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Audit Report: A Call for Meaningful Reform

Every year, the Director of Audit releases a report that draws considerable public attention, and rightly so. It serves as a stark reminder of how public funds are managed or mismanaged within various government departments. Unfortunately, this annual exercise seems to be a ritualized process, generating noise upon its release only to fade into oblivion until the following year's report emerges with familiar criticisms and failings in resource allocation and management.

This year's report follows suit, spotlighting a litany of deficiencies that have caught the attention of government auditors. From poor planning, to cost overruns and project delays, from inadequate timing to failures in essential service delivery, the litany of issues highlighted is both extensive and disheartening. Despite significant financial allocations – exemplified by the earmarking of approximately Rs 178 billion for the financial year 2022-2023 – essential service projects are stuck because of government bureaucracy. For instance, a staggering 86% of drainage projects entrusted to the National Development Unit remained unrealized during the cited financial year, exacerbating issues such as flooding that pose grave threats to public safety.

The ramifications of such delays extend beyond mere inconveniences. Delays often translate into ballooning costs, as adjustments made along the way inflate project budgets, burdening taxpayers with the weight of financial mismanagement. The notion that contractors would absorb such increased costs is a fallacy; instead, these costs are inevitably passed on to public sector agencies, further straining already stretched resources. Such cost overruns not only defy the principles of fiscal prudence but also betray a fundamental disregard for the public interest.

While the Director dutifully highlights deficiencies, and often makes pleas and recommendations, the onus lies on individual government departments to heed these warnings and take corrective action. Yet, the perennial recurrence of similar issues begs the question: why do we continue to tread the same path of inefficiency and mismanagement?

The root causes of these systemic failures are manifold, ranging from weaknesses in expenditure control to deficiencies in project and asset management. Despite audits flagging these issues year after year, progress remains elusive, with a mere 33% of identified problems resolved over the past three financial years. This inertia speaks volumes about the prevailing culture of complacency within our public institutions.

There was a time when the mention of an

impending Auditor's visit would mobilise all and sundry before and after. Why are we here today, when a combination of inertia, sloth, back scratching and bungling incompetencies of some throw dispute over the whole system, without any determined effort to root out the rot?

At its core, this is not merely a matter of bureaucratic red tape or administrative oversight; it is a reflection of deeper systemic flaws that permeate our public sector governance structures. The absence of well-directed sanctions for "dereliction of duty" fosters a culture of impunity, where accountability becomes a mere afterthought rather than a guiding principle.

Has an implicit acceptance of some 10% of waste become the new normal? One might add that managers in private sector dinosaurs would face some tough questions at such unacceptable tolerance levels. Productive sectors of the economy must watch disconsolately at the regular, unregulated, gargantuan inefficiencies which they, as all consumers and taxpayers, are forced to fund.

Meaningful reform is imperative to break free from this cycle of apathy and inefficiency. Accountability mechanisms must be strengthened, with clear lines of responsibility delineated to ensure that individuals and units are held answerable for their actions – or inactions. Good governance practices, including transparency, accountability, and adherence to established protocols, must be ingrained into the fabric of our public institutions. But clearly, the bulldog must have some teeth, without which the annual audit would remain the proverbial myth of Sisyphus.

Reform efforts must therefore extend beyond mere rhetoric to tangible action. Concrete steps, such as the implementation of robust monitoring and evaluation mechanisms, the establishment of clear performance metrics, and the adoption of international best practices in financial management, are essential to effecting real change. Some form of "dereliction of duty" must be ingrained in our governing legislation.

Ultimately, the annual audit report serves as a clarion call for reform – a stark reminder of the urgent need to overhaul our governance structures and restore public trust in our institutions. The time for idle platitudes and promises has passed; what is needed now is decisive action to address the root causes of systemic failures and usher in a new era of accountability and transparency in public administration.

Unfortunately, without a strong political will to enforce change, it's doubtful that this will happen anytime soon.

Deepfakes are still new, but 2024 could be the year they have an impact on elections

Disinformation caught many people off guard during the 2016 Brexit referendum and US presidential election. Since then, a mini-industry has developed to analyse and counter it.

Yet despite that, we have entered 2024 – a year of more than 40 elections worldwide – more fearful than ever about disinformation. In many ways, the problem is more challenging than it was in 2016.

Advances in technology since then are one reason for that, in particular the development that has taken place with synthetic media, otherwise known as deepfakes. It is increasingly difficult to know whether media has been fabricated by a computer or is based on something that really happened.


We've yet to really understand how big an impact deepfakes could have on elections. But a number of examples point the way to how they may be used. This may be the year when lots of mistakes are made and lessons learned.

Since the disinformation propagated around the votes in 2016, researchers have produced countless books and papers, journalists have retrained as fact checking and verification experts, governments have participated in "grand committees" and centres of excellence. Additionally, libraries have become the focus of resilience building strategies and a range of new bodies has emerged to provide analysis, training, and resources.

This activity hasn't been fruitless. We now have a more nuanced understanding of disinformation as a social, psychological, political, and technological phenomenon. Efforts to support public interest journalism and the cultivation of critical thinking through education are also promising. Most notably, major tech companies no longer pretend to be neutral platforms.

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Political Alliances: Challenges and Dilemmas

In the tumultuous landscape of Mauritian politics, recent events have thrown the Labour Party-MMM-PMSD alliance into a mini-crisis. The allocation of electoral tickets among the three parties has sparked discontent, particularly within the ranks of Xavier Duval's PMSD. As the parties grapple with internal strife, external pressures from the ruling MSM alliance have added fuel to the fire.

The crux of the issue lies in the distribution of electoral tickets – the currency of power in any democracy. The PMSD feels slighted, receiving a mere eight tickets compared to the Labour Party's dominant 35 and the MMM's 17. This perceived imbalance has ignited internal dissent within the PMSD, creating fertile ground for the machinations of the ruling MSM party and leading to widespread rumours suggesting that financiers affiliated with the MSM are trying to persuade members of the PMSD to leave the alliance. A tempting offer of 12 tickets and the promise of the Deputy Prime Minister position in a future MSM-PMSD government has been dangled before them.

Amidst this political manoeuvring, Xavier Duval faces a daunting dilemma. His dissatisfaction with the current alliance allocation clashes with the prospect of joining forces with the MSM-led alliance. Duval's past resignation from an MSM-led government over democratic principles further complicates matters. How can he justify a potential alliance shift to his electorate, given his previous stance against the MSM? Will his electorate swallow such a turnabout?

Furthermore, the question of electoral prospects looms large. Would joining forces with the MSM-led alliance increase the chances of electoral success? Or does the Labour Party-MMM-PMSD alliance hold greater promise? The stakes are high, and the decision weighs heavily on Duval and his party.

As the parties grapple with these challenges, the spectre of early elections looms large. Any departure from the alliance could prompt the Prime Minister to seize the opportunity and call for elections sooner than anticipated. The political landscape is fraught with uncertainty, and every move is scrutinized for its potential impact.

Amidst the chaos, one thing remains clear: forming a feasible and lasting alliance is no easy task. Beyond mere agreement on a common government

programme, issues of ticket allocation, high-level appointments, and ideological alignment must be handled delicately. All parties must be satisfied that they have received a fair deal, lest internal discord threaten the stability of the alliance.

In the coming days, as political negotiations unfold and decisions are made, the future of Mauritian politics hangs in the balance. The choices made now will shape the course of the nation for years to come, and the stakes could not be higher.

