

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

Beyond Political Distractions

Following the recent, unexplained, and somewhat mysterious Sunday evening dismissal of the Minister of Agro-Industry, Vikram Hurdoyal, speculation and conjecture have swept through the political landscape, leaving behind a confusing mix of unknowns. The subsequent resignation of the ousted minister from the Legislative Assembly has not only raised questions about the government's internal dynamics but has also disrupted carefully laid plans by the MSM politburo for the upcoming general elections. With the present government's mandate set to expire in November 2024, the unplanned necessity for a by-election has thrust the political arena into disarray, and amidst this chaos, crucial issues demanding immediate attention risk being sidelined.

The lack of transparency surrounding the reasons behind the minister's removal and its curious timing (what was so urgent that could not wait a more civilised separation of ways on Monday morning when the two protagonists did indeed meet?) have created a vacuum filled with rumours and speculations. The Prime Minister's decision to keep the grounds for dismissal under wraps has fuelled mistrust among the public, leaving them in the dark about the inner workings of their government. Such opacity in governance not only undermines accountability but also erodes public confidence in the political machinery.

The resignation of Mr Hurdoyal, a prominent figure in No.10 constituency, whatever his motivations, cannot but highlight the political mores of those who chose to hang on to their seats even when embroiled in sombre affairs. It also removed a PM trump-card by setting deadlines for the by-election procedures and, if government decides after all to dissolve the Legislative Assembly, an outer limit on when those general elections have to take place, most probably before the end of this calendar year.

On the other hand, the timing of the by-election/general election within that circumscribed time-frame, is crucial, potentially overshadowing broader issues demanding immediate attention from both the government and the opposition. With the electorate's focus possibly swayed by the drama surrounding the next elections, there is a real risk of diverting attention from critical matters directly impacting the lives of the population.

Issues such as the relentless fight against drug trafficking, law and order maintenance free from political interference in police operations, nepotism

and the battle against corruption remain ongoing challenges. The perceived double standards of the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC) and its notorious snail-speed in investigating cases involving individuals close to power demand a thorough examination. These have now been superseded by new concerns over the Financial Crimes Commission, an urgently set-up apex body for all financial crimes, with extraordinary powers granted to its future CEO, look set for constitutional challenges, if only by proposing (as with the defunct Prosecution Commission Bill) to bypass the Office of the DPP or severely curtail its powers in those domains.

Beyond these immediate concerns, broader societal issues are clamouring for attention. The urgent need for a reform of our educational system to make it sustainable, durable and equitable for a majority of our students, to do away with elitism, grade barriers and an exam-orientation cannot be stressed more. Meantime, billions have been voted for drains infrastructure over the two last budget years and yet the Belal rains wrought havoc in the capital and many countryside areas. The high taxation on fuel, the rising cost of living, the soaring costs of even ordinary vegetables on market days, should be at the forefront of the political agenda. Unfortunately, amidst the political turmoil, these concerns risk being relegated to secondary status.

As the political drama unfolds, it is essential for both sides to rise above populism, freebies and short-term political gains and engage in a meaningful dialogue with the people about the future of the nation. The ruling alliance must resist the temptation of populist measures and focus on addressing the pressing issues facing the nation. Conversely, the opposition has a responsibility to articulate a clear and compelling vision for the future, outlining concrete plans to tackle the challenges confronting the nation in the public interest.

In the midst of what promises to be a hard and tough electoral battle, citizens must play an active role in demanding accountability from their leaders. A vigilant citizenry, armed with accurate information, can hold political leaders accountable and demand a focus on the substantive issues that truly matter. Citizens must demand more than mere political theatrics and insist on a return to substantive governance that addresses the pressing challenges faced by society. Only through a collective commitment to transparency, accountability, and genuine public service can the nation emerge stronger.

Election partielle: un piège pour qui?

Presque deux semaines après la démission de Vikram Hurdoyal comme député de l'Assemblée législative, à la suite de sa révocation du poste de ministre de l'Agro-industrie, tout le monde se demande s'il y aura une élection partielle et, le cas échéant, à quel moment celle-ci aura lieu. Les spéculations vont bon train quant à la date de cette élection partielle dans la circonscription no. 10 (Montagne Blanche/Grande Rivière Sud-Est). Certains, surtout dans le camp gouvernemental, disent qu'il y aura une élection partielle alors que d'autres excluent toute possibilité d'une partielle à quelques mois de la dissolution automatique du Parlement fin novembre, laquelle entraînera nécessairement des élections générales.

Cette incertitude au sujet de la partielle n'est pas saine dans une démocratie parlementaire car toute vacance d'un siège de député pour un temps anormalement long (six mois ou plus) va à l'encontre du principe de la représentation démocratique de l'électorat. Un député est élu pour siéger au Parlement afin d'être la voix de ses mandants dans le débat parlementaire et, lorsqu'il démissionne, il doit être remplacé dans un délai raisonnable (trois mois au minimum et six mois au maximum). C'est ainsi que se passent les choses dans les démocraties parlementaires dignes de ce nom où la tenue d'une élection générale ou partielle ne dépend pas de la volonté d'une seule personne, en l'occurrence le chef du gouvernement, mais des dispositions de la loi.

Dispositions légales

A Maurice, les élections législatives sont régies par la Constitution et la loi électorale, *The Representation of the People Act (RPA)* de 1958, comme amendée subséquemment. Sous la section 57 (1) de la Constitution, le Premier ministre a le pouvoir de dissoudre le Parlement n'importe quand avant l'expiration d'une mandature de cinq ans, ce qui lui permet d'appeler le pays aux urnes au moment propice pour son parti.

Toutefois, l'exercice de ce pouvoir discrétionnaire (appelé prérogative) ne va pas au-delà de cinq ans. Grâce à un amendement de la Constitution apporté par le gouvernement MMM en 1982, la section 57(2) de la Constitution stipule que le Parlement, s'il n'est pas dissous plus tôt, est automatiquement dissout cinq ans après la première séance suivant les dernières élections. Le présent Parlement, issu des élections générales du 7 novembre 2019, va donc mourir d'une mort naturelle le 21 novembre 2024.

Alors que le gouvernement voulait aller jusqu'au bout de son mandat et tenir les prochaines élections générales en avril 2025 au plus tard, la démission de Vikram Hurdoyal est venue chambouler son calendrier électoral. La situation est devenue d'autant plus compliquée pour lui que le scénario d'une élection partielle s'imbrique avec celui des élections générales. L'un dépend de

l'autre. Aucun scénario de partielle ne peut faire abstraction des prochaines élections générales qui arrivent à échéance à moyen terme (10 à 12 mois).

Les options disponibles au gouvernement sont décrites dans le tableau ci-dessous (*Electoral Agenda after Resignation of Hurdoyal as Member of National Assembly*). Si le Gouvernement veut faire une partielle dans un délai de six mois, il devra suivre la chronologie suivante:

- émettre le «writ» pour cette élection au plus tard le 13 mai 2024 sous la section 35(3) de la Constitution (soit 90 jours à partir de la date de démission du député),
- fixer la date du dépôt des candidatures (*Nomination Day*) au 12 juin 2024 au plus tard, et
- tenir la partielle le 11 août 2024 au plus tard.

Cependant, la *Representation of the People Regulation* de 1987 permet au gouvernement de tenir la partielle dans un délai maximal de 240 jours suivant la chronologie suivante:

- émettre le «writ» pour cette élection au plus tard le 13 mai 2024 (soit 90 jours à partir de la date de démission du député),
- fixer la date du *Nomination Day* au 12 juillet 2024, soit 60 jours à partir de la date du «writ», et tenir la partielle dans le délai de 90 jours après le *Nomination Day*, soit le 10 octobre 2024.

Tenir une partielle le 10 octobre 2024, soit à 40 jours de la dissolution du Parlement survenant le 21 novembre 2024, n'est pas logique car le député élu ne siègera que pour 40 jours avant de briguer une nouvelle élection. Ce sera un gaspillage des fonds publics. Dans la meilleure hypothèse, la partielle devra donc avoir lieu le 11 août 2024 pour pouvoir tenir les élections générales en avril 2025. Autrement, le gouvernement devra esquiver la partielle et dissoudre le Parlement le 10 août 2024 afin

d'appeler le pays aux urnes le 9 septembre 2024 au plus tôt ou le 7 janvier 2025 au plus tard.

Défi à Navin

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Réenregistrement des cartes SIM: Préoccupations légitimes

En vertu d'une réglementation mise en œuvre le 31 octobre 2023 dans le cadre de la Loi sur les technologies de l'information et de la communication, tous les opérateurs mobiles de l'île sont désormais tenus de procéder au réenregistrement complet des cartes SIM. Cette mesure, visant à collecter, enregistrer et stocker les informations de tous les détenteurs actuels de cartes SIM, ne se limite pas aux nouvelles demandes, mais concerne également l'ensemble des utilisateurs existants.

