he said.

Kissinger initiated the Paris negotiations that ultimately provided a face-saving means to get the United States out of a costly war in Vietnam.

Nixon's daughters, Tricia Nixon Cox and Julie Nixon Eisenhower, said their father and Kissinger enjoyed "a partnership that produced a generation of peace for our nation."

"Dr. Kissinger played an important role in the historic opening to the People's Republic of China and in advancing détente with the Soviet Union, bold initiatives which initiated the beginning of the end of the Cold War," the Nixon daughters said in a statement. "His 'shuttle diplomacy' to the Middle East helped to advance the relaxation of tensions in that troubled region of the world," the Nixon daughters said in a statement.

As former US secretary of state Henry Kissinger passed away, senior Congress leader Jairam Ramesh on Thursday recalled that in 1971 then US President Richard Nixon and Kissinger created huge headaches for India but then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi and her close aide P N Haksar proved "more than a match for them", reports PTI.

In a post on X, Ramesh said, "Henry Kissinger has passed away. He was as immensely consequential as he was hugely controversial."

For the last three decades, he positioned himself as a great friend and supporter of India and indeed he was, Ramesh said.

"But this was not always so and in 1971 especially, President Nixon and he created huge headaches for India and thought they had us cornered. However, Indira Gandhi and PN Haksar proved more than a match for them," the former

Union minister said.

"I have described the Kissinger-Haksar and Nixon-Indira Gandhi encounters with archival detail in my book 'Intertwined Lives: PN Haksar & Indira Gandhi'," Ramesh said.

He also pointed out that Gary Bass in his book 'The Blood Telegram: Nixon, Kissinger and a Forgotten Genocide' indicts Kissinger severely for his role in the events of 1971 leading up to the creation of Bangladesh.

In another post, Ramesh said Haksar, while an admirer of Kissinger's intellectual prowess, felt that he lacked moral fibre and sensitivity to democratic processes.

Dobrynin had been Soviet Ambassador to Washington between 1962 and 1986. His opening words to Haksar were: 'I am very glad to meet the man who outwitted Henry Kissinger,' Ramesh recalled.

## 'China overwhelmed by internal challenges': Taiwan leader on 'unlikely' invasion

China is not likely to consider a major invasion of Taiwan for now due to domestic challenges, the island's president Tsai Ing-wen said Wednesday, although Beijing is trying to sway its upcoming election.

"I think the Chinese leadership at this juncture is overwhelmed by its internal challenges," Tsai told the 2023 DealBook Summit in New York.

Tsai was responding to questions about the risks of an invasion, in the aftermath of a closely watched meeting between the US and Chinese presidents, Joe Biden and Xi Jinping, in California this month, reports AFP.

The leaders' talks, on the sidelines of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit, were aimed at preventing growing tensions from spiraling into conflict.

But Xi and Biden remain far apart on the flashpoint of Taiwan, with the Chinese leader telling his US counterpart that reunification was "unstoppable."

China considers democratic Taiwan its territory, to be taken one day by force if necessary.

For the moment, however, Beijing is grappling with domestic economic, financial and political challenges, Tsai said.

The international community has also made it clear that war is not an option, she added.

But China is still "interested in interfering" in Taiwan's upcoming

presidential election, Tsai said, adding that Beijing is attempting to sway the outcome in its favour.

"All major elections in Taiwan since 1996 have seen similar influence operations from China," she said.

Instead of hoping Beijing would give up on its tactics, Taiwan should "focus on strengthening the resilience of our democracy," she added.

Responding to Tsai's comments on Thursday, Beijing's Ministry of Foreign Affairs said: "As Taiwan is an inseparable part of China's territory, there is no president of Taiwan."

Spokesperson Wang Wenbin added that it is necessary to "oppose Taiwan independence and external interference."

Self-ruled Taiwan is set to hold its presidential election in January, a contest that is being scrutinized by policymakers in China and the United States, as it could determine Taipei's ties with an increasingly bellicose Beijing.

Tsai is not able to run in the upcoming election, as she will have completed the maximum of two terms in office.

## Internal rebellion against Biden's Israel policy explodes, CIA issues warning

The CIA's top analysis chief has sparked controversy by changing her Facebook cover photo to a Palestinian flag amid growing dissent within the Biden administration over its handling of the Israel-Hamas war.

The associate deputy director for analysis, who is one of the three people responsible for approving all analysis disseminated inside the agency, updated her profile picture two weeks after the October 7 attack by Hamas and its allies that killed 1,200 people and took 240 hostages, reports Hindustan Times.

She also posted a selfie with the slogan "Free Palestine" on it, according to the Financial Times. The chief has previously posted messages against anti-semitism, a colleague said.

Another former official said that such social media activity was 'highly irregular' for a senior agency official, given the 'longstanding incredibly close relationship' between the CIA and the Israelis.

The chief's Facebook post comes as the Biden

anonymous letter earlier this month urging the President to demand a halt to the violence. Another 1,000 staff from the US Agency for International Development echoed the call.

The State Department has not taken any action against the dissenters, but instead has organized 'listening sessions' with staff to hear their feedback and ideas.

Secretary of State Anthony Blinken wrote to staff earlier this month, "I know that for many of you, the suffering caused by this crisis is taking a profound personal toll. The anguish that comes with seeing the daily images of babies, children, elderly people, women, and other civilians suffering in this crisis is wrenching. I feel it myself."

Biden has repeatedly refused to demand a ceasefire, but has instead supported a series of temporary truces that have been agreed in exchange for the release of some of the hostages.

More than 400 administration employees signed an



Many appear to be adopting the stance of their home nation, with Pro-Russian groups, like "Killnet", taking up digital arms against Israel and their

supporters. Similarly, Pro-Israeli groups, like the "Kerala Cyber Xtractors" have been seen acting against Palestinian interests.