Why Politics bring out the Worst in Us

Tap into any social media platform, turn on the television or cue up a podcast, and it is easy to find examples of hypocrisy or bad behaviour in political discourse

Politics has long been known as a realm where civility often takes a back seat to conflict, where moral high ground becomes a slippery slope,

and where the line between right and wrong blurs into shades of gray. Recent research from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln sheds light on why this may be the case, uncovering a troubling trend of moral flexibility and ethical compromise within the political arena.

The study, conducted by political scientists Kyle Hull, Kevin Smith, and Clarris Warren, surveyed over 2,400 adults to explore the relationship between personal morals and political behaviour. What they found was both revealing and

disconcerting: people are more willing to bend their morals and engage in unethical behaviour when it comes to politics, driven primarily by hostility toward opposing groups.

“It's as if politics has a transformative effect on our moral compass,” explains Hull, a visiting assistant professor in political science. “When individuals enter the political realm, they become more willing to justify behaviours and judgments that they would find unacceptable in their personal lives.”

This shift in moral judgment was evident across various demographics, regardless of age or ideological orientation. The survey compared responses to non-political and political moral behaviour scales, revealing a notable discrepancy in the standards applied to personal versus political conduct. Even minor changes in wording, such as substituting “person” with “politician,” were enough to elicit more lenient moral assessments.

Perhaps most troubling is the finding that individuals are more forgiving of moral transgressions committed by politicians they favour, akin to the leniency granted to a friend. This bias in moral judgment underscores the deeply entrenched tribalism that characterizes modern politics, where loyalty to one's party or ideology often trumps ethical considerations.

“In today's polarized political landscape, we see the harmful consequences of outrage politics,” observes Hull. “Internalized animosity toward the opposing party fuels a willingness to compromise one's moral principles and tolerate behaviour that would otherwise be deemed unacceptable.”

Indeed, the study paints a sobering picture of the corrosive effects of political tribalism on moral integrity. As Smith, the Olson Professor of Political Science, notes, “Politics seems to make bastards of us all.” The polarization and demonization of opposing groups perpetuated by politicians and the media only serve to exacerbate this phenomenon, creating a vicious cycle of moral degradation.

The implications of these findings are profound, pointing to a pressing need for greater introspection and accountability within the political sphere. If politics is indeed a breeding ground for moral compromise, then it falls upon individuals and institutions alike to resist the allure of tribalism and uphold the principles of integrity and ethical conduct.

Les élections de 2024 à travers le monde sont confrontées à une menace croissante et sophistiquée: les "deepfakes" audio IA (supports audio IA truqués) générés par l'intelligence artificielle. L'émergence de cette technologie a déjà eu un impact significatif sur plusieurs scrutins à travers le monde.

Cette montée en puissance des "deepfakes" audio soulève des préoccupations majeures quant à leur utilisation potentielle pour manipuler les élections et perturber les processus démocratiques. Les électeurs sont de plus en plus confrontés à la difficulté de distinguer les contenus audio authentiques des faux générés par des algorithmes de l'IA.

Cette menace est d'autant plus préoccupante que la technologie derrière les «deepfakes» continue de s'améliorer, rendant leur détection de plus en plus difficile. Selon Rowan Philp du «Global Investigative Journalism Network», les défis auxquels sont confrontés les enquêteurs pour identifier et enquêter sur ces manipulations, ainsi que les façons dont les «deepfakes» audio sont utilisés dans différents contextes électoraux à travers le monde sont nombreux.

En octobre 2023, une imitation de la voix d'un leader de l'opposition, synthétisée par l'IA, a contribué à faire pencher l'élection en Slovaquie en faveur d'un candidat pro-Russe.

Un autre faux audio IA a été superposé à un véritable clip vidéo d'un candidat au Pakistan, appelant supposément les électeurs à boycotter les élections générales de février 2024.

À l'approche des élections au Bangladesh en janvier, plusieurs faux créés avec des générateurs d'IA commerciaux bon marché ont gagné en popularité auprès des électeurs en diffamant les candidats rivaux du Premier ministre en place.

Et aux États-Unis, un extrait audio se faisant passer pour la voix du président Joe Biden exhortait les électeurs à ne pas voter lors de l'élection primaire d'un État clé.

Ces exemples ne sont que la pointe de l'iceberg d'une tendance inquiétante qui pourrait avoir des répercussions profondes sur la démocratie mondiale. Les experts s'accordent à dire que les "deepfakes" audio IA pourraient représenter une menace encore plus grande que les vidéos fabriquées. Ces faux audio, dans lesquels une voix réelle est clonée par un outil d'apprentissage automatique pour énoncer un message faux, sont plus faciles et moins coûteux à produire que leurs homologues vidéo. Cette facilité de création les rend particulièrement attrayants pour les acteurs malveillants qui cherchent à manipuler les électeurs. Les "deepfakes" audio peuvent être utilisés dans des appels automatisés ciblant les électeurs les plus vulnérables, et leur origine peut être difficile à retracer, créant ainsi un véritable défi pour les enquêteurs et les journalistes.

Mais comment pouvons-nous identifier et enquêter sur ces "deepfakes" audio IA? Selon Olga Yurkova, formatrice en journalisme et cofondatrice de StopFake.org, ces faux sont difficiles à détecter à l'œil nu en raison du manque d'indices contextuels. De plus, les outils de génération vocale sont plus avancés que jamais, rendant l'analyse encore plus complexe. Cependant, malgré ces défis, il est crucial que les médias et les citoyens soient vigilants et équipés pour contrer cette menace émergente.

Les organisations de vérification des faits et les ONGs pro-démocratie jouent un rôle essentiel dans la lutte contre les "deepfakes" audio IA. Des projets tels que le pro-

gramme de réponse rapide aux "deepfakes" de WITNESS mobilisent des experts pour analyser les contenus suspects et fournir des informations précieuses aux citoyens et aux médias.

Cependant, ces efforts ne suffisent pas à eux seuls. Il est également essentiel que les gouvernements et les plateformes technologiques prennent des mesures pour réglementer et limiter la propagation de ces faux audio.

En fin de compte, la lutte contre les "deepfakes" audio IA est une bataille pour la vérité et l'intégrité des processus démocratiques. Alors que nous entrons dans l'année des élections de 2024, il est temps pour les gouvernements, les médias et les citoyens de s'unir pour contrer cette menace croissante. En investissant dans la recherche, la formation et la sensibilisation du public, nous pouvons espérer préserver la démocratie et protéger les fondements de nos sociétés libres et ouvertes.

En ce qui concerne l'île Maurice, les

élections de 2019 ont été marquées par des allégations selon lesquelles des experts étrangers en informatique et l'intelligence artificielle auraient été enrôlés par le parti au pouvoir pour "faciliter" l'élection de ses candidats. Cette situation souligne l'importance de prendre au sérieux la menace des "deepfakes" audio IA lors des scrutins électoraux. Sans céder à la paranoïa, les leçons tirées de cette expérience doivent servir à renforcer la vigilance et la préparation des institutions mauriciennes mais aussi des partis politiques en vue des élections futures.

Il est impératif que les autorités électorales, les médias et la société civile travaillent ensemble pour mettre en place des mécanismes de détection et de contrôle efficaces pour prévenir toute tentative de manipulation électorale à l'aide de "deepfakes" audio et, ainsi, se protéger contre cette menace émergente tout en préservant l'intégrité des processus démocratiques.

Le Roi de Malaisie offre du miel au chef de la Commission anti-corruption

Après deux mois au pouvoir, le Roi de Malaisie, Ibrahim Iskandar, a fait passer son message selon lequel sa phase de "lune de miel" de gouvernance était terminée - avec un pot de la substance sucrée et collante tant aimée de tous.