Les exigences imposées aux détenteurs de cartes SIM incluent la fourniture d'une preuve d'adresse, de la carte d'identité nationale (CIN) ou d'une copie des informations du passeport, ainsi que la soumission d'une photo couleur ou d'un selfie. Ce processus complexe doit être achevé d'ici le 30 avril 2024, sous peine de désactivation de la carte SIM en question.

Cette régulation soulève des questions cruciales sur la protection de la vie privée et les droits individuels, suscitant des inquiétudes au sein de la population mauricienne. Dans un contexte où la technologie et la sécurité se rencontrent, cette démarche gouvernementale a soulevé des préoccupations légitimes. Alors que la lutte contre le trafic de drogue est une cause noble, la ques-

Julian Assange, fondateur de WikiLeaks, est actuellement au cœur de sa dernière bataille juridique au Royaume-Uni pour éviter son extradition vers les États-Unis, où il fait face à des accusations d'espionnage. Sa lutte, entamée il y a plus d'une décennie, prend finalement un tournant décisif, suscitant des manifestations bruyantes et des débats passionnés.

Assange, 52 ans, a débuté sa lutte contre l'extradition en 2010, lorsque des accusations de viol et d'agression sexuelle en Suède ont conduit à son arrestation à Londres. Depuis, il a passé sept ans en auto-exil à l'ambassade équatorienne à Londres et les cinq dernières années dans une prison de haute sécurité. La dernière semaine a marqué le début de sa dernière tentative légale au Royaume-Uni pour éviter l'extradition vers les États-Unis, où il est accusé d'avoir encouragé Chelsea Manning à voler des documents gouvernementaux et de mettre en danger des vies en publiant des informations classifiées.

Le contexte de cette dernière bataille juridique est complexe, avec Assange absent du tribunal en raison de sa santé déclinante. Ses partisans, clamant "Libérez Julian Assange", se sont rassemblés devant la Haute Cour de Londres, soulignant l'importance de cette affaire pour la liberté de la presse.

La femme d'Assange, Stella Assange, a exprimé des inquiétudes quant à la

tion cruciale réside dans l'équilibre entre la sécurité publique et le respect des droits individuels.

La comparaison qui est faite avec les précédentes initiatives de l'ICTA, comme la fusion avortée avec l'IBA et la proposition controversée de serveur proxy, souligne un schéma préoccupant de propositions qui suscitent des inquiétudes quant aux libertés civiles et à la vie privée. L'absence de clarté de la part des autorités sur la mise en

œuvre des recommandations du rapport Lam Shang Leen de 2018 soulève des questions sur la légitimité et l'urgence de cette réglementation.

Les actions en justice initiées par des personnalités telles que Me Rama Valayden et Ivor Tan Yan soulignent le sérieux des préoccupations entourant la constitutionnalité de cette régulation. L'appel d'Arvin Boolell - de suspendre les procédures jusqu'à ce que ces questions soient débattues devant la Cour - semble raisonnable et pourrait contribuer à apaiser les inquiétudes du public.

Dans un climat politique où la confiance du public est cruciale, il est impératif que l'ICTA aborde de manière transparente et complète les préoccupations soulevées. Les garanties concernant l'utilisation des informations sensibles, telles que les selfies et les photos couleur, sont essentielles pour rétablir la confiance. santé physique et mentale de son époux, affirmant que sa vie était en danger chaque jour qu'il passe en prison et qu'une extradition le condamnerait à la mort. Cependant, les autorités américaines maintiennent les accusations d'espionnage et d'abus informatique.

Les arguments juridiques

Les avocats d'Assange plaignent que son extradition représente une menace grave pour sa vie, tandis que les États-

Unis soutiennent que les actions d'Assange ont mis en danger des vies innocentes. Les procureurs américains allèguent qu'Assange a encouragé et a aidé l'analyste du renseignement de l'armée américaine Chelsea Manning à voler des câbles diplomatiques et des fichiers militaires que WikiLeaks a publiés, mettant des vies en danger.

L'avocate Clair Dobbin a déclaré à la Haute Cour qu'Assange avait endom-

magé la sécurité et les services de renseignement américains et "créé un risque grave et imminent" en publiant des centaines de milliers de documents - des risques qui pourraient nuire et conduire à la détention arbitraire de personnes innocentes, dont beaucoup vivaient dans des zones de guerre ou sous des régimes répressifs. Dobbin a ajouté qu'en encourageant Manning et d'autres à pirater des ordinateurs gouvernementaux et à voler auprès d'eux, Assange allait "bien au-delà" d'un journaliste recueillant des informations.

Assange n'est pas "quelqu'un qui a simplement créé une boîte en ligne à laquelle les gens peuvent fournir des informations classifiées", a-t-elle déclaré. "Les allégations sont qu'il a cherché à encourager le vol et le piratage qui bénéficieraient à WikiLeaks."

Les avocats d'Assange ont plaidé lors du premier jour de l'audience mardi dernier que les autorités américaines cherchent à le punir pour "la divulgation de criminalité de la part du gouvernement américain à une échelle sans précédent", y compris la torture et les meurtres.

L'avocat Edward Fitzgerald a déclaré qu'Assange pourrait "subir un déni flagrant de justice" s'il est envoyé aux États-Unis. Dobbin a rejeté les allégations selon lesquelles les charges sont un "outil d'oppression" destiné à punir Assange pour ses opinions politiques. Elle a déclaré que les poursuites sont basées sur le droit et les preuves, et sont restées constantes malgré les changements de gouvernement aux États-Unis pendant la bataille juridique. Elle a ajouté que le Premier Amendement n'accorde pas l'immunité aux journalistes enfreignant la loi. Les médias qui ont procédé à la rédaction des documents avant de les publier ne font pas l'objet de poursuites, a-t-elle dit.

Si les juges Victoria Sharp et Jeremy Johnson se prononcent contre Assange, ce dernier peut demander à la Cour européenne des droits de l'homme de bloquer son extradition - bien que ses partisans craignent qu'il ne soit envoyé aux

États-Unis avant que cela ne se produise, car le gouvernement britannique a déjà signé un ordre d'extradition.

Le débat sur la sécurité de l'État et la liberté des médias

La balance entre la sécurité de l'État et la liberté des médias est une question cru-

ciale soulevée par cette affaire. Assange est-il un lanceur d'alerte courageux ou un fauteur de troubles mettant en danger des vies? Les partisans de la liberté de la presse soutiennent qu'Assange a exposé des actes répréhensibles et devrait bénéficier de protections journalistiques, tandis

que les autorités américaines insistent sur le préjudice causé à la sécurité nationale.

La nature délicate de cette équation souligne la nécessité de trouver un équilibre entre la nécessité de protéger les informations sensibles et le droit fondamental à la liberté d'expression. La question n'est pas seulement celle d'Assange, mais aussi celle de la manière dont les démocraties modernes peuvent naviguer entre la transparence nécessaire et la protection des intérêts nationaux.

Le bras de fer anglo-argentin sur les îles Falkland: un sujet "non négociable" pour le Royaume-Uni

La visite de Lord Cameron aux îles Falkland cette semaine a été qualifiée de "provocation" par un gouverneur argentin. Le geste a été critiqué par le dirigeant de la région argentine. Gustavo Melella, le gouverneur de la Terre de Feu, Antarctique et îles de l'Atlantique Sud, a publié sur X, (anciennement Twitter): "La présence de David Cameron sur nos îles Malouines constitue une nouvelle provocation britannique et vise à diminuer nos revendications légitimes de souveraineté sur nos territoires et à maintenir le colonialisme au XXIe siècle. Nous ne tolérerons pas cela."

Cette visite de David Cameron s'inscrit dans une démarche visant à souligner que la souveraineté britan-

nique n'est pas négociable et que les îles sont une "partie valorisée de la famille britannique". Le secrétaire d'État aux Affaires étrangères sera le premier membre du gouvernement britannique à visiter l'archipel depuis 2016. Cette visite fait suite à la promesse de James Cleverly de se rendre aux îles l'année dernière, et Lord Cameron, son successeur, confirme cette promesse.

Au cours de sa visite, Lord Cameron devrait rendre hommage aux soldats britanniques qui ont combattu dans la guerre des Malouines en 1982, ainsi qu'au personnel militaire actuellement en poste sur les îles. Il visitera également des projets environnementaux et observera certains des pingouins qui dépendent des habitats insulaires vitaux. Le secrétaire d'État aux Affaires étrangères a déclaré : "Les îles Falkland sont une partie valorisée de la famille britannique, et nous sommes catégoriques : tant qu'elles souhaitent rester au sein de la famille, la question de la souveraineté ne sera pas sujette à discussion. Les habitants des Falkland devraient être fiers de la communauté moderne et prospère qu'ils ont construite."