To date, SecurityHQ has observed 93 Pro-Palestinian Adversary Groups and 17 Pro-Israel Groups.

Notable Pro-Palestinian adversarial actions include the publication of a mobile app, known as "Red Alert: Israel", claiming to provide alerts for Israeli civilians of impending incoming rockets. Purported to be spyware, the app has the objective of intercepting alert requests and stealing sensitive data. The success of this campaign is reported as widespread over Israel and may have successfully gathered sensitive information from both iOS and Android users.

The consequences of the related cyber alliances worldwide are expected to be widespread. Organisations that have an association with entities or nations that have already taken a public or political

## Indian MEA reacts to US charging Indian of plotting to kill Gurpatwant Singh Pannun

In response to the US indictment of an Indian national implicated in a murder conspiracy, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) expressed concern on Thursday (30 November), emphasising that such actions contradict government policy.

According to Hindustan Times, MEA spokesperson, Arindam Bagchi, reiterated that during bilateral security discussions with the US, information was shared regarding the connection between organised crime, arms dealers, and terrorists.

Bagchi stressed that they take these inputs very seriously and a high-level inquiry committee has been formed to investigate every aspect of the case. The committee's findings will prompt necessary follow-up actions. However, Bagchi maintained that they cannot disclose any additional details about such sensitive security issues, reports Swarjya.

The spokesperson emphasised the gravity of the situation, stating that the connection between international organised crime, trafficking, gunrunning, and extremism poses a significant challenge for law enforcement agencies and organizations.

Regarding the issue with Canada, the MEA expressed its concern that Canada has continually harboured anti-India extremists, which is the crux of the problem. "Our diplomats in Canada have suffered the most from

this situation. Hence, we anticipate that the Canadian government will fulfill its responsibilities as per the Vienna Convention," said the spokesperson.

On Wednesday, an Indian citizen was charged by US federal prosecutors for his involvement in a thwarted alleged assassination attempt of a Sikh separatist in the United States.

The indictment didn't disclose the names of the Sikh leader, Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, or the Indian government official who allegedly collaborated with the accused, Nikhil Gupta.

Interview: Nando Bodha, Candidat premier ministériel de Linion Moris

# “Se débarrasser du MSM et de son régime, n'est pas pour nous un programme. C'est un objectif...

**Si c'est le programme du PTr-MMM-PMSD, c'est en effet un peu mince”**

**L**inion Moris se démarque des autres partis politiques en lice pour les prochaines élections générales. En effet, Nando Bodha a commencé à présenter quelques pans du programme de son parti au grand public. Il compte ainsi grossir le nombre de ses sympathisants à travers la vision et le projet de société envisagé par cette alliance. Les membres de son parti travaillent sur le programme en tenant compte du contexte contemporain et des enjeux que l'avenir nous impose. Comme Nando Bodha a déjà travaillé sous plusieurs gouvernements, il explique la direction que prend Linion Moris avec la force de l'adhésion sans faille de l'ensemble des membres de cette alliance.

Mauritius Times : “Caraille pé chauffé,” semble-t-il, à observer l'intensification des attaques du Premier ministre contre ses principaux adversaires et celles-ci sont diffusées presque quotidiennement au journal télévisé de la MBC-TV durant la soirée. De toute évidence, Pravind Jugnauth est déjà en campagne électorale, mais on ne sait pas si cette campagne électorale sera longue ou non, ou si les choses sérieuses vont intervenir après le prochain budget. Quelle analyse faites-vous de la situation politique actuelle et de ce que vous percevez comme la stratégie du leader du MSM?


Nando Bodha : Pravind Jugnauth n'est pas en campagne électorale. Il est en train de cajoler et caresser un électoral précis dans le sens du poil pour le préparer à une campagne électorale qui viendra quand elle viendra. Cela fait partie de sa stratégie électorale. Il y aura cette stratégie, jouant sur le temps, pour ensuite déclarer les élections et, ensuite, jouant à fond une campagne courte mais intense.

La MBC joue en effet – comme toujours - son rôle de porte-voix avec, je le rappelle, l'argent des contribuables. Ce n'est pas nouveau, mais cela n'en est pas moins scandaleux. Cela ne m'inquiète pas outre mesure car le service public de radio-télévision a perdu depuis longtemps à la fois sa crédibilité et une grande partie de ses auditeurs et téléspectateurs. Ceux qui restent devant leur poste sont soit des partisans du MSM – ceux qu'on appelle des *chatwas*.

La seule stratégie qui reste à Pravind Jugnauth, c'est celle d'acheter les votes en jouant sur une division scientifique et tablant sur une opposition qui a du mal à s'unir. Pour lui, chaque électeur a un prix. Il ratisse large pour ensuite cibler les segments utilisant les dernières technologies.

*Caraille pa pe chauffer? Caraille fini dan difé.* Jugnauth ne peut compter que sur la MBC pour relayer ses messages ou des organisations socioculturelles où il sait que personne ne le contredira ou ne sont présents que des bénoui-oui. Quand a eu lieu sa dernière confrontation avec la presse? Je ne me souviens plus. C'est le signe même d'une fin de règne et il le sait très bien d'où son utilisation à outrance de la MBC.

Il n'a aucune stratégie propre à lui, ce qui est totalement différent de Sir Anerood. Il est l'otage de *Lakwizin* et ne fait qu'obéir à des ordres. Qui dirige le pays aujourd'hui? Demandez aux fonctionnaires qui sont quotidiennement harcelés par *Lakwizin* pour prendre des décisions allant contre les principes de la *good governance*. Les officiers aux échelons les plus élevés de l'État sont impuissants car pour conserver son poste, il faut obéir aux ordres. Il faut exécuter les ordres. C'est du jamais vu dans la fonction publique: une politisation à tous les échelons.