Le monarque a offert le miel au chef de la Commission anti-corruption de Malaisie, Azam Baki, lundi dernier, lors d'une réunion de trente minutes au palais national, selon la publication Facebook du roi. Il a réitéré que la lutte contre la corruption serait l'une de ses priorités tout au long de son règne, rapporte Bloomberg.

"Comme je l'ai dit précédemment,

ma lune de miel est terminée, maintenant allez chasser les abeilles," a déclaré le Roi Ibrahim à Azam en lui présentant le cadeau, qu'il a dit symboliser la fin de la phase. Le monarque avait déclaré en mars qu'il commencerait son "véritable mode de gouvernance" une fois que son règne aurait atteint les deux mois.

Le Roi Ibrahim, originaire de l'État le plus au sud de Johor, a pris le trône fin janvier dans le cadre d'une monarchie constitutionnelle unique où neuf royaux des États se succèdent pour des mandats de cinq ans. Le rôle du roi, bien que principalement cérémoniel, est devenu de plus en plus important pour déterminer qui détient le pouvoir dans la nation d'Asie du Sud-Est, où les Premiers ministres occupent le poste en moyenne depuis moins de deux ans depuis 2018.

Avant son accession au trône, le roi avait partagé ses projets visant à lutter contre la corruption et avait proposé que la Commission malaisienne de lutte contre la corruption (MACC) lui rende directement des comptes.

Les autorités anti-corruption ont ordonné en janvier aux deux fils aînés de Mahathir Mohamad de déclarer leurs avoirs remontant à 1981, année où leur père est devenu Premier ministre.

Les fils ont déclaré le mois dernier que la MACC leur avait ordonné d'aider à une enquête sur leur père, révélant pour la première fois qu'une enquête de plusieurs mois ciblait l'ancien Premier ministre âgé de 98 ans. L'agence enquête également sur Daim Zainuddin, un ancien ministre des Finances et proche collaborateur de Mahathir.

Il est intéressant de noter que Maurice et Rodrigues produisent également du miel de bonne qualité, et il pourrait être judicieux de faire don de miel aux autorités anti-corruption ici. D'autant plus que la performance de l'ICAC et sa gestion d'un grand nombre d'affaires de haut niveau sont sous le feu des projecteurs depuis de nombreuses années – et même sous le gouvernement précédent.

La liste des affaires où l'on ne sait toujours pas où en sont ses enquêtes est longue et ne cesse de s'allonger telles que

- le scandale Dufry (2015);
- le scandale Alvaro Sobrinho (2018);
- le scandale de la surévaluation excessive par rapport à la valeur du terrain du Sugar Insurance Fund Board (2018);
- le scandale Yerrigadoo/Bet 365 (2018);
- l'affaire Glen Agliotti (2019),
- l'affaire Serenity Gate/Film Rebate Scheme (2019), et
- le projet de revalorisation de la centrale électrique de St Louis.

Toutes ces enquêtes en suspens soulignent l'absence d'une agence d'investigation crédible et respectée capable de traiter les crimes en col blanc de manière indépendante de la proximité politique.

Moscou endeuillée : L'attaque terroriste du 22 mars et ses ramifications géopolitiques

En un claquement de doigts, la vie nocturne animée de Moscou s'est transformée en une scène de chaos et de carnage. Le 22 mars 2024, un concert de rock à la salle Crocus City Hall a été le théâtre d'une attaque terroriste dévastatrice. Quatre hommes armés ont ouvert le feu sur la foule, faisant 144 morts et de nombreux blessés. Cet acte de violence marque l'attaque la plus meurtrière en Russie depuis près de deux décennies et constitue un nouveau défi brutal pour la sécurité mondiale, selon Dr Rashmini Koparkar, Professeur Assistant, École des Études Internationales, JNU. Explications:

Retour sur un drame annoncé

La Russie n'est pas étrangère au terrorisme. En 2004, la prise d'école à Beslan avait déjà endeuillé le pays avec près de 300 victimes. Plus récemment, l'attentat à la bombe perpétré par l'État islamique (EI) contre un avion de ligne russe en Égypte en 2015 (224 morts) et l'attaque suicide d'un étudiant radicalisé dans le métro de Saint-Pétersbourg en 2017 (11 morts) rappelaient la menace constante qui pèse sur le territoire.

Le timing de l'attaque de Moscou n'est pas fortuit. Elle intervient seulement quatre jours après la réélection de Vladimir Poutine à la présidence pour un cinquième mandat. L'EI a ciblé la Russie à maintes reprises, dénonçant l'oppression présumée des musulmans et le soutien russe au régime syrien de Bachar al-Assad.

Le fil conducteur tadjik

Les autorités russes ont rapidement identifié les quatre assaillants comme étant originaires du Tadjikistan, un pays d'Asie centrale à majorité musulmane. Cette nation enclavée est en proie à des difficultés économiques importantes, forçant une partie de sa jeunesse à l'émigration, notamment vers la Russie. Ce contexte social fragile est exploité par l'EI, qui a recruté de nombreux combati-

tants tadjiks pour ses opérations au Moyen-Orient.

L'attaque de Moscou a mis en lumière le lien dangereux entre la pauvreté, l'instabilité politique et la radicalisation en Asie centrale. La branche régionale de l'EI, État islamique - Khorasan (ISIS-K), est apparue récemment et a attiré de nombreux militants d'autres groupes terroristes comme Al-Qaïda et les Talibans. La prise de pouvoir des Talibans en Afghanistan en 2021 a encore fragilisé la situation dans la région, d'autant plus que le Tadjikistan partage une frontière sur une longue distance avec ce pays.

Un casse-tête géopolitique

L'attaque de Moscou a également des implications cruciales pour la Russie. Déjà engagée dans une guerre difficile en Ukraine, la Russie doit désormais faire face à une menace accrue sur son propre sol. Les accusations mutuelles fusent entre la Russie et l'Occident. Alors que les États-Unis affirment avoir averti la Russie d'une attaque potentielle, Moscou accuse l'Ukraine et l'Occident de soutenir les terroristes.

Cette tension accrue ne fait qu'isoler davantage la Russie sur la scène internationale et complique la lutte contre le terrorisme, qui nécessite une coopération à l'échelle mon-

diale.

La présence de travailleurs migrants tadjiks en Russie, estimés à 3 millions de personnes, crée un autre point de tension. Ces travailleurs jouent un rôle vital dans l'économie russe, mais ils sont souvent confrontés à des conditions de vie difficiles et à la discrimination, ce qui les rend plus vulnérables aux discours extrémistes.

Une vigilance accrue nécessaire

L'attaque de Moscou est un cruel rappel de la menace permanente du terrorisme. Pour relever ce défi, il est crucial de comprendre les racines du problème. La pauvreté, l'instabilité politique et l'absence de perspectives d'avenir pour les jeunes constituent autant de terreaux fertiles pour la radicalisation.

La communauté internationale doit agir de concert pour promouvoir la stabilité économique et politique en Asie centrale. La Russie, de son côté, doit adopter une approche plus inclusive envers les travailleurs migrants et lutter contre la discrimination. La coopération internationale en matière de renseignement et de lutte antiterroriste est également essentielle pour identifier et démanteler les réseaux terroristes avant qu'ils ne passent à l'acte.