Malgré le référendum de 2013 aux îles Falkland, au cours duquel 99,8 % des résidents ont voté en faveur du maintien de leur statut de territoire britannique d'outre-mer, la question de la souveraineté reste une source de tension entre le Royaume-Uni et l'Argentine. Cette visite de David Cameron souligne la ferme position du Royaume-Uni sur la question de la souveraineté des îles Falkland, considérée comme "réglée" par Downing Street. Cependant, cette affirmation unilatérale peut être

interprétée comme un défi direct à l'Argentine, ravivant ainsi les tensions persistantes. Alors que les relations entre le Royaume-Uni et l'Argentine restent tendues, la communauté internationale continuera à surveiller attentivement l'évolution de cette situation, sachant que la résolution de ce différend historique peut avoir des implications plus larges pour les principes de souveraineté et de droit international.

Le conflit persistant entre Maurice et le Royaume-Uni sur les îles Chagos


Ce conflit opposant le Royaume-Uni à l'Argentine nous rappelle le différend opposant Maurice au Royaume-Uni sur la question de la souveraineté par rapport à Diego Garcia. Il est crucial de noter que ce conflit territorial remonte à plus de cinq décennies et persiste malgré le jugement de la Cour internationale de justice (CIJ) en 2019.

Les îles Chagos faisaient partie de la colonie de la Couronne de Maurice jusqu'en 1965, lorsque les Britanniques les ont séparées du reste de la colonie pour former le Territoire britannique de l'océan Indien (British Indian Ocean Territory). Même après l'indépendance de Maurice en 1968, l'archipel est resté sous domination britannique, et les habitants locaux ont été expulsés et déportés à Maurice et aux Seychelles du début des années 1960 au début des années 1970.

Le gouvernement mauricien critique depuis des décennies le contrôle britannique des îles Chagos et revendique leur souveraineté.

Dengue fever: Emphasise shared responsibility, Cut sensationalism!

According to official data, as at 18 February, out of just over 1300 cases of dengue recorded since mid-December 2023, 559 are active cases, and the distribution around the island is: Port Louis (the most affected region) 303 cases, North 174, Plaines-Wilhems 48, South 16, West 13 cases, and East 5. 110 patients are hospitalized, and 457 are being treated at home as part of the 457 Domiciliary Medical Unit (DMU) scheme.

Based on these figures, the scenario works out at about 20 cases reported per day since onset and less than 15 patients per hospital in a total of 5 Regional Hospitals, and 3 District Hospitals (Long Mountain, Mahebourg, Souillac Hospitals) if they too are admitting dengue cases.

For a public health service which handles about 4-5 million outpatients and inpatients per year, by no stretch of the imagination can these dengue figures be considered as indicating a humongous epidemic beyond the capacity of the system to cope. Doctors and other health professionals are quite accustomed to dealing with large numbers of patients on a daily basis, and thus the current dengue situation is for them par for the game. Which doesn't mean that they are not concerned, in fact for our Public Health Division – one of the very best in the world – this is the kind of situation that they are always well prepared for.

Thus, for the current dengue wave there are, according to health officials, 'teams operating in different regions and hospitals on the island. Examinations are carried out on infected individuals, either directing them to hospitals or advising them to stay at home for treatment. Visits are organized over periods of two, five, and seven days.'

This is in addition to 'teams for fumigation and treatment, larvicide, following a well-established protocol. The (infected) person is entitled to ten days off, whether in the public or private sector, to avoid any risk of transmission.' By the same token, infected individuals are also advised to limit their movements.'

Dengue, the disease

A few simple technical facts about dengue may be of general interest. According to WHO, dengue is the most common and important arthropod or insect-borne viral (arboviral) illness in humans. It is transmitted by mosquitoes of the genus *Aedes*, which are widely distributed in subtropical and tropical areas of the world. The incidence of dengue has increased dramatically in recent decades, with estimates of 40-50% of the world's population at risk for the disease in tropical, subtropical, and, most recently, more temperate areas. Probably global warming resulting from climate change may be having an impact.

The disease has a seasonal pattern, with the majority of cases in the Southern hemisphere occurring during the first half of the year (as we are currently witnessing) and the majority of cases in the Northern hemisphere occurring during the second half of the year.

Typically, the most common type of dengue (Type 1) is a self-limited disease with a mortality rate of less than 1% when detected early and with access to proper me-

dical care, which is widely available locally.

It is to be noted that there is no specific antiviral medication for dengue; treatment is therefore to relieve symptoms and is supportive in nature. Bed rest with simple medication given for pain and fever are helpful in relieving lethargy, malaise, and the fever. However, because of the severity of the muscle spasms and joint pain in a number of cases, dengue is also known as breakbone fever.

Type 2 concerns a small percentage of persons who get severe dengue, with bleeding (dengue haemorrhagic fever or dengue shock syndrome) who obviously need more intensive treatment, despite which it has a mortality rate of 2-5%.

Prevention of mosquito bite is the key

As with other similar infectious diseases, the only way to truly prevent the dengue virus acquisition is to avoid being bitten by the vector mosquito. The measures are by now well-known: at individual level, use of mosquito repellent and indoor sprays, wearing protective clothing (e.g. long sleeves), remaining in well-screened or air-conditioned places.

Public Health measures target the larval phase with larvicides and cleaning up larvae habitats. Good sanitation and refuse control will prevent growth of mosquito larvae. As we are in cyclonic season, it is worth remembering that cyclones and other natural disasters increase the habitat for mosquito growth in urban areas by increasing rubble and garbage, which act as water reservoirs.

Importantly, breeding of vector mosquitoes can be reduced by eliminating small accumulations of stagnant water around human habitats. Disposing of old tyres, covering water receptacles such as drums, not leaving

used paint pails/ *lamoques* (tin cans) containing stagnant water about in the yard are simple precautions that all can take.

I am not surprised that Port Louis has the highest number. In fact, during a Public Health awareness/education campaign about twelve years ago when I was part of an MOH team going around in Port Louis, we were appalled to find all the unsanitary conditions favourable to mosquito proliferation mentioned above in many a household yard. Have no lessons been learnt?

Unfortunately, instead of pressing these points upon the public, which emphasise the shared responsibility between the authorities and public in controlling and avoiding bites by mosquitoes, the media has a tendency to harp on numbers without contextualisation, and heap inordinate amounts of abstruse technical data of no practical use to the public at large.

This kind of sensationalism can lead to panic and consequent overcrowding of hospitals, as happened during the AH1N1 epidemic. Worldwide in fact, leading to a comment later that the epidemic was spread as much by panic as by mosquitoes!

Fortunately for the country our Public Health experts have a robust handle on these matters, and have a track record the country can be proud of. Such as the elimination of malaria as far back as the early 1970s, officially recognized by WHO.

So let us cut sensationalism, at least where health matters are concerned, though it is the DNA of the media, according to a former president of the Media Trust. In a televised interview years ago, he declared that without sensationalism newspapers wouldn't sell.

Let us instead stick to the simple, direct messaging which focus the public's attention on the **low cost but effective** Public Health measures that are accessible to them and **which they should apply** for their own and the population's safety.

The Health Costs of Plastic Pollution

The cost of doing nothing exceeds the benefits to be reaped from a sensible approach to curbing this pollution sooner rather than later

Two years ago, at the UN Environmental Assembly (UNEA-5) in Nairobi, Kenya, a gathering of Heads of State, Ministers of environment and other bureaucrats from UN Member States, endorsed a resolution to end plastic pollution and forge an internationally legally binding agreement by 2024.

The resolution itself is a tour de force of bureaucratese. It calls for the intergovernmental negotiating committee to consider a variety of factors in its deliberations to craft a Global Plastics Treaty and ends with the wonderful catchall paragraph authorizing/admonishing the committee to consider: "Any other aspects that the intergovernmental negotiating committee may consider relevant."

My attention was drawn to the UNEA-5 and the Global Plastics Treaty by a report that the Journal of the Endocrine Society (JES) had just published a paper on a survey of chemicals used in plastic materials and a resulting estimate of the attributable costs of the disease burden that such chemicals impose in the United States.

The JES survey begins with the acknowledgment that chemicals used in plastics contribute to disease and disability and sought to determine their impact because, according to the authors, without this information, "interventions proposed as part of the Global Plastics Treaty cannot be evaluated for potential benefits."