\* En tout cas, Rama Valayden et vous-même semblez aussi croire en l'imminence des prochaines législatives. On vous a vu tous deux présenter votre “équipe nationale” dont une liste de candidats de Linion Moris qui brigueront les suffrages aux prochaines élections générales, et les deux premiers ministriables en cas de victoire. Les élections ne sont pas pour demain, autant que l'on sache. Pourquoi cette grande urgence, donc?

Qu'est-ce qui vous fait croire que nous croyons dans l'imminence des prochaines législatives? Nous avons présenté notre équipe à la population il y a une semaine, mais cela ne signifie pas que nous pensons que les élections sont derrière la porte.

Nous n'en savons rien, mais nous nous y prenons assez tôt parce que nous souhaitons que les Mauriciens commencent à connaître les hommes et les femmes engagés avec Linion Moris. Nomination Day en nous demandant de voter pour eux les yeux fermés. Nous comptons sur notre sens de mission, nos convictions et nos idées. Beaucoup attendent pour se joindre à nous.

Nous n'avons pas la même conception de l'action politique. Nous voulons convaincre par la sincérité, la détermination et, bien sûr, des idées et des solutions, et ainsi établir notre différence.

La situation est dramatique. La compétence et la méritocratie n'ont plus de sens. Partout, on entend dire que toutes les institutions sont accaparées par des *chatwas*... Le dernier exemple est à la NEF et c'est n'est pas tout. Faites une enquête parmi les CEO de nos institutions, vous verrez l'étendue de ce cancer qui ronge le pays: la médiocrité. Parmi se trouvent des personnes avec des cahiers judiciaires, y compris un conseiller de ministre.

Sur le plan économique, la dévaluation de la roupie est une politique adoptée par la Banque de Maurice pour montrer que tout va bien alors que la population n'arrive pas à joindre les deux bouts. Il y a eu une augmentation excessive des prix causée par la dévaluation de notre roupie. Le pouvoir d'achat a tellement diminué que c'est devenu un cauchemar pour la majorité des familles mauriciennes.

La situation sociale est au bord de l'explosion. Les récents évènements à la Citadelle et à Trou d'Eau Douce sont extrêmement dangereux pour le tissu social mauricien, déjà fragilisé par la politique de division du régime actuel.

La drogue et la corruption sont à l'ordre du jour et ce qui fait frissonner, c'est l'aveu même du PM que la mafia a infiltré les institutions de l'État. Cela implique qu'il sait qui est cette mafia et ne fait rien pour contrer ce fléau.

Pourquoi se demande la population? Les courses, le Lotto et le *gambling* ont pris de l'ampleur. Mais qui sont ces gens qui ont les nouveaux permis? Il le sait très bien, mais il se trouve dans une situation d'impuissance car il a les poings et les pieds liés. Conséquence: la culture des ‘zou-gadère’ se propage extrêmement bien.

\* L'agenda principal de l'alliance PTr-MMM-PMSD, c'est de «débarrasser le pays des griffes du MSM», comme le soutient Navin Ramgoolam. Est-ce Bérenger ou est-ce vous qui avez fait le mauvais calcul en ce qui concerne le contrôle absolu de Ramgoolam sur le Parti Travalliste et sa détermination à diriger l'alliance de l'opposition?

Excusez-moi, à mon avis, les petits calculs des uns et des autres sont insignifiants. Parce qu'ils n'ont souvent d'autre but que de satisfaire des egos et des ambitions de ceux qui n'ont comme objectif que de conquérir le pouvoir pour le pouvoir. Bons calculs, mauvais calculs, etc...

\* Curieusement toutefois, on ne voit pas le leader de l'alliance gouvernementale, qui se dit être l'homme le mieux informé du pays, attaquer les partis extra parlementaires, dont Linion Moris. Sa cible principale, c'est Ramgoolam, pas Bodha, Bhadain ou Valayden. Soit il garde la porte ouverte, soit il serait d'avis que cela ne vaut pas le coup. Comment réagissez-vous à cela?

Ce que fait Jugnauth le regarde. Jugnauth cible Ramgoolam parce qu'il est préoccupé par un certain électoralat, sa réalité rurale à lui et le mythe du 4 à 14. Il fait une très grosse erreur, Jugnauth est déjà hors-jeu dans beaucoup de circonscriptions tant rurales qu'urbaines.

tion, par «regulations» de l'ICTA, du projet de réenregistrement des cartes SIM avec données biométriques et photos en couleur reliées à une base de données. Pensez-vous que c'est pour combattre le fléau de la drogue ouest-ce une tentative déguisée de mettre sous surveillance les opposants du régime?

Nous avons tout lieu de nous inquiéter. Est-il nécessaire de ficher quasiment toute la population pour combattre une infime minorité de trafiquants de drogue? C'est un mauvais prétexte. Je suis convaincu que, comme l'explique fort bien Ivor Tan Yan, le MSM tente de mettre en place un réseau de surveillance qui fait clairement penser à *Big Brother*.

Des ordinateurs analysent le comportement des passants et des voitures dans la rue en permanence. Le collectif de journalistes d'investigation "Forbidden Stories" a révélé au début de l'année qu'une entreprise clandestine israélienne, spécialisée dans la manipulation électorale, notamment par les réseaux sociaux, a été utilisée pour influencer des dizaines d'élections dans le monde, particulièrement en Afrique.

La société, surnommée Team Jorge par les journalistes, est intervenue dans 33 campagnes électorales. Sur ces 33 campagnes, les deux tiers d'entre elles [ont eu lieu] en Afrique anglophone et francophone. Vingt-sept ont été un succès.