L'économie européenne face aux défis chinois, russes et américains

Analyse et implications pour l'île Maurice

L'économie européenne, traditionnellement un moteur de la croissance mondiale, traverse une période d'une rare turbulence. L'article du 2 avril 2024 de «The Economist», intitulé "L'Économie Européenne Sous Attaque de Toutes Parts," brosse un tableau inquiétant d'un continent aux prises avec un "ouragan parfait" de vents contraires économiques et géopolitiques. Examinons en détail les trois principales menaces auxquelles l'Europe est confrontée et leurs implications potentiellement désastreuses.

1. La montée en puissance de la Chine

conomie mondiale. Les barrières commerciales se sont effritées, et les fabricants occidentaux ont dû faire face à


une concurrence accrue de la part des entreprises chinoises à bas prix. L'Europe a relativement bien résisté à ce premier choc, en partie grâce à l'expansion de l'UE vers l'Est. Cependant, la montée en puissance actuelle de la Chine est d'un tout autre ordre.

Sous la direction de Xi Jinping, la Chine ne se contente plus simplement de produire des biens de consommation à bas prix. Elle investit massivement dans les technologies de pointe et cherche à devenir un leader mondial dans des secteurs critiques tels que la robotique industrielle et les équipements ferroviaires. Cela représente une menace existentielle pour les industries manufacturières européennes, déjà fragilisées par des coûts de production plus élevés.

De plus, la Chine subventionne généreusement ses propres industries, faussant ainsi le jeu de la concurrence. L'Union européenne, attachée aux règles du commerce international, hésite à prendre des mesures de rétorsion.

How Credible are Global Ranking Indices?

How seriously should we, lay people, take the country rankings that are published periodical- ly? For example, the Mo Ibrahim Index which applies to the African region has a number of times placed Mauritius at No. 1 for the parameters that it considers. That obviously elates politicians, in particular the government of the day which takes the credit for that apparent achievement. However, for most people who go about their daily lives oblivious of such rankings, the social, economic, political, and institutional realities often seem to be in contradic- tion to these glorifying labels. Great to be numero uno, but how does this impact the overall living conditions and environment?

Conversely, does a drop in ranking truly reflect the ground reality? This is a question that is currently of interest in India which is shortly to have its general election, and which is being 'watched' with as much interest by the rest of the world – as was the recent Russian general election, and so too will be the coming US general election due in November.

A clue is provided in an April 2019 publication by Dr Essam Disi Director - Strategy & Policy at Mohammed Bin Rashid Est. for SME Development (DUBAI SME). He wrote: 'A lot of these rankings are based on solid methodologies and supported by reputable organizations. In some cases, the parameters of the rankings are based on hard data or facts, such as, number of steps to register a business or cost of a certain transaction. On the other hand, *in many other cases the parameters are based on surveys circulated among a small number of "Experts" to rate and provide their feedback. However, what happens if these "Experts" were biased? or if it was in their interest to push their country's ranking up the list?*' (italics added)

Extending this line of thinking in the opposite direction, what if 'Experts' assessing another country were biased against it, in which case that country's ranking would likely drop, isn't it? Or, even if they were neutral, there are methodological limitations that can come in the way of assigning proper ranking. This is spelt out in an Ipsos survey of trustworthiness of different professions carried out in May-June 2023. I should be happy because doctors are ranked highest!

But the point I am making is about methodology, and this is what the Ipsos site comments: 'These are the findings of a 31-country survey conducted by Ipsos on its Global Advisor online platform and, in India, on its IndiaBus platform between 26 May and 9 June 2023. The results are comprised of an international sample of 22,816 adults...'

As far as India is concerned the sample 'represents a large subset of its urban population...' (italics added). The concluding remark is that 'The Global Country Average reflects the average result for all the countries and markets in which the survey was conducted. It has

not been adjusted to the population size of each country or market and is not intended to suggest a total result.' Since a large segment of India's population is rural, it is clear therefore that the result of this survey does not give a true picture of the Indian situation in regard to trustworthiness of professions.

Such considerations are a matter of concern for Indian analysts, among whom is Sanjeev Sanyal, Member of the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, whose views are frequently sought given his key position. He has said, for example, that 'It is important to have clear benchmarks to measure socioeconomic progress. However, a blanket application of global standards in India does not always present the true picture.'

Speaking at the launch of the Sovereign Risk Assessment Framework by CareEdge Ratings last year, he said that 'India should be confident enough to deconstruct the rest of the world on its own terms as a rising economic power, creating global norms and benchmarks in various fields,' and 'should no longer be bound by benchmarks that are decided by third parties, and in which the country has no role in framing.'

Further, 'For the very first time, an Indian rating agency (NB: CareEdge Ratings) will assign sovereign ratings to the rest of the world... This is an important thing for us as a rising economic power to get used to doing. All this while, we allowed other people to deconstruct us; it's time we get confident enough to deconstruct the rest of the world on our terms,' adding that the country also needs to come up with global norms in various other

fields like medical benchmarks and Environmental, Social & Governance (ESG) standards.'

Anyone who has been involved in designing and conducting surveys, for example, knows that leading questions can be framed to suit the agenda of a survey. This is especially the case when the 'soft' social sciences are concerned, as opposed to the 'hard' physical sciences when more tangible variables, such as temperature, humidity, etc., are being measured. And reports and experts too can reflect bias. This is the reason that of late some UN reports are no longer looked up to as they used to be earlier.

A more comprehensive and detailed analysis on this theme is to be found in an article by the Chief Editor of MyIndMakers, Ramaharitha Pusarla, in its Current Affairs section on Apr 01, 2024, titled 'The Pretense is Shed; Puppet Masters of Vested Interests Coming out of the Woods.'

She points out how 'India has been a playground for foreign players... external agencies forged connections with influential media, academic, social and political organisations of democratic India.' Moreover, vested interests in cahoots with external agencies have rolled out concerted attempts to vitiate India, its polity, and its democracy with international media under its fold. Resultantly, *India began to suddenly slip in all rankings ranging from Poverty Index through Happiness Index to even Democratic Index* (italics added), ... notwithstanding the stable and steady development enabling environment.

The unabashed bias became so glaring that the common man began to mock the Western aptitude of giving a better rank to Palestine and Afghanistan, the seedbeds of terrorism as much happier places to live than India. According to the World Happiness Report, India is at 126th position among the 146 countries below its neighbours - Nepal, Bangladesh, and China. The Varieties of Democracy (V-Dem) reports placed India among the top ten autocracies deeming it an "electoral autocracy". The sudden fall of India in all these indices from 2013 is glaring.

'The Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU) which relies on the annual reports of US-based think tanks like Freedom House, Pew Research, Human Rights Watch, and Reporters Sans Frontières termed India a "Flawed Democracy".'

With reason, she queries the sudden interest of the US, Germany and lo and behold - even the UN! - in the arrest of the sitting Chief Minister of New Delhi in a mega liquor scam. He has now been jailed in Tihar jail where two of his other Cabinet ministers have been imprisoned for the same matter since several months, having been repeatedly refused bail. It's the same judiciary whose rulings have been cited on a number of occasions by our own political class to support some stand or the other they took.

She points out how 'India is now going full guns blazing against the Western hypocrisy reminding them of the cardinal rules of diplomacy and vociferously questioning the Western precedent of judging countries as their imperial moral compass.' She condemns this 'brazen interference of the West in the internal affairs of a sovereign country' which is 'uncalled for and reeks of unjustifiable moral constabulary.'