The authors analyzed existing literature to identify plastic-related fractions of disease and disability for specific polybrominated diphenylethers (PBDE), phthalates, bisphenols, and polyfluoroalkyl substances and perfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). They then updated previously published disease burden and cost estimates for these chemicals in the United States to 2018. By uniting these data, they computed estimates of attributable disease burden and costs due to plastics in the United States.

The authors note that plastics contribute substantially to disease and associated social costs in the United

“If 2040 is a realistic goal and we use the estimated cost of \$1 trillion a year without factoring in any increase, a dubious assumption, the healthcare burden due to plastics alone amounts to about \$16 trillion or two-thirds of current US GDP. A sobering thought. None of this takes into account the cost burden of plastics on the environment or the oceans. The Carleton College website notes that: “Over a few decades, humans have managed to dump tons upon tons of garbage into the ocean. Of the most devastating elements of this pollution is that plastics takes thousands of years to decay. As a result, fish and wildlife are becoming intoxicated. Consequently, the toxins from the plastics have entered the food chain...”

States, accounting for 1.22% of the gross domestic product. They claim that the costs of plastic pollution will continue to accumulate if exposures continue at current levels. Conversely, they assert that actions through the Global Plastics Treaty and other policy initiatives will reduce these costs in proportion to the actual reductions in chemical exposures achieved. There is no proof offered for these assertions.

US healthcare costs run at a clip of about \$4.5 trillion annually. The authors state that the social costs of disease and disability in the United States due to PBDEs, phthalates, and bisphenols as well as PFAS, are very large, on the order of \$400 billion annually. They do mention a more recent study by the Minderoo-Monaco Commission, which suggests even higher costs, more than \$900 billion per year, but dismiss that number as being overstated. The controversy is not for us to resolve currently because the number, whether \$400 billion or \$900 billion, is immense.

One of the assumptions made by the authors is that disease burden is directly proportional to exposure. Whether that is true or not, the ultimate assessments are that the cost burden for the US alone are \$250-500 billion.

Healthcare costs in the US are about four times higher than in the next most expensive healthcare country. It is difficult to extrapolate from the US numbers, but clearly the total cost to the world is around \$1 trillion.

So, what are we going to do about this? The Global

Plastics Treaty has yet to be adopted and ratified. Will it be? Who knows?

As a reality check, I went looking. The Plastics Europe website had this cautious observation: "Our goal is to end plastic pollution by 2040 through a circular economy where all plastic applications are reused, recycled, and responsibly managed during and after use while enabling a lower greenhouse gas emissions plastic economy."

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They note the existence of the three great plastic islands, the Great Pacific Garbage Patch, also known as the Pacific Trash Vortex or gyre, is located in the central North Pacific Ocean and is larger than the state of Texas. And there are large garbage patches in the Indian and Atlantic Ocean. More patches of plastic waste are being discovered in the oceans.

Plastics waste gathers at spots in the ocean where currents meet. They estimate that in the Atlantic there are 580,000 pieces of plastic per square kilometer in these patches.

Plastic waste is dispersed across the oceans. Some plastics fragment and sink forming columns of pollution in the ocean waters. Other plastics can soak up surrounding toxins entering the ocean from other sources. Chemicals ingested by fish and other seafood consumed by humans, spread through the plastic waste, and increase the incidence of diseases and cancer.

The chemicals can be directly toxic as with lead, mercury, cadmium, and heavy metals. Some plastics ingested by fish are carcinogens for humans and cause tumors and other disorders in fish. Some chemicals are toxic to humans and cause cancers even when no seafood consumption is involved.

I have not seen any studies on the cost impact of ocean pollution on healthcare. At even 50% of the overall cost projected for general plastic waste in the environment, the numbers are staggering. Surely, the cost of doing nothing exceeds the benefits to be reaped from a sensible approach to curbing this pollution sooner rather than later. This is a problem to which scarcely any serious attention is being paid.

La critique internationale du maintien du contrôle britannique s'est également intensifiée. En 2019, la Cour internationale de justice a statué contre le Royaume-Uni et a déclaré qu'il devait rendre les îles Chagos à Maurice, une décision également soutenue par l'Assemblée générale des Nations unies. Cependant, ces décisions étant non contraignantes, le gouvernement britannique n'a montré aucun signe de changement de position jus-

qu'à présent.

Ce qui retiendrait le Royaume-Uni de céder les îles Chagos à Maurice, ce seraient ses préoccupations géopolitiques, nous dit-on. La base navale de soutien Diego Garcia des États-Unis a joué un rôle clé dans les opérations militaires pendant la guerre du Golfe, la guerre en Afghanistan et la guerre en Irak. Les États-Unis considèrent également la base comme essentielle pour maintenir un équilibre militaire délicat dans la région Indo-

Pacifique face à la montée de la Chine et aux conflits intensifiés en mer de Chine méridionale, ainsi que pour garantir l'approvisionnement stable en pétrole du golfe Persique.

La réponse du gouvernement britannique concernant l'archipel de Chagos est donc qu'il le rendra à Maurice lorsque "ce ne sera plus nécessaire à des fins de défense". Il n'y a, à ce jour, aucune indication claire à propos de la date à laquelle cela pourrait être possible.

Grandeur présidentielle aux États-Unis: le bon, le mauvais et le laid

Donald Trump occupe la dernière place en tant que pire président

La grandeur présidentielle aux États-Unis est un sujet complexe et nuancé qui englobe une variété d'aspects, du leadership exceptionnel aux controverses et écchecs notables. L'histoire des présidents américains est marquée par des moments de triomphe et des périodes de tumulte, formant un tableau riche et diversifié de la plus haute fonction du pays. Examinons de plus près ces éléments en distinguant le bon, le mauvais et le laid.

Un récent sondage a classé Donald Trump comme le pire de tous les 45 présidents, derrière même ceux qui ont échoué à prévenir la guerre civile. Pour aggraver les choses, le probable candidat républicain pour l'élection de cette année, Joe Biden, a fait ses débuts à la 14e place, selon une dépêche de TD Mahapatra du 'Hindustan Times'.

Les politologues qui ont mené l'enquête, Justin Vaughn et Brandon Rottinghaus, ont écrit dans le 'Los Angeles Times': "Les réalisations les plus importantes de Biden pourraient être qu'il a sauvé la présidence de Trump, repris un style plus traditionnel de leadership présidentiel et se prépare à maintenir le bureau hors des mains de son prédécesseur cet automne."

De 'George Washington à Joe Biden'

Vaughn, de l'Université de la Caroline du Sud, et Rottinghaus, de l'Université de Houston, ont interrogé 154 universitaires, principalement affiliés à l'American Political Science Association.

Ils ont expliqué leur objectif, indiquant que celui-ci "était de créer un classement de la grandeur présidentielle couvrant tous les présidents de George Washington à Joe Biden", suivant des listes similaires qu'ils ont réalisées en 2015 et 2018.

Ils ont demandé aux répondants de noter chaque président sur une échelle de 0 à 100 pour leur grandeur globale, avec 0=échec, 50=moyen, et 100=grand. Ils ont ensuite calculé la note moyenne de chaque président et ils les ont classés du plus élevé au plus bas.

Le haut de la liste n'a pas beaucoup changé par rapport aux enquêtes précédentes, sauf pour Trump, qui était également dernier lorsqu'il était en fonction.

• La première place est allée à Abraham Lincoln, qui

a mis fin à l'esclavage et a guidé le pays à travers la guerre civile.

- Il est suivi de Franklin D. Roosevelt, qui a dirigé les États-Unis pendant la Grande Dépression et la Seconde Guerre mondiale.
- La troisième place appartient à George Washington, le premier président, qui a assuré l'indépendance vis-à-vis de la Grande-Bretagne.
- Les trois suivants sont Teddy Roosevelt, Thomas Jefferson et Harry Truman.
- Barack Obama, le premier président noir et vice-président de Biden de 2009 à 2017, a grimpé de neuf places pour se classer septième.
- Vaughn et Rottinghaus ont également observé l'effet des mouvements pour la justice raciale sur les classements d'Andrew Jackson (de neuvième en 2015 à 21e maintenant) et de Woodrow Wilson (de dixième à 15e)." Leur réputation a constamment souffert ces dernières années à mesure que la politique moderne amène les universitaires à évaluer de plus en plus sévèrement leur présidence du XIXe et du XXe siècles, surtout leur traitement inacceptable des personnes marginalisées", ont-ils écrit. Jackson était propriétaire d'esclaves et a perpétré un génocide contre les Amérindiens. Wilson était un chef victorieux de la Première Guerre mondiale et un fondateur de la Société des Nations, mais aussi un racisme obstiné qui a

ségrégué le gouvernement fédéral.