Leurs visages sont des portraits de vraies personnes pirottées sur Internet, et leurs patronymes, la combinaison de milliers de noms et de prénoms stockés dans une base de données.

Ces ont ces types de données que recueilleront les opérateurs téléphoniques mauriciens pour le compte du gouvernement.



The recent publication by the Ministry of Education of the analysis of results in the 1958 School Certificate examination has dismayed the principals of the many mushroom private colleges. When the Minister told Hon B. Ramlallah (Labour, Poude d'Or) in April that the Cambridge Syndicate was averse to publication of percentage passes scored by individual schools, these same principals were happy; they thought that the academic shortcomings of their schools and colleges would be forever cloaked in secrecy. The Syndicate had, however, based its refusal to have the results published on experience elsewhere; when it was told that publication of the results of individual schools in Mauritius would be desirable, in view of the peculiar circumstances of the Island and the proliferation of private secondary schools (many of which are mere money-grubbing academies), there was a change of mind in Cambridge. Hence the present discomfiture of many private college principals.

Thanks to the many private candidates who enter for School Certificate but do not pass, Mauritius has a bad overall record among Commonwealth territories where the School Certificate is taken. The table below shows for 1957 the number of School Certificate candidates in certain colonies, with the number of those gaining a Certificate; this number is expressed as a percentage as well as absolutely (see: **Table A - School Certificate Results - 1957**).

And in Kenya, two-thirds of the candidates gained their certificates.

And the figures for the 1958 results In Mauritius? We find that 2,162 candidates sat the examination; and 704 passed — a percentage of 32.6 — higher than in 1957. It is true, but a shockingly low percentage none the less, and far below the percentage passes of any other territory. An analysis of the percentage passes of the various



groups of schools distinguished by the Syndicate is published at the end of this article (see: **Table B - School Certificate Results - Schools' Performance**).

Of the five Non-Aided "B" schools, three (Loreto Convent, Rose Hill, St Mary's College, and the Collège Bon et Perpétuel Secours) are eligible for government aid; their percentage of passes was 58 out of 68, or 85 p.c.; it was the poor performances by New Eton (15 passes out of 97 candidates) and Trinity (29 out of 138) Colleges which pulled down the group performance.

We find that no Government or Aided school had less than 63% of its candidates passing, except St Andrew's School with 59.5 p.c. passes. Except for the three special cases of the Non-Aided "B" schools referred to above, which are eligible for aid but do not get it, we find that no Non-Aided school (provisional "B" or non-approved) had a higher percentage of passes than 28.3% (at Neo) except the Islamic Cultural College (48.5%) and the Adventist College (30%). These two can be excused - on account of their specific religious affiliation - from the charge that by and large the private colleges are conducted with an eye to the profit of their proprietors' pockets rather than to the profit of their pupils' brains.

Yet the existence of these private colleges demonstrates that there is an unsatisfied urge among the people for a wider provision of secondary education than at present exists. Up to now the Government has been unable to provide all the secondary education that is called for by the people; but more provision is being made. More Government secondary schools will be built. One is under way at Beau-Bassin; at least two more are needed, one in the rural area of the north, to save chil-

dren from the north a long daily journey; and equally, one in the rural south. But people must be wary of equating secondary education with grammar school education of the kind traditionally associated with the Royal College and the Loreto Convents.

I am not denigrating the value of these (and other similar) schools; but it is true that they educate their pupils in an academic manner and fit them only for white-collar jobs: for jobs as clerks, as civil servants, as (as regards a minority) for the learned professions. One of the valuable, commendable things which Mr Snell (I apologise to the gentleman — Mr Kynaston-Snell, I mean, of course; carnation and all) has done is the analysis he published in the Education Department's bulletin of August 1958, on the employability of secondary school pupils. He showed conclusively that the secondary schools are educating potential white-collar worker far in excess of the country's actual needs; referring to candidates for the School Certificate, passes and failures too, he says (and rightly): "It is possible that all have dissociated themselves from anything but the search for a white-collar job." And he rightly quotes Francis Bacon in asking what happens "when more are bred scholars, than preferment can take off."

A realignment of the secondary schools and what is taught in them is needed. Mr Luce rightly drew attention to the fact that education in Mauritius is not in keeping with the needs of the modern society. A start has been made with the Technical School in reorienting the emphasis on secondary education, but it is a small start which at the moment bids fair to grow but slowly. But it is a start, and from little acorns do mighty oak trees grow. The Central School will help redress the balance away from the emphasis on grammar school education too; but it is a pity that with the grammar schools, the technical school, the central school, and so on, there is being given credence in Mauritius to the fallacy that children can be sorted out at the age of 12 by a scholarship examination into types of children, the best being destined to become the nation's leaders, the worst being forever destined to be merely hewers of wood and drawers of water.

I know that the Director of Education is a believer in the varying types of children; I know too that he is a Christian. And in the Church Catechism it clearly states that the Christian shall do his duty in that state of life unto which it shall please God to call him. Not, be it noted, as is often misquoted, "in that state of life unto which it has pleased God to call him".

Since the Christian believes that God shall call him to a state of life, not has called him, it follows that the education provided should give equal opportunity for all to achieve that state in life. But the provision of different sorts of secondary education on the grounds that some are born brainy, and others are born dull is anti-Christian.

White collar workers such as graphic designers and lawyers have now also started to worry for their jobs. One recent study of an online job marketplace found earnings for writing and editing jobs have fallen more than 10% since ChatGPT was launched. The gig economy might be the canary in this coalmine.

There's huge uncertainty whether more jobs get destroyed by AI than created. But one thing is now certain: AI will be hugely disruptive in how we work.

**3. Death of the essay**

The education sector reacted with some hostility to ChatGPT's arrival, with many schools and education authorities issuing immediate bans over its use. If ChatGPT can write essays, what will happen to homework?