When it comes to rankings coming from external agencies, therefore, one has to take them with not a pinch but a *kalchul* of salt! And that too *gros dile!*

Aujourd'hui, plusieurs observateurs pensent que l'existence de la démocratie, telle que nous la connaissons, est menacée. Parmi les critiques les plus fréquentes, il y a l'indifférence du peuple mauricien qui ne semble pas vouloir se mobiliser pour apporter les transformations nécessaires dans le paysage politique. Why is Taiwan prone to earthquakes yet well-prepared to endure them?

Taiwan is no stranger to formidable earthquakes, yet their impact on the island's 23 million residents has remained relatively contained. On Wednesday, Taiwan was struck by its most potent earthquake in a quarter of a century, resulting in at least nine fatalities, hundreds of injuries, structural damage to buildings and highways, and disruptions in train services.

Taiwan's susceptibility to earthquakes is attributed to its location along the Pacific "Ring of Fire," a zone of seismic activity encircling the Pacific Ocean where the majority of the world's earthquakes occur. This vulnerability stems from the accumulation of tension between two tectonic plates, the Philippine Sea Plate and the Eurasian Plate, often resulting in sudden seismic releases.

The island's rugged terrain exacerbates ground shaking, leading to landslides, as evidenced by several incidents near the epicenter of Wednesday's quake in eastern Hualien County. Falling debris from landslides struck tunnels and highways, causing fatalities and vehicle destruction.

How prepared is Taiwan for earthquakes?

Despite Wednesday's earthquake measuring 7.2 according to Taiwan's seismic monitoring agency (or 7.4 according to the U.S. Geological Survey) and causing damage in Hualien, Taipei experienced minimal losses despite strong tremors.

Taiwan's earthquake preparedness is lauded globally, with stringent building codes, a sophisticated seismological network, and widespread public education campaigns on earthquake safety. The government continually updates quake resistance standards for buildings, albeit at potentially higher construction costs, and offers subsidies for residents to assess their buildings' quake resistance.

In the aftermath of a 2016 quake in Tainan, which caused a high-rise apartment building to collapse, resulting in numerous casualties, individuals involved in

the building's construction were convicted of negligence.

Taiwan also emphasizes earthquake drills in schools and workplaces, with public media and cellphones regularly disseminating earthquake alerts and safety advisories.

These measures have significantly bolstered Taiwan's resilience to earthquakes, mitigating potential catastrophic damage and loss of life, according to experts.

Coping with earthquakes

Since 1980, Taiwan and its environs have experienced approximately 2,000 earthquakes with a magnitude of 4.0 or higher, including over 100 quakes surpassing magnitude 5.5, according to USGS data.

The most devastating recent earthquake struck on Sept. 21, 1999, with a magnitude of 7.7, resulting in 2,400 fatalities, around 100,000 injuries, and widespread destruction.

The last significant quake in Hualien County occurred in 2018, causing the collapse of a historic hotel and other structures.

Seismic activity is anticipated to persist for millions of years, underscoring the imperative of preparedness and resilience against ongoing seismic hazards.

Surge in temporary immigrants beyond Canada's capacity to 'absorb': Trudeau

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau acknowledged on Tuesday that the surge in temporary immigrants to the country was "beyond" what it was "able to absorb" and said his government wanted to get those numbers down.

"Over the past few years, we've seen a massive spike in temporary immigration whether its temporary foreign workers or whether its international students, in particular, that have grown at a rate far beyond what Canada has been able to absorb," he said, adding that in 2017, the percentage of the overall population comprising temporary immigrants was just 2, but it has ballooned to 7.5% presently, reports Hindustan Times.

The jump in immigration numbers has caused a housing affordability crisis in Canada, while also impacting services and infrastructure and has contributed to the plummeting political fortunes of Trudeau and the ruling Liberal Party.

At the time Trudeau first came into office, in 2015, the number of international students totalled 219,035. That number has surged since, with 684,385 study permits issued in 2023. Similarly for temporary foreign workers, according to data from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), there were just 1,955 in 2015; in 2023, that number sharply escalated to 167,65.

Under pressure, the government has attempted to temper the numbers. On March 21, Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Minister Marc Miller announced the government's target to "decrease in our temporary residents population to 5% over the next three years."

Zimbabwe declares drought disaster amidst widespread hunger caused by El Niño

Zimbabwe declared a state of disaster Wednesday over a devastating drought that's sweeping across much of southern Africa, with the country's president saying it needs \$2 billion for humanitarian assistance.

The declaration was widely expected following similar actions by neighboring Zambia and Malawi, where drought linked to the El Niño weather phenomenon has scorched crops, leaving millions of people in need of food assistance, reports AP.

"Due to the El Niño-induced drought ... more than 80% of our country received below normal rainfall," President Emmerson Mnangagwa said in a speech calling for international aid. The country's top priority, he said, is "securing food for all Zimbabweans. No Zimbabwean must succumb to, or die from hunger."

El Niño, a naturally occurring climatic phenomenon that warms parts of the Pacific Ocean every two to seven years, has varied effects on the world's weather. In southern Africa, it typically causes below-average rainfall, but this year has seen the worst drought in decades.

The first few months of the year are traditionally known as the "lean period," when households run short as they wait for the new harvest. However, there is little hope for

replenishing food stores this year, and Mnangagwa said that even more people than previously forecast will likely need food aid.

More than 60% of Zimbabwe's 15 million people live in rural areas, growing the food they eat, and sometimes small surpluses that can be sold to cover expenses such as school fees. With relatively little participation in the cash economy, many of those won't be able to buy food even when it's available in markets.

Zimbabwe, once a regional agricultural powerhouse and grain exporter, has in recent years relied more and more on aid agencies to avert mass hunger due to extreme weather conditions such as heat

waves and floods.

Much of Southern Africa is in the throes of a food crisis due to the ongoing drought. Zambian President Hakainde Hichilema declared the current drought a national disaster in February, saying that almost half of his country's staple corn crop had been destroyed.

Less than a month later, Malawian President Lazarus Chakwera said his country needed more than \$200 million in urgent humanitarian assistance over a drought that he said has affected 2 million households in 23 of the tiny country's 28 districts.

Japan's royal family joins Instagram to engage younger audience

Japan's imperial family made an Instagram debut with a barrage of posts on Monday, hoping to shake off their reclusive image and reach out to younger people on social media.

The Imperial Household Agency, a government agency in charge of the family's affairs, posted 60 photos and five videos showing Emperor Naruhito and Empress Masako's public appearances over the past three months.

The agency said they wanted the public to have a better understanding of the family's official duties and that Instagram was chosen because of its popularity among youth, reports AP.

By Monday evening, their verified account Kunaicho_jp had more than 270,000 followers.

The first photo published was of the imperial couple sitting on a sofa with their 22-year-old daughter Princess Aiko, all smiling as they marked New Year's Day. Other postings also included the Imperial couple's meetings with foreign dignitaries, including Brunei Crown Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah his wife.

The Japanese imperial family's social media debut comes 15 years after Britain's royal family joined X, formerly Twitter, in 2009.

Naruhito's father, Emperor Emeritus Akihito — who abdicated the throne in 2019 — and his wife were popular during their reign. But the royal family's fans largely belong to older generations.

Palace officials had been considering using social media to get more people interested in the family and their activities. Last year, the agency set up a team of experts to study the effects of using social media on the imperial family.

The agency had become cautious after the Emperor's niece Mako Komuro and her commoner husband faced a severe backlash on social media and in tabloids following concerns over her mother-in-law's financial situation, causing her marriage to be delayed. She also declined to receive a dowry as the public did not fully celebrate her union.

The former princess said, at the time, she suffered psychological trauma because of the media bashing, including those online.