- Un autre changement notable était Ulysses S. Grant (de 26e en 2015 à 17e maintenant), dont la présidence a été entachée par la corruption mais dont les efforts pour protéger les droits des esclaves libérés dans le Sud, notamment en luttant contre le Ku Klux Klan, lui ont valu plus de respect. Grant a remplacé Andrew Johnson, qui a été destitué après avoir succédé à Lincoln. Johnson et James Buchanan, qui a précédé Lincoln et n'a pas réussi à éviter la guerre civile, ont tous deux été classés plus haut que Trump par Vaughn et Rottinghaus.

Trump se distingue en tant que personnalité très controversée, avec un maigre bilan législatif, un refus de concéder la défaite à Biden, ce qui a provoqué une attaque violente contre le Congrès, et une post-présidence marquée par 91 chefs d'accusation criminels découlant de ses actions pendant qu'il était en fonction ou pendant la campagne électorale.

Le classement de Donald Trump comme le pire président américain, même derrière ceux qui ont fait face aux défis de la guerre civile, souligne la polarisation entourant sa présidence. Cependant, il est important de noter que les évaluations de la grandeur présidentielle peuvent varier en fonction des critères et des perspectives. D'autres dirigeants mondiaux ont également été soumis à des évaluations subjectives, et ces classements peuvent refléter la diversité des opinions politiques et historiques.

Le leadership à Maurice

Le classement des présidents et Premiers ministres à travers le monde, y compris à Maurice, repose sur des critères variés et peut être sujet à des débats politiques. Dans le contexte mauricien, l'évaluation des dirigeants dépend généralement de leurs réalisations, de la gestion des affaires nationales et de leur impact sur le développement socio-économique du pays.

“Les circonscriptions 1-20 veulent respirer de l’air frais...”

...les électeurs veulent une élimination du système politique basé sur des priviléges familiaux”

Ces derniers temps, Rama Valayden, l'un des principaux dirigeants de Linion Moris, sillonne le pays pour mieux comprendre les attentes des Mauriciens. Dans un premier temps, il partage avec nos lecteurs son analyse du paysage politique national. Suite à ses observations de terrain, il constate que les critiques des citoyens sont acerbés envers le gouvernement et l'opposition, plus particulièrement envers les figures politiques les plus exposées, le Premier ministre Pravind Jugnauth et le leader de l'Alliance de l'opposition, Navin Ramgoolam. Il souligne aussi les implications d'une éventuelle élection partielle au numéro 10. Dans un deuxième temps, l'homme de loi nous parle ouvertement de la lutte contre la drogue et des raisons menant à l'échec du gouvernement dans le traitement de ce dossier. Il apporte des propositions percutantes pour réformer la police, combattre la corruption, et apporter des changements significatifs à l'échelle nationale.

Mauritius Times: Avant même d'aborder la question de l'imminence d'une éventuelle élection partielle au numéro 10, veuillez nous faire part de votre analyse des rapports de force actuels sur le terrain.

Rama Valayden: Notre présence assidue sur le terrain nous a permis de conclure qu'environ 70% des électeurs souhaitent un renouveau mais ils n'ont aucune allégeance politique ferme à ce jour.

Ramgoolam n'incarne pas cet espoir de renouveau auquel aspirent les Mauriciens. Pire, la perception que le Premier ministre, Pravind Jugnauth et son MSM affichent tous les symptômes d'un régime en fin de règne, usé jusqu'à la corde et qui patauge dans les scandales et la perception de la politisation à outrance des institutions est très forte.

Ce que nous avons observé dans la circonscription No 10, c'est un schéma qui se reproduit pratiquement partout à travers le pays. Que ce soit pour Ramgoolam ou pour Jugnauth, ils sont tous deux en fin de parcours. En un mot,

“Les circonscriptions 4 à 14 avaient sévèrement réglé son compte à Ramgoolam en 2014, et elles ont récidivé en 2019. Aujourd'hui, en 2024, nous constatons surtout que l'électorat rural est profondément aigri et désabusé. Il s'estime trahi par les leaders politiques qui ont géré le pays depuis plusieurs années. Il a le sentiment d'avoir été mené en bateau et sa frustration est grande. Les circonscriptions urbaines, elles, constatent que l'opposition traditionnelle est déconnectée des réalités d'aujourd'hui; elle ne les a pas défendues quand il le fallait et leurs élus n'ont pas été à la hauteur de leurs responsabilités.”

leurs carottes sont cuites.

* Quoi qu'il en soit, pensez-vous que la bataille électorale sera remportée dans les circonscriptions 4 à 14, ou êtes-vous d'avis que l'arithmétique électorale, surtout au niveau des circonscriptions urbaines, prendra le dessus, favorisant ainsi l'opposition?

Je vous rappelle qu'aux dernières élections générales de 2019, sur les 11 circonscriptions du No 4 au No 14, le gouvernement a fait élire 31 députés et l'opposition 4, y compris les 'best losers'. Dans les circonscriptions urbaines, le gouvernement avait fait élire 12 députés contre 21 pour l'opposition, y compris les 'best losers'.

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On observe aussi un phénomène de "elector fatigue", c'est-à-dire que de nombreux électeurs sont fatigués de voir et de revoir les mêmes têtes pour lesquelles ils votent depuis plus d'un quart de siècle.

Dans tous les cas, le ras-le-bol est palpable, et cela, du No 1 au No 20. Les électeurs sont fatigués par les 10 ans du règne Jugnauth et les 14 ans de Ramgoolam fils. Les circonscriptions 1 à 20 veulent respirer de l'air frais.

Les électeurs veulent un renouvellement drastique de la classe politique, une élimination du système politique

basé sur des priviléges familiaux et, enfin, ils veulent la méritocratie. Ils ne veulent plus voir leurs enfants quitter le pays, ils veulent qu'il y ait plus de justice sociale ou encore que le trafic de drogue soit éradiqué et sévèrement puni.

* Dans ces circonstances, pensez-vous que le Premier ministre aurait le moindre intérêt à organiser une élection partielle au numéro 10 après la démission de Vikram Hurdoval, si ce n'est que pour déstabiliser l'opposition suite à une éventuelle défaite de celle-ci dans cette circonscription avant le scrutin national?

Pravind Jugnauth clame haut et fort que le MSM présentera un candidat dans une éventuelle partielle au No 10. "Atan nou pou gueter". En fait, il veut provoquer l'opposition et il sait déjà que le No 10 est un terrain miné et excessivement dangereux pour le MSM.

Pravind Jugnauth y sera en permanence sur la défensive dans une campagne électorale dans le No 10, car il devra passer le plus clair de son temps à expliquer aux électeurs de cette circonscription pourquoi il a licencié Vikram Hurdoval dans les circonstances que l'on sait.

Jugnauth s'est auto déstabilisé en révoquant son ministre. Il n'y a pas pire posture pour un Premier ministre sortant que d'être contraint de venir de l'avant pour s'expliquer et se justifier.

* Actuellement, pensez-vous que la lutte contre le trafic de drogue a été perdue malgré les initiatives et la bonne volonté des autorités policières?

Honduran ex-president accused of running his country as a 'narco-state' stands trial in NYC

Former Honduran President Juan Orlando Hernández was once touted by U.S. authorities as a key ally in the war on drugs. Now, federal prosecutors say the political leader ran his Central American nation as a "narco-state," collecting millions of dollars from violent cartels to fuel his rise to power.

Nearly two years after his arrest and extradition to the U.S., Hernández went on trial Tuesday in Manhattan federal court on drug trafficking and weapons charges. A jury was chosen and opening statements were scheduled for Wednesday at a trial Judge P. Kevin Castel projected would last two to three weeks.

It's a stunning fall from grace for a political leader long viewed — by Democratic and Republican administrations alike — as beneficial to American interests in the region, including combatting the illegal drug trade and helping slow the waves of migrants crossing the southern U.S. border, reports AP.

That Hernández is being tried in the U.S. rather than his native country underscores Honduras' institutional weakness, says Raúl Pineda Alvarado, a Honduran political analyst and former three-term congressman from Hernández's National Party.

"For Hondurans it signifies how weak our democracy is in terms of the separation of powers," he said. "Politicians are not subject to any control."

Federal authorities say that for nearly two decades, Hernández profited from drug trades that brought

hundreds of thousands of kilos of cocaine into the U.S., even at times working with the powerful Sinaloa cartel in Mexico.

The millions of dollars in drug money that began flowing to Hernández starting around 2004, in turn, powered his rise from a congressman representing his rural home province in western Honduras to president of the National Congress and then two consecutive presidential terms from 2014 to 2022, prosecutors say.

In exchange for bribes that propped up his political aspirations, U.S. prosecutors say, drug traffickers were allowed to operate in the country with near impunity, receiving information to evade authorities and even law enforcement escorts for their shipments.