Of course, we don't ask people to write essays because there's a shortage of them, or even because many jobs require this. We ask them to write essays because it demands research skills, improves communication skills, critical thinking, and domain knowledge. No matter what ChatGPT offers, these skills will still be needed, even if we spend less time developing them.

And it isn't only school children cheating with AI. Earlier this year, a US judge fined two lawyers and a law firm US\$5,000 for a court filing written with ChatGPT that included made-up legal citations.

I imagine these are growing pains. Education is an area in which AI has much to offer. Large language models such as ChatGPT can, for example, be fine-tuned into excellent Socratic tutors. And intelligent tutoring systems can be infinitely patient when generating precisely targeted revision questions.

**4. Copyright chaos**

This one is personal. Authors around the world were outraged to discover that many large language models such as ChatGPT were trained on hundreds of thousands of books, downloaded from the web without their consent.

The reason AI models can converse fluently about everything from AI to zoology is because they're trained on books about everything from AI to zoology. And the books about AI include my own copyrighted books about AI.

The irony isn't lost on me that an AI professor's books about AI are controversially being used to train AI. Multiple class action suits are now in play in the US to determine if this is a violation of copyright laws.

Users of ChatGPT have even pointed out examples where chatbots have generated entire chunks of text, verbatim, taken from copyrighted books.

**5. Misinformation and disinformation**

In the short term, one challenge which worries me most is the use of generative AI tools such as ChatGPT to create misinformation and disinformation.

This concern goes beyond synthetic text, to deepfake audio and videos that are indistinguishable from real ones. A bank has already been robbed using AI-generated cloned voices.

Elections also now appear threatened. Deepfakes played an unfortunate role in the 2023 Slovak parlia-

mentary election campaign. Two days prior to the election, a fake audio clip about electoral fraud that allegedly featured a well-known journalist from an independent

news platform and the chairman of the Progressive Slovakia party reached thousands of social media users. Commentators have suggested such fake content could have a material impact on election outcomes.

According to *The Economist*, more than four billion people will be asked to vote in various elections next year. What happens in such elections when we combine the reach of social media to with the power and persuasion of AI-generated fake content? Will it unleash a wave of misinformation and disinformation onto our already fragile democracies?

It's hard to predict what will unfold next year. But if 2023 is anything to go by, I suggest we buckle up.

# When to give your child their first mobile phone – and how to keep them safe

*Parents have a role to play in educating their children and making them aware of the risks that come with being online*

I spend my career researching young people and the internet: what they do online, what they think about it and how their views differ to those of their parents.

I often get questions from parents about their children's internet use. One of the most common is when to get their child a mobile phone, as well as how to keep them safe when they have one. Here are my answers to some key questions.

## How old should my child be when they get their first phone?

I'm afraid I often disappoint parents in my answer to this question by not giving them a definite number. But the key here is what your child is going to use the phone for – and when might be suitable for that individual child.

According to a 2023 report by UK communications regulator Ofcom, 20% of three year olds now own a mobile phone. But this phone may just be used for taking pictures, playing simple games and supervised video calls with family.



The more pertinent question is when children should have their own fully connected phone, which they can use unsupervised to contact others online.

When a child is primary school age, it's highly likely that they will be used to adult supervision in most aspects of their life. They will either be at school, at home, with friends and trusted adults or with other family members.

Their need to contact a distant adult may not be that great – but you will want to think about what the specific needs of your own child might be.

Typically, the transition from primary school to secondary is when children might be more distant from home or be involved in school activities or socialising with friends where being able to contact home becomes more important. I have spoken to plenty of young people who talk about starting secondary school as the point where they first had their own phone.

## How do I make sure they use a phone safely?

First of all, it's important that if your child is going online – at whatever age and regardless of the device they're using – you have a conversation with them about online safety.

Parents have a role to play in educating their children and making them aware of the risks that come with being online, as well as being mindful that most online experiences are not harmful.

I have carried out extensive research with young people on

online harms. As part of this research, I and colleagues developed a number of resources for parents, put together with the help of over 1,000 young people.

What these young people say the most is they want to know who to turn to when they need help. They want to be confident they will receive support, not a telling off or confiscation of their phone. This means that a key first step is to reassure your child that they can come to you with any problems they encounter, and you will help them without judgment.

It's also important to discuss with your child what they can and can't do with their device. This could mean, for instance, setting ground rules about which apps they can have installed on their phone, and when they should stop using their phone at the end of the day.

You should also explore the privacy settings for the apps that your child uses, in order to ensure that they cannot be contacted by strangers or access inappropriate content. The NSPCC has resources for parents on how to use privacy settings.

## Should I check my child's phone?

Sometimes parents ask me about whether they should be able to check a child's device – either by physically looking at the phone or by using "safetytech", software on another device that can access the communications on the child's phone.

I believe it's important that this is also something you discuss with your child. Trust is important to ensure that your child comes to you with any online issues, so if you want to monitor their phone, talk to them about it rather than doing so covertly.

It seems reasonable parental supervision to be accessing a child's device when they are of primary age, in the same way a parent would check with another child's parent before agreeing to let them visit their home.

However, as your child gets older, they might not want their parent to see all of their messages and online interactions. The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child clearly states that a child does have a right to privacy.

## Should I track my child's location through their phone?

I have spoken to some families that track each other's devices in an open and transparent manner, and this is a decision for the family. However, I have also spoken to children who find it very creepy that a teenage friend is tracked by their parents.

The question here is whether parents are reassuring themselves that their child is safe – or whether they want to know what they are doing without them knowing. I had a particularly memorable conversation with someone who told me their friend was extremely upset because their daughter had changed device and so they could no longer track her. When I asked how old the daughter was, they said she was 22.