Ex-PM Khan and wife suspended in graft case, but they won't be released

A Pakistani appeals court on Monday suspended a 14-year prison sentence for former Prime Minister Imran Khan and his wife, Bushra Bibi, in a corruption case, but the couple won't be released because they are already serving prison terms in other cases, officials said.

However, the court order was a legal victory for Khan, who was ousted from power in a no-confidence vote in April 2022. Khan now has more than 170 legal cases hanging over him.

The Islamabad High Court suspended the sentence after hearing an appeal from their lawyer, according to Zulfiqar Bukhari, the spokesperson for Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party, reports AP.

The court ordered the release of the couple on bail but under the country's laws Khan and his wife won't be freed because Bibi is serving a prison term in another case and Khan has been convicted and sentenced in multiple cases.

The latest development came about two months after Khan and his wife were found guilty of retaining and selling state gifts in violation of government rules when he

was in power.

Khan remains popular in the country despite his conviction in multiple cases. Khan's PTI party made a strong showing in the Feb. 8 parliamentary elections but did not win a majority of the seats in the National Assembly, or lower house of the parliament, though PTI says the vote was rigged.

Indian-Americans in Congress raise red flag on hate crimes against Hindus

Citing an "alarming increase" in incidents of vandalism at Hindu temples, and suggesting that these incidents have led to "increased collective anxiety" among Hindu-Americans, five Indian-American members of the US Congress have demanded a briefing from the US Department of Justice (DOJ) about the status of investigations concerning "these crimes" and its strategy on dealing with hate crimes against Hindus, reports Hindustan Times.

This is perhaps first time that all members of the samosa caucus — the informal label the desi members use to self-identify their collective group — have raised a civil liberties issue that directly concerns the exercise of religious freedom of Hindu-Americans and hate crimes against them.

Pramila Jaypal, Ro Khanna, Raja Krishnamoorthi, Shri Thanedar and Amy Bera sent the letter to Kristen Clarke, the US assistant attorney general for the civil rights division at DOJ on Friday.

In the letter, the Congressional leaders have noted an increase in incidents of vandalism at all religious places of worship, "including at Hindu mandirs".

"Attacks at mandirs from New

ment coordination regarding these bias-motivated crimes, and they are left wondering if there is appropriate federal oversight to ensure equal protection under the law," the Indian-American leaders have said.

The leaders have also told DOJ that the "number of incidents and the closeness of the timing of incidents" raised "troubling questions about linkages and the intent behind them".

In recent years, Hindu-American groups have stepped up with their outreach on the Hill to convey their point of view both on issues within the US and on developments within India that affect them.

Over three million Hindus live in the US and there are more than 1,000 temples.

2. La guerre en Ukraine et ses répercussions

L'invasion de l'Ukraine par la Russie en 2022 a déclenché une crise énergétique majeure en Europe. Sénégal: Un président polygame et deux Premières dames, une première dans l'Histoire du pays

Le Sénégal a été le théâtre d'un événement politique historique le 24 mars 2024, avec l'élection de Bassirou Diomaye Faye à la présidence. Cette victoire a suscité une attention particulière en raison de la polygamie ouverte affichée du président, qui est apparu aux côtés de ses deux épouses, Marie et Absa, tout au long de sa campagne électorale. Cette situation sans précédent a déclenché un débat animé dans le pays, mettant en lumière la place de la polygamie dans la société sénégalaise et ses répercussions sur le rôle des Premières dames.

La professeure d'histoire Penda Mbow souligne que toutes les règles protocolaires doivent être réexaminées pour tenir compte de cette situation inédite et garantir un traitement équitable aux deux épouses du président.

Un message de transparence

Pour d'autres observateurs, Bassirou Diomaye Faye assume ouvertement sa polygamie et la présente comme un modèle de transparence. Il encourage les autres hommes polygames à suivre son exemple et à sortir de l'ombre, affirmant que cela pourrait contribuer à une meilleure gestion des unions polygames et à une stabilité accrue sur le plan économique.

Toutefois, l'impact de la polygamie du président Faye sur la société sénégalaise reste incertain. He Government is determined, by implementing the Five-Year Plan, to raise the standard of life of the Mauritian worker. It is determined, as it has said, "to control and accentuate the Mauritian Revolution"; and to get rid of those dark patches in the body politic, and their shadows on the country's economy, which it listed in the pamphlet 'Mauritius Faces the Future'.

The recently received annual report of the Income Tax Department for the year 1957-58 emphasizes the urgent necessity for an improvement in the standard of living for workers. The report demonstrates clearly the arbitrary and unjust distribution of wealth in Mauritius; the capitalist income structure stretches from well below the poverty line at the bottom to high and probably excessive rewards at the top. The report referred to shows that in 1957-58 there was one Mauritian paying tax on an income of over Rs 500,001; with 7 paying tax on an income of Rs 250,001 to 500,000; and 46 paying taxes on an income of Rs 100,001 to 250,000. But only 7,039 individuals are shown as paying any tax at all, which means that while 53 persons were waxing fat off their Rs 100,001 and more, thousands of workers were eking out a miserable existence on the meagre pittances doled grudgingly out by their employers.

Even with the 15% increase recommended by the Kirkaldy Tribunal, a Class I monthly employed field labourer (man) will not be getting more than Rs 90 per month as his basic wages; yet it is on the efforts of the field labourers that the prosperity of Mauritius ultimately depends. Rs 90 per month — less than Rs 1100 per year; far less than the minimum sum needed to keep body and soul together in decency and in a modicum of comfort. It is only three years since Father Dethise published his famous report on the expenditure of the workers of Port Louis. On food alone, he found that a married man with one child spent an average of Rs 93.39 a month; but the typical Mauritian worker has more than one child. Average monthly expenditure on food alone, Father Dethise found, was Rs 121.35 for a married man with 2, 3 or 4 children: and Rs 138.10 for a married man with 5 or more children. And remember, he arrived at his averages after careful examination of people's actual monthly budgets.

Here is one family's monthly food buying:

80 pounds of rice, 150 loaves, 12 bottles of milk, 1 pound of tea, 20 pounds of sugar, 2 tins of butter, 8 bottles of oil, 9 pounds of meat, 12 pounds of fish, and legumes, spices, fruits, and cakes totaling Rs 24.

That family is lucky in being able to afford some meat and fish; many families can't afford these essential items of diet and have to get along on rice and bread and vegetables — stodgy and lacking in dietetic balance. Small wonder that four-fifths of those seeking treatment from the health services are anaemic, especially when one remembers that milk, bread, and fish are of poor quality anyway.

The Income Tax report I have referred to shows that 7,039 people only were getting enough to be paying income

tax. But there are about 180,000 people in Mauritius who are in employment; so that at least 172,000 weren't earning enough to be paying tax. The average national income per head is about Rs 1,000; and each earner supports two dependents. That means that for a national average of Rs 1,000 per person, the national average income must be Rs 3,000 per earning inhabitant. But how many workers don't draw even Rs 3,000 a year? Tens of thousands.

Yet at the same time we have the spectacle of a handful of taxpayers with incomes over Rs 100,000 a year; one of them even disposes of over Rs 500,000 a year taxable income!


Truly the distribution of the national income is utterly unjust and arbitrary. Truly the Government has a big job on its hands in trying to raise the standard of life of the low-paid workers. But its determination to do so is unshaken; and will remain unshaken despite the defection of any of its one-time supporters. But there is a long way to go.