During his first winning presidential campaign, Hernández solicited \$1.6 million from a drug trafficker to support his run and those of other politicians in his conservative political party, federal prosecutors say.

His brother also received a \$1 million campaign donation from notorious Sinaloa boss Joaquin "El Chapo" Guzmán on the promise the cartel's drug shipments would find safe passage through Honduras if Hernández was elected.

Federal prosecutors in New York spent years working their way up through Honduran drug trafficking organizations before reaching the person many believed was at the very pinnacle — Hernández.

He was arrested at his home in Tegucigalpa, the Honduran capital, in February 2022, just three months after leaving office, and was extradited to the U.S. in April that year.

The former president, who earned a master's degree from the State University of New York at Albany, has steadfastly maintained his innocence, saying the allegations are revenge from drug traffickers he had extradited to the U.S.

Meanwhile his co-defendants — the former head of the Honduran national police, Juan Carlos Bonilla, and Hernández's cousin, Mauricio Hernández Pineda — both pleaded guilty in recent weeks to drug trafficking charges in the same Manhattan courthouse where his trial is occurring.

Brazil calls for reform of United Nations as it starts its G20 presidency

Brazil's foreign minister called for reforms of the United Nations and other multilateral institutions Wednesday while criticizing their inability to prevent global conflicts, as his country kicked off its presidency of the Group of 20 nations.

Mauro Vieira told fellow foreign ministers during opening remarks for a G20 meeting in Rio de Janeiro that the U.N. Security Council has been unable to prevent or halt conflicts such as those playing out in Ukraine and the Gaza Strip, reports AP.

Foreign ministers of the 20 leading rich and developing nations are gathering this week to discuss poverty, climate change and heightened global tensions, setting a roadmap for work to accomplish ahead of a Nov. 18-19 summit in Rio.

One of Brazil's key proposals, set by President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, is a reform of global governance institutions such as the United Nations, the World Trade Organization and multilateral banks, where he wants to push for stronger representation of developing nations.

The leftist leader reiterated on Feb. 18 his interest in expanding the U.N.'s Security Council, contemplating the entry of more countries from Africa, Latin America, as well as India, Germany or Japan.

Whether Lula's push will be successful remains to be seen, as permanent members of the Security Council have in the past been dismissive of attempts at reform

that would result in a loss of their power.

Vieira said Brazil was "deeply worried" by the proliferation of conflicts around the world - not just in Ukraine and Gaza, but in more than 170 locations, according to some studies, he said.

Vieira said more than \$2 trillion a year is spent on military budgets globally and that more of that money should go toward development aid programs.

Speaking to reporters on Sunday at the African Union summit in Ethiopia, Lula said that "what is happening in the Gaza Strip and to the Palestinian people hasn't been seen in any other moment in history. Actually, it did when Hitler decided to kill the Jews."

In response, Israel declared Lula a "persona non grata", summoned Brazil's ambassador to Israel and demanded an apology. In retaliation, Lula recalled Brazil's ambassador for consultations.

After years of diplomatic isolation under former President Jair Bolsonaro, Lula has sought to reinsert Brazil on the center stage of global diplomacy since returning to power in January of 2023.

No foreign interference behind the attack on residence of Nijjar associate: Canada

Canadian law enforcement has said they have not established any links to foreign interference as they charged two teenagers for a shooting that targeted the residence of Simranjeet Singh, an associate of pro-Khalistan figure Hardeep Singh Nijjar, who was killed in Surrey, British Columbia, on June 18.

In a release on Tuesday, the Surrey detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) said, "At the time of this incident, there was speculation circulating that this was connected to foreign interference. Investigators have not established any links to foreign interference in relation to this matter."

Pro-Khalistan groups, including Sikhs for Justice (SFJ) had alleged that India was responsible for the firing at the home of Simranjeet Singh in the early hours of February 1. They had connected the attack with the fact that Singh had helped organise a protest outside the Indian consulate in Vancouver on January 26.

Moninder Singh, spokesperson for the British Columbia Gurdwaras Council and also a prominent separatist in Canada, told the outlet CBC News at the time that he believed Simranjeet Singh's connection to Nijjar could have been a factor, reports Anirudh Bhattacharyya of Hindustan Times.

The two 16-year-olds have not been named as they are minors. Surrey RCMP spokesperson Cpl Sarjit K Sangha said that they were arrested on February 12 and the British Columbia Prosecution Service approved charges against them of Discharging a Firearm into a place and Possessing a Loaded Prohibited Firearm. "The youths are currently being held in custody awaiting their next court appearance," she added.

Relations between India and Canada cratered last year when Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau stated in the House of Commons on September 18 that there were "credible allegations" of a potential link between Indian agents and Nijjar's killing. That case is being probed by the Integrated Homicide Investigation Team (IHIT).

Nawaz Sharif, Bilawal Bhutto's parties strike deal to form coalition govt in Pak

Former Pakistan Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari said on Tuesday that his party had reached an agreement with the largest party in the country's national assembly to form a coalition government, reports Reuters.

The agreement between Bhutto Zardari's Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) and the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) of three-time Premier Nawaz Sharif ends days of uncertainty and negotiations after the Feb. 8 elections produced a hung national assembly.


Bhutto Zardari confirmed at a late night press conference that former Premier Shehbaz Sharif, the younger brother of Nawaz, will be the coalition's candidate for prime minister, and his father Asif Ali Zardari will be their candidate for the country's president.

Former US President Donald Trump has revealed why his wife Melania is not participating in his 2024 presidential campaign rallies, similar to how First Lady Jill Biden has done for her husband at the moment.

Melania Trump has mostly refrained from participating in public events or making remarks regarding the White House race. However, she played a more crucial role during the 2016 presidential campaign.

Speaking with Fox News host Laura Ingraham during his town hall in South Carolina this week, Trump was asked if his wife would be active on the campaign trail.

Ingraham further mentioned that Melania is "wonderful with children" but a lot of people want to see more of her.

In a response, the GOP frontrunner said: "They love her, I'll tell you. And you



know her. She's a very brilliant person. She speaks many languages, the whole thing."

He went on to explain how his wife is paying much of her attention to their 17-year-old son, Barron Trump.

"Her life revolves around that boy, [he's] so important to her," Trump said. "At the same time, it also revolves around our country and the success of our country. She's raised a lot of money for charity."

Calling Melania a "private person" who loves her country, the onetime real estate mogul said: "[The people] love the fact that she's not out there so much. You know, a lot of first ladies will go out. They want to be everywhere. They get angry at their husband because he's not introducing them."

"If I didn't introduce Melania she'd be very happy about it. She's just a different kind of a person. And she loves the country," he added.

Melania Trump absent from Mar-a-Lago New Year's Eve celebration

Many people have wondered about Melania's disappearance, asking why she seems to have distanced herself from the public eye. The former model's conspicuous absence from a Trump family Christmas card that included her husband,

all of his children, and her father fuelled further speculations.

At a speech at his Mar-a-Lago estate, Trump disclosed the reason behind his wife's absence from his New Year's Eve celebration. He said her mother, Amalia Knavs, had been "very ill." He went on to say that his wife spending time with her mother in a Miami hospital, calling the circumstance "a very tough one." Knavs passed away last month at the age of 78.

According to an average provided by the website FiveThirtyEight, Trump is the Republican front-runner and is now polling at 77.7 percent nationwide. In a poll of 6,321 registered voters conducted between February 17 and 19, Morning Consult reports that President Joe Biden, a Democrat, is leading the pack at 41%, while the Republican Party leads at 45%.

• We are never so easily deceived as when we imagine we are deceiving others. — François de La Rochefoucauld

This article is the first of a series which Mr B. Ramlallah proposes to write to cover the activities of the Mauritian Press Delegates now touring the United Kingdom.

After a 40-minute flight from Plaisance, we reached St Denis Airport, where we were greeted by the Press of Réunion. The meeting was arranged by Mr Fanchette of the Central Office of Information. For an hour, we talked about various matters ranging from the overpopulation problem to the economic situation of both islands. The journalists were very cordial. It was our first contact with our colleagues outside Mauritius. Though we did not know each other, we felt we had a lot in common. They expressed pleasant surprise when they learned that we were going to the UK at the Home Government's expense. They said the Press of Réunion was not as fortunate as that of Mauritius. We were taken aback to learn that, although the population of Réunion is about half of ours, and there are several dailies, and the circulation of their papers is much higher than ours. For example, the circulation of the daily, *Le Journal de la Réunion*, is approximately 17,000. It publishes an illustrated monthly magazine that is sold by the hundreds. I bet we won't be able to sell half of what they are selling.

* * *

I am writing from the air—*en plein ciel!* in an Air France plane. The plane left Tananarive Airport at 2 pm. We were flying above the sea somewhere between the mainland of Madagascar and Zanzibar on our journey to Nairobi. The weather is wonderful. Below, the sea looks like a light blue carpet spread to an infinite distance, where it seems to melt into nothingness.