It's also worth considering whether tech like this actually provides false reassurance. It may allow parents to know where their child is, but not necessarily whether they are safe.

As with monitoring a child's phone, it is worth reflecting upon whether a surveillance approach creates the ideal conditions for them to come to you with problems, or whether this is more likely to be fostered by open conversations and an environment of mutual trust.

## Indicators of despair rising among Gen X-ers entering middle age

Indicators of despair -- depression, suicidal ideation, drug use and alcohol abuse -- are rising among Americans in their late 30s and early 40s across most demographic groups, according to new research led by Lauren Gaydosh, assistant Prof of Medicine, Health and Society and Public Policy Studies at Vanderbilt University. These findings suggest that the increase in "deaths of despair" observed among low-educated middle-aged white Baby Boomers (born 1946-1964) in recent studies may begin to impact the youngest members of Generation X (born 1974-1983) more broadly in the years to come.

The study, *The Depths of Despair Among U.S. Adults Entering Midlife*, appears in the 'American Journal of Public Health'.

In 2016, U.S. life expectancy began to decline for the first time in nearly a quarter-century, and researchers theorized that this was driven by a marked increase in deaths due to drug overdose, alcoholic cirrhosis and suicide among middle-aged whites with low education or in rural areas. At the time, this was explained by a unique



triple-punch of worsening employment prospects accompanied by a declining perception of socioeconomic status and an erosion of social supports for this group. But studies to better understand those mortality trends did not definitively show that low-income rural whites were actually experiencing more despair than other groups.

"What we wanted to do in this paper was to examine whether the factors that may be predictive of those causes of death -- substance use, suicidal ideation and depression -- are isolated to that particular population subgroup, or whether it's a more generalized phenomenon," Gaydosh said.

To do so, they turned to the National Longitudinal Study of Adolescent to Adult Health, or Add Health, directed by Harris at the University of North Carolina, which tracked the physical and mental health of thousands of Americans born between 1974-1983 from adolescence through their late 30s and early 40s in 2016-18.

"We found that despair has increased in this cohort, but that increases are not restricted to non-Hispanic whites with low education," Gaydosh said. "Instead, the increase in despair that occurs across the 30s is generalized to the entire cohort, regardless of race, ethnicity, education, and geography."

While patterns of drinking, drug use and mental health symptoms varied across races and education levels -- whites were more likely to binge-drink in adolescence, while Hispanics and African Americans of all ages were more likely to report depressive symptoms, for example -- the trends were broadly the same. Adolescence was, perhaps unsurprisingly, a rocky time for everyone, followed by a period of improvement in their twenties. By the time the teens were in their late 30s, however, indicators of despair were trending back up across the board, and in some cases were higher for minority populations than they were for low-educated whites or rural adults.

Gaydosh and her colleagues say these findings should be cause for concern, as they suggest midlife mortality may begin to increase across a wide range of demographic groups.



## Why are bullies so mean? A youth psychology expert explains what's behind their harmful behaviour

No matter your age, if you're being bullied - there's help out there

**B**eing bullied can make your life miserable, and decades of research prove it: Bullied children and teens are at risk for anxiety, depression, dropping out of school, peer rejection, social isolation and self-harm.

Adults can be bullied too, often at a job, and they may suffer just as much as kids do.

I'm a professor who studies child and adolescent development. That includes learning how people become bullies – and how they can be stopped.

First, let's define what bullying is: It's mean-spirited, harmful behavior by someone with more power or status – like a popular kid at school or a supervisor at work – who repeatedly picks on, harasses, irritates or injures a person with less power or status.

Bullying can take many forms – physical, like pushing, shoving and hitting; relational, such as spreading rumors, keeping somebody out of a friend group or just rude remarks; or sexual harassment and stalking behavior.

Sometimes, bullies target someone because of their race, religion, sexual orientation or appearance. People from the LGBTQ+ community, or who are overweight, or with a physical or developmental disability are more likely to be bullied. As a result, they may develop mental health problems, including depression, anxiety and self-harming behavior.

### So why do bullies do it?

People learn how to bully others early

on through what psychologists call modeling and social learning. This means bullies see other people bullying and they essentially model, or copy, this aggressive behavior.

Media is a big culprit here. When mean or violent conduct is glamorized and gamified in music, video games, TV and movies, bullies will imitate what they see and hear, especially if it seems cool or if it's rewarded.

Family is also an influence. If children grow up in a home without kindness and closeness, but with plenty of physical punishment and heavy conflict – including parents fighting with each other – then children view this behavior as acceptable.

They can go on to treat their peers this way.

A similar thing happens when a kid falls into a group of friends who are bullies; they become more likely to bully others themselves. To say it another way, they bully because they think it makes them look cool in front of their friends.

And bullies bully for lots of other reasons. Some do it because it makes them feel better about themselves when they put other people down. Other bullies discovered that force and intimidation worked for them in the past, so it's a go-to strategy to get what they want. Still others simply have difficulty controlling themselves and can't calm down when they're angry.

And with some bullies, it's just a way to get ahead. For instance, an adult bully in the workplace may spread an embarrassing rumor about a co-worker to keep a rival from being promoted.

### How to handle bullies

Fortunately, there are lots of ways to stop a bully.

If you're a child or teenager, talk about what has happened with a trusted adult – a parent, teacher, principal or counselor. They will help you figure out your next move. Schools are familiar with this sort of problem; they have policies in place to protect victims of bullying.

If you're an adult who has been bullied in the workplace, talk to your human resources department or a neutral supervisor who can advise you on next steps. You are also legally protected – employment laws prohibit harassment and discriminatory behavior.

Whatever your age, it's a good idea to talk to friends or family members who may not be involved in the incident but who will offer support. Engaging in coping activities – like exercising, or relaxing with a walk – may also help.