The Income Tax report also demonstrates the superiority of the sugar plantations belonging to the sugar companies. From 1953 to 1957 the yield of small plantations has decreased: the total area under sugar has remained fairly constant. From 1953-54 to 1957-58 the total gross incomes accruing to individuals owning sugar plantations increased from Rs 7,659,393 to Rs 8,225,230 — say, by 8 per cent. But the total gross income accruing to companies owning sugar plantations increased during the same period from Rs 56,837,581 to Rs 75,360,757 — say, an increase of 60 per cent. Clearly the yield of sugar from the small planters' and the peasants' land is below the optimum; the advances in sugar production techniques are benefiting the big fellow but not the small man.

Yet this may not be altogether a bad thing. If the small proprietor's land is not getting the optimum profit from being planted with sugar, he may well turn to some other crop: foodcrops, perhaps, if the Government were to introduce a programme of assistance to agriculture similar to that in the UK, for which Hon. Ramlallah (Labour Party, Poudre d'Or) has already asked in Council. If there were to be a gradual turnover of small proprietors' land from sugar to food production, then Mauritius would have to spend less on importing food from abroad, while the reduction in area under sugar would not necessarily reduce the total output of sugar, since the Sugar Industry Research Institute is always at work on possible techniques designed to raise production per arpent.

In the current issue of 'African and Colonial World' I have said that an annual sugar production of 750,000 tons (50 per cent above present levels) is well within the bounds of possibility inside five years assuming the acreage under sugar remains stationary. If production were to be stabilised at about 600,000 tons, then more land (given increased productivity per acre) would be released for food crops. "Whether it will be more economical to produce and export more and more sugar, or to restrict sugar production and import less food when more can be grown in Mauritius, re-

mains to be seen..." I added. I assume (rightly, I hope) that the economists of the sugar industry and the Government are carefully considering this problem.

When the Government is looking round for new sources of tax income, I hope too that they will give careful consideration to a form of death duties, which is another way of reducing the iniquitous unbalance of distribution of wealth.

Because it is no use just simply exhorting people to work harder. The carrot must be there too; in this case, the carrot of redistributed wealth, of fairer shares for all. The philosophy of the Labour Party is fairer shares for all; the way ahead is hard, but it will be trodden. At the forthcoming by-elections, the Party looks to the people to give once again an earnest of their faith in the Labour Party and the principles of social justice for which it stands, by voting for the Labour and Labour-supported candidates, who alone have faith in the people of Mauritius and in the possibility of a successful end to the Mauritius Revolution.

Deepfakes are still new, but 2024 could be the year they have an impact on elections

In the meantime, policymakers have rediscovered their duty to regulate technology in the public interest.

AI and synthetic media

Regulatory discussions have added urgency now that AI tools to create synthetic media – media partially or fully generated by computers – have gone mainstream. These deepfakes can be used to imitate the voice and appearance of real people. Deepfake media are impressively realistic and do not require much skill or resources.

This is the culmination of the wider digital revolution whereby successive technologies have made high-quality content production accessible to almost anyone. In contrast, regulatory structures and institutional standards for media were mostly designed in an era when only a minority of professionals had access to production.

Political deepfakes can take different forms. The recent Indonesian election saw a deepfake video “resurrecting” the late President Suharto. This was ostensibly to encourage people to vote, but it was accused of being propaganda because it produced by the political party that he led.

Perhaps a more obvious use of deepfakes is to spread lies about political candidates. For example, fake AI-generated audio released days before Slovakia's parliamentary election in September 2023 attempted to portray the leader of Progressive Slovakia, Michal Šimečka, as having discussed with a journalist how to rig the vote.

Aside from the obvious effort to undermine a political party, it is worth noting how this deepfake, whose origin was unclear, exemplifies wider efforts to scapegoat minorities and demonise mainstream journalism.

Fortunately, in this instance, the audio was not high-quality, which made it quicker



and easier for fact checkers to confirm its inauthenticity. However, the integrity of democratic elections cannot rely on the inexperience of the fakers.

Deepfake audio technology is at a level of sophistication that makes detection difficult. Deepfake videos still struggle with certain human features, such as the representation of hands, but the technology is still young.

It is also important to note the Slovakian video was released during the final days of the election campaign. This is a prime time to launch disinformation and manipulation attacks because the targets and independent journalists have their hands full and therefore have little time to respond.

If it is also expensive, time-consuming, and difficult to investigate deep fakes, then it's not clear how electoral commissions, political candidates, the media, or indeed the electorate should respond when potential cases arise. After all, a false accusation from a deepfake can be as troubling as the actual deepfake.

Another way deepfakes could be used to affect elections can be seen in the way they are already widely used to harass and abuse women and girls. This kind of sexual harassment fits an existing pattern of abuse that limits political participation by women.

Questioning electoral integrity

The difficulty is that it's not yet clear exactly what impact deepfakes could have on elections. It's very possible we could see other, similar uses of deepfakes in upcoming elections this year. And we could even see deepfakes used in ways not yet conceived of.

But it's also worth remembering that not all disinformation is high-tech. There are other ways to attack democracy. Rumours and conspiracy theories about the integrity of the electoral process are an insidious trend. Electoral fraud is a global concern given

that many countries are only democracies in name.

Clearly, social media platforms enable and drive disinformation in many ways, but it is a mistake to assume the problem begins

and ends online. One way to think about the challenge of disinformation during upcoming elections is to think about the strength of the systems that are supposed to uphold democracy.

Is there an independent media system capable of providing high quality investigations in the public interest? Are there independent electoral administrators and bodies? Are there independent courts to adjudicate if necessary?

And is there sufficient commitment to democratic values over self-interest amongst politicians and political parties? This year of elections, we may well find out the answer to these questions.

Adults should aim for 10,000 daily steps to offset sitting down

You've probably heard that adults should aim for 10,000 daily steps. This one-size-fits-all approach provides a clear message, though it doesn't consider how varied human lifestyles and bodies are.

An international team of researchers has found that even the most sedentary among us could ward off the harmful effects of sitting by incorporating more steps into our day.


Sedentary lifestyles are increasingly common, and we know they're linked to higher odds of dying from cardiovascular disease (CVD), greater risk of cancer and diabetes, and a shorter lifespan. And those risks are lower for people with higher step counts and faster-paced walkers.

But until now, it hasn't been clear whether highly sedentary people might be able to offset those alarming health risks with daily steps.

The more steps that people in the new study took, no matter how sedentary they were otherwise, the less risk they had of CVD and even early death. So those of us with desk jobs are not totally doomed, though the researchers emphasize that it's still important to try to reduce sedentary time overall.

"All movement matters, and that people can and should try to offset the health consequences of unavoidable sedentary time by upping their daily step count," says population health scientist Matthew Ahmadi from the University of Sydney in Australia.

Ahmadi and colleagues analyzed data from 72,174



volunteers contributing to the UK Biobank, a large long-term dataset established in 2006 that will continue to track participants' health measures over at least 30 years.

There was an average of 6.9 years' worth of general health data for each participant included in the study. Participants had worn wrist accelerometers for seven days to estimate their physical activity levels, such as the number of steps they usually took and the time they usually spent sitting.

The median time spent sedentary was 10.6 hours each day, so those who spent more time than that were deemed to have 'high sedentary time', while those with fewer hours were deemed to have 'low sedentary time'.

Participants whose stats in the first two years might have been affected by poor health weren't included in this study, so the findings apply only to people who, for at least the first two years' worth of data, were generally healthy.

The team found between 9,000 and 10,000 daily steps were optimal to counteract a highly sedentary lifestyle, lowering incident CVD risk by 21 percent and mortality risk by 39 percent.