We just received from the air hostess a Government of Kenya Entry Declaration Form to be filled by all those entering Kenya, even by passengers on transit, even if one doesn't leave the airport at all. It should be filled in conformity with Immigration Regulations made by the Kenya Government in 1957. The very wording of the Entry Form fills one with disgust. I could feel the segregation oppressing me. I had the temptation not to fill it, but the thought that I might not be allowed to land to change the plane made me change my mind.

The entrant into the Kenya Colony, if

he happens to be a non-European, should write down his father's and grandfather's names, or if the passenger is a woman, she must write the name of her husband's father. Besides his nationality, he should declare to what race he belongs. The entrant also has to declare whether he has ever been convicted in any country of a crime punishable by imprisonment and whether he has been refused permission to enter Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika, or Zanzibar or has been expelled from any of these countries.

All the members of the Mauritian Press Delegation were invited by the captain of the plane to visit the pilot and radio operators' room. We were shown around, and very kindly the pilot explained to us how the different abstruse mechanisms operate. We were told that we were flying at an altitude of 12,440 feet above sea level and at a speed of 480 kilometers per hour.

At Nairobi, we changed planes and boarded a giant B.O.A.C. plane, where I wrote this letter. It was very comfortable, probably more so than the Air France Super-Constellation. The plane stopped at Entebbe, an airport close to Lake Victoria in the Uganda Protectorate. After a 45-minute rest, the plane flew to Khartoum, Sudan. That airport is very large and beautiful, with several planes coming and going. Another 45-minute rest followed, and then we proceeded directly to Rome. That was our most tiresome and dangerous flight, starting at 2 am. By then, the moon had appeared, looking unusual from a height of 20,500 feet above sea level. We were informed that we were expected to fly at 31,000 feet above sea level — flying 2,000 feet above

Everest itself!

* * *

The appearance of the sun was heralded by a long crimson line. The day was splendid with the sun shining gloriously, but the most amazing scene was the sky and the clouds below us. We are used to seeing them above us, but from above, the clouds look small. There was not a single cloud above because we were flying high in the stratosphere, where no cloud ever reaches. We had a chart from the captain showing us the flight's position. At 4:55 am, we were flying over Benghazi at 20,500 feet above sea level, with an outside temperature of 9°C and a speed of 345 miles per hour.

We flew above the mainland of Italy, moving fast north towards Rome. Below, we noticed the beautiful landscapes of the Italian countryside. For some time, we flew very low, travelling above hilly terrain. We could see houses, trees, and plantations as if a stone's throw from the plane. The woods looked like those of Mauritius, and we could see cars rushing on the roads. The vine plantations near Rome Airport, which we could see up close, were magnificent.

We landed at Ciampino Airport in Rome at 8:30 am. We walked to the airport restaurant for refreshment, feeling the change in atmosphere — it was unmistakably Europe. At other airports, the police and customs officers were coloured. In Nairobi or Khartoum, waiters were either Africans or Arabs wearing long, white robes, tailed fez, and barefooted. At this airport, passengers were served by waiters wearing white coats and black ties. Several souvenir shops were present with Italian girls behind the

counters.

After 45 minutes, our plane took off directly to London — a 3-hour flight. At 10 am, the plane was flying above Elbe Island at a height of 22,550 feet and a speed of 325 miles per hour. The sight while flying over the Alps was magnificent. Between 10:35 and 11 am, the plane hovered over the Alps, at times coming close to the peaks. The sun shone brilliantly, and all the peaks of the Alps looked like finely chiselled blue basalt stones on a green carpet coated with fine white sugar. The white sugar-like thing surrounding the peaks is snow; year in and year out, the peaks are partly covered with snow. The most thrilling sight was Mont Blanc — a huge lump of snow rising majestically above all the other peaks, awe-inspiring and worth the travel itself.

Leaving the Alps behind, we flew over Lake Geneva and the town on the lake's border. It was a splendid sight. The fields close to the lake were green, intersected by straight roads, and meticulously traced. Switzerland is covered with green and dense forests, in stark contrast to Italy, which appears to be a dry country. We flew over the northeastern side of Paris, the Channel, the wondrous English landscapes, and fields, finally reaching London Airport — one of the gateways to a world I have been looking forward to re-entering.

Election partielle: un piège pour qui?

Une défaite éventuelle de Navin à la partielle fragiliserait sa position comme leader de l'alliance de l'opposition parlementaire et pousserait celle-ci dans le désarroi à la veille des élections générales.

A moins que le défi du Premier ministre ne soit un bluff destiné à confondre l'opposition dans son ensemble, certains observateurs ont avancé la thèse d'une stratégie politique visant à provoquer une partielle pour coincer le leader du PTr dans le contexte de l'opacité sur les épisodes de révocation et de démission.

Le manque de transparence entourant les motifs de la révocation de Vikram Hurdoyal comme ministre donne lieu à toutes sortes de conjectures. A-t-il fauté vraiment quelque part ou a-t-il été puni pour avoir apparemment refusé de livrer un nouveau permis pour le commerce des singes? S'il n'en est rien, pourquoi ya-t-il un accord entre Hurdoyal et le Premier ministre pour ne rien dire sur les raisons de la révocation, suivie de la démission du député?

Jusqu'ici, il y avait une certaine transparence sur les raisons menant à la révocation de certains ministre. Par

exemple, la révocation du leader du Muvman Liberater (ML) en 2020 avait été officiellement liée à son implication alléguée dans une affaire d'attribution de contrat par le CEB. Toute l'opacité dans le cas de Hurdoyal est donc intrigante.

Histoire des partielles

Navin Ramgoolam est sans doute trop intelligent pour tomber dans quelque piège que lui tendrait le gouvernement. Comme leader d'une alliance nationale, il devrait choisir un autre candidat du PTr pour briguer une éventuelle partielle dans la circonscription no. 10 et concentrer son énergie sur la campagne nationale.

L'histoire des partielles à Maurice démontre qu'aucun parti n'a la garantie de remporter une partielle peu importante la popularité du gouvernement ou le calibre du candidat de l'opposition. Voici quelques exemples:

- En juin 1989, le novice Cyril Curé, candidat du MSM, avait battu le « géant » Ivan Collendavelloo, candidat de l'opposition MMM, lors d'une partielle dans la circonscription no. 15 (La Caverne/Phoenix) par une faible marge de 351 voix.
- En avril 1998, le novice Satish Faugoo, candidat du PTr, avait battu le « géant » SAJ, candidat de l'opposition MSM, lors d'une partielle dans la circonscription no. 9 (Flacq/Bon Accueil) par une marge de 1 474 voix.
- En décembre 2003, le candidat travailliste Rajesh Jeetah avait battu le candidat du gouvernement MSM, Prakash Maunthrooa, lors d'une partielle dans la circonscription no. 7 (Piton/Rivière du Rempart) par une marge de 2 608 voix.

Si le gouvernement ne tient pas une partielle le 11 août 2024, cela indiquera qu'il s'est piégé lui-même avec l'épisode de la révocation de Hurdoyal au lieu de piéger le leader du PTr. Il ne pourra pas tenir une partielle avec le risque probable de la perdre dans le contexte de l'impopularité du pouvoir. Il n'aura d'autre choix que de tenir des élections anticipées avant la fin de l'année après avoir présenté un budget populiste en juin 2024.

Dans la politique, il y a des circonstances qui sont parfois en dehors du contrôle d'un gouvernement, aussi puissant soit-il. L'adage «A week is a long time in politics» a été très bien illustré dans la deuxième semaine de février.

Socrates: Politics is a jungle, my friend, and in this case, maybe a jungle with monkeys. But why would he switch sides?


Cephalus: Ah, that's the million-dollar question. Or should I say, the ten-thousand-dollar monkey question?

Hiring the most qualified candidate might be unfair

Hiring the most qualified candidate may be perceived as unfair, according to a study by the American Psychological Association. The research, led by Daniela Goya-Tocchetto, PhD, an assistant professor of organization and human resources at the University at Buffalo-State University of New York, found that both liberals and conservatives viewed merit-based hiring as less fair after learning about socioeconomic disparities. The study, involving over 3,300 participants in five online experiments, revealed increased support for programs promoting socioeconomic diversity.

"Socioeconomic disadvantages early in life can undermine educational achievement, test scores, and work experiences. In this way, inequality can undermine equal opportunity," said Goya-Tocchetto. However, when evaluating the fairness of merit-based processes, people often overlook this broader context and the effects of inequality.