And a final word: Bullying is not acceptable. It's not just "kids being kids," or that you're "too sensitive." If a bully is bothering you, don't try to handle it alone – getting help is the way to get through.

He pulls over and waits for the police to catch up.




**T**his is the first time Mr "Gautam Adani" has come for any public interview. There are so many qualities that one can learn from his life. A truly inspiring figure!






## Sam Bahadur Vs Animal

*Animal's advance bookings prove yet again that bad boys mean good business at the box office*

**I**t's a year of big Bollywood clashes at the box office. After *OMG 2* and *Gadar 2* had the clash of sequels on August 11, Ranbir Kapoor's *Animal* and Vicky Kaushal starrer *Sam Bahadur* are both releasing in theatres today, December 1st. While *Sam Bahadur*'s release date was announced a year ago, the makers of *Animal* chose the same date, raising quite a few eyebrows. Perhaps it was easier to compete with director Meghna Gulzar's film than taking on Shah Rukh Khan's film *Dunki* or Prabhas' *Salaar* releasing later in the month, reports Indian Express.

Unfortunately, badly behaved men have always generated good results at the box office. Perhaps that's why, in spite of the A rating and long running time, *Animal* has had a tremendous response ever since advance bookings opened and is currently miles ahead of *Sam Bahadur* in terms of projected opening day revenues.

*Sam Bahadur* is based on the life of Field Marshal Sam Manekshaw, a decorated Indian officer who was Chief of Army Staff and part of five wars for India. *Animal*, as per the trailer, is about a man with what can only be called psychosis inducing daddy issues. After the deeply disturbing and disturbingly successful *Kabir Singh*, where the leading man was constructed out of red flags, *Animal* seems to have Ranbir Kapoor playing Kabir on steroids. Director Sandeep Reddy Vanga, who made misogyny great again, has changed the object of obsessive affection from Preeti to Papa (father), and amped up all the



problematic behaviour, as if to prove a point to those who criticised his earlier films.

But Vanga is not alone in celebrating toxic male behaviour. Over the years in Bollywood, we have had innumerable instances where a man gets away with almost everything from harassment, adultery and domestic violence.

Extramarital affairs have also been a recurring theme in our films. While films like *Silsila* and *Kabhi Alvida Naa Kehna* chose drama to process the ramifications of people cheating on their partners, adultery as a theme has largely been dealt with using crass jokes in ensemble cast films. Whether it's *No Entry*, *Biwi No 1*, *Garam Masala*, *Heyy Baby*, *Maine Pyaar Kyun Kiya*, *Gharwali Baharwali* or *Masti* and its torturous sequels; a man

cheating on his female partner is supposed to be treated with sympathy, understanding and humour.

Even in the seemingly harmless Sooraj Barjatya films, the women were homemakers by default not choice. The iconic Prem is respectful of elders but says nothing when his sister-in-law slaves in the kitchen all day to feed three adult men in the household. It's like the men in Mr. Barjatya's films said to domestic responsibilities, *Hum Aapke Hain Kaun?*

In the hugely successful *Dabbang*, Salman Khan's Chulbul Pandey threatens to slap Sonakshi Sinha and almost forcibly marries her. *Rehna Hain Tere Dil Mein* romanticised Madhavan cutting off Dia Mirza's telephone connection, posing to be a prospective groom and entering her home on multiple occasions. In *Cocktail*, Saif Ali Khan's character Gautam claimed he wanted casual relationships, till he rather falls for the shy Indian girl who can be more willingly domesticated.

Ranbir himself has played red flag riddled men in the past. As Rohan in *Tu Jhoothi Main Makkar*, he tamed his independent and nuclear family-seeking girlfriend (the shrew) into living with his large joint family. He played the role of actor Sanjay Dutt in *Sanju*, a man we were asked to empathise with simply because he is a man, a movie star and famous.





# Alimentation, une autonomie souhaitable

**L**e gouvernement indien, par la voix de son Premier ministre, lance un appel aux Indiens riches de célébrer les mariages en Inde, ce qui permettra de dépenser localement en termes de nourriture, de service traiteur qui compte des millions de petits *catering businesses*, les *entertainment groups* avec musiciens et danseurs. Et bien évidemment, en plus de réduire l'empreinte carbone, c'est l'économie locale qui en tire les bénéfices.

En ce temps d'inflation, de vie chère et d'une récession menaçante, si les performances économiques d'une Amérique endettée jusqu'au cou se mettent à marcher au ralenti à l'image de son Président, le conseil du Premier ministre indien tombe à pic.

Dans une rencontre avec les jeunes, il n'a pas hésité de faire un rappel au bon sens et au patriotisme économique: Regardez! Tout ce que vous avez sur vous, à commencer par le téléphone, est importé, leur a-t-il lancé.

Fort heureusement, les festins qui accompagnent les mariages indiens à l'étranger restent indiens, plats végétariens soigneusement préparés avec des épices divines. Il semblerait que la Turquie a créé de bonnes affaires en misant sur les Indiens en quête d'un cadre dépayasant, et aussi le *bling-bling* de Dubai, avec un budget faramineux.

Les riches Indiens gagneraient à choisir avec plus de sagesse la destination de leurs grandes dépenses. En dehors des mégapoles à dimension surhumaine et hyper polluées, le sous-continent indien dans toute sa variété ne manque pas d'attrait. Si une fête grandiose dans le cadre enchanteur du Cachemire court le risque de tourner au vinaigre, il y a les palais somptueux du Rajasthan et les régions du Nord-Est qui ne demandent qu'à booster leur économie.

La Chine prend conscience de l'effet dévastateur sur la santé de la nourriture transformée depuis que les grandes enseignes occidentales ont pignon sur rue et, que le gras, le salé et le sucré en plus des pesticides font mauvais ménage dans le foie et les artères des consommateurs.