Regardless of a participant's sedentary time, the researchers discovered that 50 percent of the benefits kicked in at around 4,000 to 4,500 daily steps.

"Any amount of daily steps above the referent 2,200 steps per day was associated with lower mortality and incident CVD risk, for low and high sedentary time," Ahmadi and colleagues conclude.

"Accruing between 9,000 and 10,000 steps a day optimally lowered the risk of mortality and incident CVD among highly sedentary participants."



What did people use before toothpaste was invented?

People once used tooth powders made from crushed bone or shells to whiten their teeth. Others rinsed their mouth out with pee. Yuck!

I'm a dentist, so I know a bit about how toothpaste works and what we used before it was invented.

How does toothpaste work?

Toothpaste makes your mouth smell fresh and feel clean. If you brush your teeth two times a day, toothpaste also helps protect your teeth from forming holes or cavities. Let's look at these benefits one at a time.

That fresh feeling

Some toothpaste ingredients mix with your spit (or saliva) to make a soapy sudsy foam. The sudsy foam turns into slimy slop that you spit out.


Many toothpastes also have a slight sandy feeling to scrub stains off your teeth. This also helps remove the sticky, soft, white globs that grow on your teeth called plaque (pronounced plark).

Plaque is made from sticky bits of food and bacteria (tiny bugs). The bacteria in your plaque live, grow and multiply in your mouth. Some bacteria – such as Streptococcus mutans (pronounced strep-toe-cock-us mew-tans) – love to digest the sugary food you eat. Other bacteria in your plaque burp rotten-egg gases that make your breath smell.

No wonder we want to get rid of plaque with gassy bacteria.

Prevents cavities

Even worse, plaque bacteria poo out

diarrhoea (pronounced die-ree-a). That diarrhoea is "acidic", meaning it can dissolve your teeth to form holes. So we brush our teeth twice a day to get rid of as much bacteria and their diarrhoea as we can.

There are lots of special ingredients in toothpastes to prevent holes from forming that include:

- xylitol (pronounced zy-lee-toll). When bacteria in your plaque eat this, they get constipated and poo less acid
- fluoride (pronounced floor-ride).

Your teeth have tiny gaps on the surface that are so small you can only see them with a microscope. Fluoride fills these gaps to make your teeth strong. This is how fluoride protects against nasty bacteria poo from dissolving your teeth.

What did people use in the olden days?

People who lived a long time ago didn't know much about Streptococcus mutans and bacteria poo. They thought getting holes in teeth was part of growing

up. They were wrong. But they tried to make their teeth look whiter by using tooth powders.

People in ancient Egypt, China and India used their fingers to rub tooth powders on their teeth.

The first tooth powders were made of crushed animal bones, ox hooves, and egg, snail and oyster shells. Later, people added crushed charcoal (the black stuff you get when you burn bones or wood), powdered tree bark and flavouring herbs.

The ancient Romans cleaned their teeth with toothpaste made with pee.

Thank goodness things have changed.

Thank your lucky stars

The next time you brush your teeth, think of all those people in the olden days. They made tooth powders with bones and shells, and toothpaste with pee.

Luckily, we now have toothpastes that leave a better taste in your mouth and stop holes forming in your teeth.

But when you brush your teeth, remember to spit out the toothpaste. Don't rinse it away with water. We want to keep a bit in your mouth to protect your teeth from that nasty bacteria poo.

Mauritian Multilingualism: Embracing Diversity, Enhancing Unity



For any change in the choice of languages to be officially accepted in Parliament, which is a representative body of the people of Mauritius, it should be brought up for public debate, and not monopolized by leaders of political parties, as was the case with the aborted plan for a Second Republic. The topic calls for a dispassionate and rational debate. For the sake

China imposed Mandarin without much ado on regional languages in a bid to simplify and unify communication among its people.

Do we derive our concept of a national language from European linguistic experts, who base their definition on a homogeneous race and culture, collective memory of their history, and a clear definition of what defines their civilization? To what extent can we speak of a nation in Mauritius? It is still in the pro-

guage? While Kreol is widely spoken and understood, its status as a fully developed language remains in progress. Classified as a dialect for decades, it has supplanted Bhojpuri, which once held widespread usage, due to the advocacy of ideologues and the waning interest within Bhojpuri-speaking communities. Nonetheless, Bhojpuri is recognized as a fully fledged language with a rich literary tradition in Eastern India, a heritage that has endured in Mauritius.

A national language reflects a shared history and culture. However, in a multi-ethnic society with a colonial legacy, history does not begin with the year of independence in 1968. Many individuals do not regard the 1840s as a pivotal moment in their intellectual and mental landscape.

In the 1990s, the proposal to mandate Oriental languages in schools sparked controversy in Mauritius. However, over time, acceptance of this idea has grown organically, without being enforced.

A utilitarian and materialistic approach falls short when it comes to languages. Merely having a common language does not automatically equate to a national language, nor does it serve as a unifying factor. Otherwise, civil rights would have been granted to Blacks in America in 1865, following the abolition of slavery, rather than waiting until the Civil Rights movement of the 1960s.

In multi-ethnic, post-colonial societies, there are languages we use and languages that resonate with us on a deeper level. English served as the sole official language in Parliament until French was introduced upon the request of some MPs who faced challenges with English, despite significant investments in English language education over decades. Additionally, Kreol often sneaks into parliamentary discourse, typically utilized by members to take jabs at opponents, shout, and insult without restraint.

If MPs and ministers continue to struggle with these two languages, it is indicative of deeper issues regarding their intellectual capabilities, rather than a mere linguistic preference. Thus, rather than fixating on the language of choice, which risks being weaponized and politicized, attention should be directed towards addressing the intellectual standards of elected officials, especially during electoral campaigns.

of clarity, terms need to be properly defined. What do we mean by 'our national language'? Nation-building is a long-term process aimed at materializing the ideal of a 'nation'. If the concept of nation is being viewed through the lens of Western history, we better step back and ask ourselves the right questions.

For example, it took centuries and much infighting among several provinces before some form of political unity took shape to unite people of largely the same racial and religious identity in France, Germany, Italy, and the United Kingdom. After achieving political unity, which gradually made the idea of being part of one nation acceptable, it took more than a century to implement the one-language policy for official use in Parliament and the educational system.

It was far from being a smooth ride for regional languages like Occitan and Breton in France, Welsh and Scottish in the UK, or Catalan in Spain to accept a backstage secondary status and allow one language to emerge above others. Bitter memories of past coercion on the people still prevail. In the 1960s, South Indians took to the streets to protest against any attempt to popularize Hindi and still bristle at the idea of Hindi gaining ground over decades. Communist

cess of being built; it is not yet a reality.


If we insist on putting the cart before the horse, we may find ourselves adopting the definitions of leftist ideologues and intellectuals in Mauritius regarding the status of Kreol. The latter are esteemed in opinionated circles in Creole-speaking French departments like Réunion and West Indian islands. Never mind that in these French departments, Creole is the only remnant of their island culture, as the French assimilation policy eradicated all other existing languages. Hence, there is a fervent effort to elevate its status and display it prominently on posters, road signs, and elsewhere. For everything else, they must accept the reality of owing the islands' high standard of living and infrastructure to French taxpayers' money.

Undeniably, there is an ethnic dimension to the language issue. It has become a matter of bestowing dignity upon the proletariat and recognizing their contribution to the initial economic development of the islands.

The endeavour to elevate the status of Kreol initially bore the stamp of a Marxist ideology within far-left circles in Mauritius. However, the question arises: does the existence of a Mauritian nation validate the notion of a national lan-