The researchers conducted five online experiments, involving a total of more than 3,300 participants. In two experiments, participants read about a merit-based hiring or promotion process where the most qualified candidate would be



selected. Half of the participants weren't given any additional information, while the other half were informed about the past socioeconomic disadvantages for one candidate and the advantages for another candidate. Both liberal and conservative participants who received background information perceived the merit-based process as less fair with less equal opportunity.

In two additional experiments, participants found merit-based hiring or promo-

tions to be less fair after learning how low income can hinder educational opportunities and career advancement. A final experiment found that knowledge about socioeconomic disparities increased support for hiring programs fostering social class diversity, such as removing prestigious names from resumes and making internships a lesser requirement.

The experiments didn't include race as a factor, so findings may differ if race had been the focus instead of socioeconomic

disadvantages, Goya-Tocchetto noted. Prior research has shown that learning about racial inequity can lead to defensiveness among white conservatives. Conservative participants in the current research were more likely to believe that merit-based hiring and promotion were fair in general, but they adjusted their fairness perceptions after learning about socioeconomic disparities.

While programs addressing racial diversity have been polarizing, focusing on socioeconomic disadvantages in workforce diversity programs may avoid political backlash and still help increase racial diversity, Goya-Tocchetto suggested. Members of marginalized racial groups often experience socioeconomic disadvantages more frequently than privileged racial groups, and the negative consequences can be worse for racial minorities. "Focusing on socioeconomic considerations could garner more support and still help address racial inequality."

Hiring managers should learn about the effects of socioeconomic inequalities on access to opportunities and consider a broader range of work experience when evaluating different candidates, Goya-Tocchetto recommended.



Humans have synced their calendars to the sun and moon for centuries, but every so often, these systems need a little correction.

You may be used to hearing that it takes the Earth 365 days to make a full lap, but that journey actually lasts about 365 and a quarter days. Leap years help to keep the 12-month calendar matched up with Earth's movement around the Sun.

After four years, those leftover hours add up to a whole day. In a leap year, we add this extra day to the month of February, making it 29 days long instead of the usual 28.

The idea of an annual catch-up dates back to ancient Rome, where people had a calendar with 355 days instead of 365 because it was based on cycles and phases of the Moon. They noticed that their calendar was getting out of sync with the seasons, so they began adding an extra month, which they called Mercedonius, every two years to catch up with the missing days.

In the year 45 B.C.E., Roman emperor Julius Caesar introduced a solar calendar, based on one developed in Egypt. Every four years, February received an extra day to keep the calendar in line with the Earth's journey around the Sun. In honor of Caesar, this system is still known as the Julian calendar.

But that wasn't the last tweak. As time went on, people realized that the Earth's journey wasn't exactly 365.25 days – it actually took 365.24219 days, which is about 11 minutes less. So adding a whole day every four years was actually a little



more correction than was needed.

In 1582, Pope Gregory XIII signed an order that made a small adjustment. There would still be a leap year every four years, except in "century" years – years divisible by 100, like 1700 or 2100 – unless they were also divisible by 400. It might sound a bit like a puzzle, but this adjustment made the calendar even more accurate – and from that point on, it was known as the Gregorian calendar.

What if we didn't have leap years?

If the calendar didn't make that small correction every four years, it would gradually fall out of alignment with the seasons. Over centuries, this could lead to the solstices and equinoxes occurring at different times than expected. Winter

weather might develop in what the calendar showed as summer, and farmers could become confused about when to plant their seeds.

Other calendars around the world have their own ways of keeping time. The Jewish calendar, which is regulated by both the Moon and the Sun, is like a big puzzle with a 19-year cycle. Every now and then, it adds a leap month to make sure that special celebrations happen at just the right time.

The Islamic calendar is even more unique. It follows the phases of the Moon and doesn't add extra days. Since a lunar year is only about 355 days long, key dates on the Islamic calendar move 10 to 11 days earlier each year on the solar calendar.

For example, Ramadan, the Islamic month of fasting, falls in the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. In 2024, it will run from March 11 to April 9; in 2025, it will occur from March 1-29; and in 2026, it will be celebrated from Feb. 18 to March 19.

Learning from the planets

Astronomy originated as a way to make sense of our daily lives, linking the events around us to celestial phenomena. The concept of leap years exemplifies how, from early ages, humans found order in conditions that seemed chaotic.

Simple, unsophisticated but effective tools, born from creative ideas of ancient astronomers and visionaries, provided the first glimpses into understanding the nature that envelops us. Some ancient methods, such as astrometry and lists of astronomical objects, persist even today, revealing the timeless essence of our quest to understand nature.

People who do research in physics and astronomy, the field that I study, are inherently curious about the workings of the universe and our origins. This work is exciting, and also extremely humbling; it constantly shows that in the grand scheme, our lives occupy a mere second in the vast expanse of space and time – even in leap years when we add that extra day.





'I hope for a happy family'

In 2013, in a round table with Rajeev Masand, Deepika was asked what she would be doing if not for acting. She replied, "If I was not an actor, I don't know what I would've been doing. But hopefully with some children around. Three little kids scuttling about. Hopefully, be working enough to take them to shoots, have a happy family. And at the same time, still doing what I'm doing."

'It's Deepika's call'

Deepika and Ranveer met on the sets of *Goliyon Ki Rasleela Ram-Leela* in 2013 and got married in Italy in 2018. Soon after their marriage, Ranveer attended the India Economic Conclave where he was asked about having children. He said, "It's not my call really. Partly yes, it's my call but mostly it's just her and I allow her that. I allow her to make most of the decisions because she is better at everything. I have no qualms in admitting that she is a much more mature, much more evolved person than me."

'We're focused on our careers'

In 2019 there were rumours that Deepika was pregnant and the actor spoke to Hindustan Times about how 'sad' it is that society puts such pressure on people. "I think it's sad that society kind of puts itself and people in this rut that okay you are dating for so long *toh shaadi kab hogi, shaadi ke baad bacche* (when will you marry, after marriage it's kids) and then grandchildren. I'm not surprised (by the rumours), we're not surprised by it at all," she said, adding, "Do we intent on having children? Of course we do, we



both love kids. But do we intend to have children anytime soon? Absolutely not! We're too selfishly focused on our careers, and I don't think having kids at this point would be fair. We're not even thinking about kids."

'I'll have kids in 2-3 years'

Two years after Deepika's statement though it looked like the couple was ready for kids because Ranveer shared his excitement in 2021 on his TV show The Big Picture. He said, "As you guys know I am married and may have kids in next two or three years. Bro, your sister-in-law (Deepika) was such a cute baby. I see her baby photos every day and tell her, give me one baby like this one, my life will be set."

'We look forward to it'

Deepika spoke to Vogue Singapore in January this year about how it's easy to get carried away with the fame and money in the film industry. "In this industry, it's easy to get carried away by fame and money. But no one treats me like a celebrity at home. I am a daughter and a sister first. I don't want that to change. My family keeps me grounded and Ranveer and I hope to inculcate the same values in our children."

When asked if this means they'll be parents soon, she added, "Absolutely. Ranveer and I love children. We look forward to the day we will start our own family."




Why do we heartily welcome such an initiative?

Indian supervision on philosophy with a profound encompassing vision spares us from Western-style hair-splitting debates over the most trivial topics that give the illusion of being learned.

Authority and Order

The hallmark of good governance when it comes to public order is to take necessary measures without concern for the potential noise they may stir among political opponents or in the columns of the press. The former are inclined to seize any opportunity to justify their relevance. As for the latter,

they see themselves as the guardians of democracy, ready to cry wolf at every turn.

In the neighborhood shop and casual conversations, the political chatter that occupies the pundits and weekly press conferences boils down to "One Seat for Five" (Un fauteuil pour Cinq), meaning seasoned contenders vying for the prime ministerial seat. The concerns that occupy the minds of the people are the same as elsewhere. The Mauritian public is well-connected to the world, understanding the deep-rooted causes of the high cost of living without succumbing to demagoguery. This global phenomenon leaves little room for manoeuvre for the government of any country.

However, it would be desirable for the authorities in Mauritius not to skimp on means to maintain public order, unlike in large democratic countries where not only the standard of living is declining,

but the authorities hesitate to take action against those who unleash violence on the police and have made the vandalizing of public property a favourite sport. Sometimes strikes invade public spaces, sometimes mass protests take hostage the functioning of major cities, and sometimes young people, often of foreign origin, turn violently against the police.

The laxity of major democracies is condemnable as it reflects the abdication of the leaders in ensuring public safety. A resignation that goes by the name of the influence of woke ideology, which categorizes aggressors in all directions as victims while sticking the labels of racist and fascist on the foreheads of their targets and anyone who dares to denounce them. It's fortunate for Mauritius that certain highly volatile groups hesitate to take that step because the public won't play along.