Ce n'est pas que l'agriculture chinoise est dépourvue de pesticides, comme en Inde d'ailleurs. C'est que les bouillons aux légumes mi-cuits tendent à disparaître des tables surtout chez les jeunes cadres hyper pressés au quotidien. Passons sur les dommages collatéraux créés par les boissons sucrées importées du pays de l'Oncle Sam.

Visionnez le petit-déjeuner traditionnel chinois, varié selon les régions, mais essentiellement composé de bouillons (indispensable pour fluidifier le transit des aliments), galettes aux légumes ou bol de riz et thé nature remplacés par toasts avec beurre et confiture, pire encore, café nature ou café au lait sucré (un excitant et une agression gratuite faite au cœur), vous avez les dégâts en 3D.

Comme dans bien d'autres contrées, le petit-déjeuner

est traditionnellement salé. En Inde, au *roti bhaji* et *dhal*, l'héritage britannique introduit le thé au lait et sucré à donner la nausée, héritage malheureux qui s'est aussi invité à Maurice.

Le lait mélangé au café et au thé est fortement déconseillé, autant les prendre nature. Le *dithé pire*, comme le sucre roux, attire un mépris injustifié de la part de nos compatriotes, et c'est même un signe anachronique de pauvreté.



Si vous dites aux visiteurs de passage vers trois heures de l'après-midi qu'ils auront une tasse de thé (on ne prive pas les Mauriciens de leur thé cher, il y en a qui voyagent avec leur paquet de thé) et du manioc bouilli agrémenté d'un chutney de cotonille, eh bien, ils vous regardent, les yeux écarquillés, un peu étonnés.

Leur offrir un thé sans lait est un affront aux règles de l'hospitalité. Rassurez-vous, même si les gâteaux et les biscuits achetés au supermarché ont acquis un certain prestige, les Mauriciens tiennent aux *gâteau patate* et, le manioc, autre produit naturel, est prisé lorsque le temps libre d'un week-end le leur permet.

Le petit-déjeuner a connu un bouleversement qui n'a guère plu à notre foie, aux intestins et aux artères. Le *dipain diber* a écarté sans ambages le *roti* et légumes que les femmes avaient le temps de préparer autrefois. Confitures de toutes sortes et les jus de fruits sucrés apportent de la modernité et de la couleur sur la table au point d'oublier qu'un petit-déjeuner sain doit être salé.

Les aliments trop cuits constituent un autre défaut des habitudes alimentaires car ils perdent leur valeur nutritive. Les épices ont une valeur inestimable pour la santé, de la cannelle, du tilani à l'elaychee, le methi et le clou de girofle, dont le mélange et le dosage sont méticuleusement étudiés et calculés, et l'aura qu'elles diffusent dans le corps procurent aussi un bien-être psychique, peu connu du grand public.

Il convient de les utiliser à bon escient avec des légumes mi-cuits; et les salades, très prisées en Europe, peinent à constituer un repas complet à Maurice. N'hésitez pas à emprunter à d'autres pays ce qui est bon pour la santé du public.

En revanche, nous constatons avec effroi une consommation d'alcool avec le whisky en tête de liste pour débuter le week-end chez les jeunes salariés et cadres des milieux aisés. Si c'est un moyen de détente et de liberté, il n'est pas souhaitable d'en faire une habitude.

Rappelons qu'en ce qui concerne les personnes d'origine indienne et asiatique, certains aliments et boissons sont étrangers à leur organisme depuis des siècles, d'où leur vulnérabilité à une consommation immodérée.

Avec la fête du brède, les Mauriciens ne découvrent pas l'Amérique ! A Maurice, ce n'est pas les fêtes qui manquent. La fête du chouchou, du letchi, etc., sont courants à la Réunion qui ne peut se vanter d'un calendrier chargé de fêtes comme à Maurice.

Dans leur ensemble les Mauriciens sont restés attachés aux légumes et brèdes locaux. Le *dhal* et ses variétés conservent une place d'honneur autant pour la

saveur que pour les vitamines. Longtemps stigmatisés avec le cliché négatif de feuillage, aliment des barbares, voilà le brède réhabilité et mis à l'honneur par un groupe commercial puissant.

Les mentalités ont évolué, tant mieux! Le but reste commercial, sinon où en est l'intérêt? Ça plaira aux touristes tout comme les aquarelles des femmes en jupe, blouse et *horni*, travaillant dans les champs de canne. Des peintures qui rapportent à ceux qui ont le flair d'utiliser ce qui est rentable dans le paysage local.

A la recherche des fruits disparus des cours et des marchés figurent le cœur de bœuf, le corossol, le jambalac, le jamblon et le zatte (les nouvelles générations en connaissent à peine la saveur). Le tamarin frais dont le jus fait grand bien en été est fortement ignoré.

Il faut régler le problème causé par les chauve-souris si la production de la mandarine et d'autres fruits est menacée. Les oranges coûtent cher; on ne sait pas si l'Université de Maurice se penche sur la question de la propagation rapide de l'influenza qui rend visite à chaque maisonnée en hiver. Y a-t-il une carence en vitamine C due à l'absence de consommation de fruits? Ou des allergies? C'est quand même particulier à Maurice.

Au chapitre des produits presque inexistant dans les ménages, il y a l'ail noir, les tomates variées et de qualité, les champignons frais. L'Inde en fait une production en quantité industrielle destinée à l'exportation. Les bienfaits du champignon sont peu reconnus. On a quelques réserves à allouer des terres à l'élevage tant que Rodrigues assure les produits frais en viande.

Allons donc! Il y a tout un boulevard à explorer pour une meilleure santé et aussi pour le plaisir...
